Santana High School Alumni, students, teachers, coaches, friends and family of the late Leon Bender have requested a proclamation designating May 30 as Leon Bender day. On this day, it is hoped that citizens will remember Leon Bender by performing a "random act of kindness" in his honor.

Leon Bender was a graduate of Santana High school in 1993. During his time at Santana, Leon was involved in football, basketball, track and field, drama and ASB. Leon had a dream to play in the NFL one day and he did everything he could to pursue that dream. After high school, Leon earned a football scholarship to attend Washington State University. Because of his successful career at Washington State, Leon was ultimately drafted by the Oakland Raiders in the 2nd round. He was the 31st player picked. Unfortunately, Leon never got to completely fulfill his dream. Three weeks after he was drafted, Leon suffered an epileptic seizure that sadly ended his life at the young age of 22.

This May 30 will mark the 15th anniversary of the day Leon Bender passed away. Friends and family were looking for a way to show respect to one of the few members of our community who went on to make it to the NFL. 

SUMMARY

This item authorizes using an open market purchase process to select Mueller's Truck & Equipment as the vendor for large vehicle repairs when needed for the remainder of FY 12/13 and FY 13/14. Pursuant to Ordinance Section 3.24.120 (B-4), the purchasing agent may make an "open market" purchase, dispensing with the requirements of bidding "when the City Council determines that due to special circumstances it is in the City's best interest to purchase a commodity or enter into a contract without compliance with the bidding procedure."

The City's emergency fire apparatus, as well as CSA-69 ambulances, are specialized pieces of equipment that can require specialized knowledge or equipment to repair and/or maintain. Additionally, due to the high mileage and age of the fire fleet, multiple apparatus can require attention simultaneously. Examples are issues involving hydraulic leaks, coolant problems, electronic sensor replacement, and diagnosing and repairing other complicated systems. Mueller's Truck & Equipment Service, conveniently located in Santee, has specialized knowledge and provides timely service that allows quick drop off and delivery of apparatus to the facility and back to the station. Many times Mueller's will pick up and drop off directly to the station shop. Anticipated maintenance and costs for necessary repairs for the remainder of FY 12/13 are estimated to be \$2,000 and for FY 13/14 \$13,000.

The League's 2013 Annual Conference is scheduled for September 18 - 20 in Sacramento. An important part of the Annual Conference is the Annual Business Meeting (at the General Assembly), scheduled for noon on Friday, September 20, at the Sacramento Convention Center. At this meeting, the League membership considers and takes action on resolutions that establish League policy.

In order to vote at the Annual Business Meeting, your city council must designate a voting delegate. Your city may also appoint up to two alternate voting delegates, one of whom may vote in the event that the designated voting delegate is unable to serve in that capacity.

Please complete the attached Voting Delegate form and return it to the League's office no later than Friday, August 23, 2013. This will allow us time to establish voting delegate/alternates' records prior to the conference.

Please note the following procedures that are intended to ensure the integrity of the voting process at the Annual Business Meeting.

- Action by Council Required. Consistent with League bylaws, a city's voting delegate and up to two alternates must be designated by the city council. When completing the attached Voting Delegate form, please attach either a copy of the council resolution that reflects the council action taken, or have your city clerk or mayor sign the form affirming that the names provided are those selected by the city council. Please note that designating the voting delegate and alternates must be done by city council action and cannot be accomplished by individual action of the mayor or city manager alone.
- Conference Registration Required. The voting delegate and alternates must be registered to attend the conference. They need not register for the entire conference; they may register for Friday only. To register for the conference, please go to our website: www.cacities.org. In order to cast a vote, at least one person must be present at the

- Business Meeting and in possession of the voting delegate card. Voting delegates and alternates need to pick up their conference badges before signing in and picking up the voting delegate card at the Voting Delegate Desk. This will enable them to receive the special sticker on their name badges that will admit them into the voting area during the Business Meeting.
- Transferring Voting Card to Non-Designated Individuals Not Allowed. The voting delegate card may be transferred freely between the voting delegate and alternates, but only between the voting delegate and alternates. If the voting delegate and alternates find themselves unable to attend the Business Meeting, they may not transfer the voting card to another city official.
- Seating Protocol during General Assembly. At the Business Meeting, individuals with the voting card will sit in a separate area. Admission to this area will be limited to those individuals with a special sticker on their name badge identifying them as a voting delegate or alternate. If the voting delegate and alternates wish to sit together, they must sign in at the Voting Delegate Desk and obtain the special sticker on their badges.

The Voting Delegate Desk, located in the conference registration area of the Sacramento Convention Center, will be open at the following times: Wednesday, September 18, 9:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m.; Thursday, September 19, 7:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.; and September 20, 7:30–10:00 a.m. The Voting Delegate Desk will also be open at the Business Meeting on Friday, but not during a roll call vote, should one be undertaken.

The voting procedures that will be used at the conference are attached to this memo. Please share these procedures and this memo with your council and especially with the individuals that your council designates as your city's voting delegate and alternates.



SUMMARY

The Proposed Five-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget for Fiscal Years 2013-14 through 2017-18 is presented to the City Council for review and discussion. The CIP Budget will be brought back to the City Council for adoption in June.

The purpose of the CIP is to provide a multi-year planning tool for the infrastructure and other capital needs of the community, and to coordinate the scheduling and financing of projects. SUMMARY

In February 2013 the City Council was provided with an update on the current fiscal year budget, and budget amendments were adopted to reflect revised revenue projections as well as to reflect the organizational restructuring done in response to the dissolution of the Santee Community Development Commission. On February 27, 2013 a Fire Department staffing review and operations plan was presented to the City Council, and on March 13, 2013 a Sheriff's staffing report was presented. On April 10, 2013 a review of organizational adjustments made over the past several years, as well as key factors impacting the upcoming two-year budget were presented.

This evening an overview of the Proposed Operating Budget for Fiscal Years 2013-14 and 2014-15 will be provided, and the following department budgets will also be reviewed: City Council/City Manager/Animal Control, City Attorney, Human Resources/Risk Management, City Clerk, Finance and Community Services. On June 12, 2013 the following department budgets will be reviewed: Development Services, Law Enforcement and Fire, as will the various Special Funds budgets. The proposed budget will then be brought back to the City Council for adoption on June 26, 2013.

The budget document will be distributed separately in advance of the May 22, 2013 City Council meeting.
