SUMMARY

On June 24, 2015 City Council approved the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2015-16 through 2019-20 and adopted the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget for Fiscal Years 2015-16 and 2016-17. At that time Council also directed staff to return with a proposed strategy to redirect \$200,000 in General Fund CIP funding in order to make a supplemental payment towards the City's CalPERS unfunded liability.

The adopted CIP budget allocates \$1.9 million in General Fund monies over the next two fiscal years. Staff proposes a \$105,000 reduction in the Sage Program funding, which would eliminate one Sage project and reduce funding to six other Sage projects. Also proposed are reductions in the amount of \$40,000 to the IT Network Hardware/Software Replacement project, \$25,000 to the IT Master Plan Implementation project and \$30,000 in reductions spread over four additional projects.

A list of the CIP projects funded with General Fund monies, including the proposed funding reductions and the impact of the reductions, is presented in the attached Staff Report.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Fiscal Years 2015-16 and 2016-17 Capital Improvement Program Budget will be reduced by \$200,000. The proposed budgetary amendments will have no current net impact on the General Fund, as monies will be redirected to make a supplemental payment towards the City's CalPERS unfunded liability. However, by making this supplemental payment it is estimated that future CalPERS unfunded liability payment savings of \$508,000 will be realized over the next 30 years.

SUMMARY: This is an informational item on the City's plans and associated implementation requirements that have been developed as a result of federal and state regulations aimed at improving water quality. The City regulates storm water discharges through a combination of ordinances, policy documents, and plans. Implementation will affect residents, business owners, and the scope of design criteria associated with land development applications.

For example, to prevent non-rain water from entering the storm drain conveyance system, outdoor water use, such as hard surface washing, vehicle washing, pool cleaning, will be restricted. Irrigation runoff will also be prohibited. Another change is related to existing industrial properties that were not previously designated as industrial uses. In order for industrial property/business owners to comply with water quality regulations, they will have to implement a variety of controls, which may include things such as structural improvements. For example, in Santee there are a number of older industrial businesses with unregulated outdoor storage. Storage and work areas which cannot feasibly be contained within buildings must be conducted within covered and contained areas to prevent water contact with these storage and work areas. Lastly, new development will be required to maximize natural infiltration, and decrease or maintain current levels of runoff volume. The requirement to retain 85% of the average rain event means that projects must increase the sizing of all treatment control best management practices. With the increased sizing requirements projects may be left with less developable space.

ENVIRONMENTAL STATUS: These plans are exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") because they represent actions by a regulatory agency as authorized by state law, local ordinance or resolution, for the protection of natural resources under State CEQA Guidelines section 15307 and the environment under State CEQA Guidelines section 15308.

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FINANCIAL STATEMENT: There is no fiscal impact as a result of this item. Program implementation, compliance, and enforcement under the new municipal permit will increase costs. These program costs are reflected in the adopted Storm Water Program budget. The majority of the program is funded through the Flood Control Fund, General Fund and Gas Tax These costs are only partially offset by cost recovery through storm water inspection fees and enforcement actions.

INFORMATIONAL REPORT ON THE CITY'S WATER QUALITY PLANS PURSUANT TO STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS

CITY COUNCIL MEETING: July 22, 2015

A. Background

The 2013 Municipal Storm Water Permit ("Permit"), as amended in 2015, promulgated significant changes to the City's Storm Water Ordinance and the subsequent development and revisions to related plans. The overarching common goal of the Permit and associated plans is to protect water quality and beneficial uses within the San Diego River Watershed.

This item will be focused towards the City of Santee's Jurisdictional Runoff Management Plan (JRMP). This plan is the City's 'how to manual' for complying, implementing, and achieving water quality goals. The JRMP includes the City's Enforcement Response Plan and Guidelines for Surface Water Pollution Prevention.

The San Diego River Water Quality Improvement Plan (WQIP), which also includes the jurisdictions of El Cajon, La Mesa, the City of San Diego, and the County of San Diego, establishes the water quality goals and objectives specific to the conditions identified for the San Diego River. The WQIP lays the foundation for all other planning documents which the City implements. A brief overview of these plans is provided in Section B.

B. Water Quality Plans

Water Quality Improvement Plan (WQIP). This document is the foundation for all of the City's water quality planning documents. The WQIP has identified bacteria as the highest priority pollutant for the San Diego River Watershed. Historic water quality samples taken throughout the watershed indicate that there are high levels of bacteria, with a prevalence of fecal indicator bacteria. In Santee, one of our biggest challenges will be to address sanitary waste resulting from transient camps in and near the San Diego River. The WQIP establishes goals and strategies which must be implemented in order to achieve the water quality objectives. The progress made toward achieving these goals will be assessed and reported annually to the Regional Water Quality Control Board. The established timeline for meeting water quality goals is 2021, with interim targets over the life of the plan.

Jurisdictional Runoff Management Plan (JRMP). This comprehensive plan, which is specific to only the City of Santee, describes the suite of programs that the City will implement to help protect and improve the water quality and beneficial uses of the San Diego River, and ultimately our County's coastlines. The significant changes in this plan, as compared to previous years, include: newly prohibited discharges (pool water, wash water, irrigation water, etc.), increased monitoring, revised inspection process, the

creation of an Enforcement Response Plan and revisions to the minimum best management practices and standards.

- 1. Enforcement Response Plan (ERP). This document outlines the progressive steps that the City will utilize to achieve compliance with water quality regulations and the Storm Water Ordinance. Specific triggers for escalating enforcement actions are defined. The benefit of establishing an ERP is that the process and procedures are clearly outlined for all regulated parties, and allows for consistent application of enforcement actions.
- 2. Guidelines for Surface Water Pollution Prevention ("Guidelines"). These Guidelines support the water quality goals that the City is required to achieve. These Guidelines set minimum standards and Best Management Practices for all persons living and working within the City of Santee. They outline activities which may trigger the need to obtain permits, such as building an overhead canopy to cover outdoor storage areas. These minimum practices have been established based on industry standards and guidance from the California Storm Water Quality Association in order to attain water quality goals, and maintain compliance with the Permit.
- C. Next Steps. The Best Management Practices (BMP) Design Manual, which is a regional plan applicable to all jurisdictions within San Diego County, is pending finalization by the Regional Water Quality Control Board and will go in to effect by the end of 2015. Because the objective of this plan is to eliminate, reduce, or mitigate the impacts of runoff from development projects, the BMP Design Manual will offer more clarity and guidance on the water quality protection controls that must be implemented on each new development project and redevelopment projects of 5,000 square feet or more. A follow-up informational report to the City Council on the design manual will be scheduled in January-February 2016.

The City is implementing an outreach and education plan which conveys the importance of protecting water quality. The outreach and education plan includes guidance for business, developers, and residences alike and outline the minimum best management practices to prevent water pollution. Staff is in the process of revising print material and the City's Storm Water web page is being updated; it has a new domain of: www.santeeh2o.org. In addition an informational mail-out to all postal customers will be completed within the next several weeks.

SUMMARY This item requests City Council authorization to purchase two irrigation pump stations that would provide recycled water to the landscape parkways and medians on Cuyamaca Street and along a portion of the north side of Woodglen Vista Drive (refer to the attached Location Map). As part of the City's effort to reduce potable water consumption by 20% compared to 2013 use in accordance with emergency drought regulations adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board, this area has been identified as a high priority project, since it represents 32% of the entire potable water consumption for City facilities. These existing landscape areas were designed and connected to the Padre Dam Municipal Water District's recycled water system when Silver Country Estates was developed in the mid-1990's. Because the water pressure has been too low to adequately provide recycled water to these up-sloped landscaped areas, the system has been augmented with potable water. The conversion to a complete recycled water system requires the installation of the two pump stations. They would be installed in the proximity of the Woodglen Vista Drive and Cuyamaca Street intersection, as depicted on the Location Map. The proposed pump stations are self-enclosed units with interior sound attenuation; they are 4 feet in width, 8 feet in length, and 4 feet in height. Each would be placed on a level pad, with a rear decorative split face block wall.

In compliance with the City's purchasing ordinance, Santee Municipal Code 3.24.110, the Department of Development Services administered a formal bid process for the procurement of landscape irrigation pump stations. On July 17, 2015, four (4) bids were received and opened, with a low bid of \$39,708.40 submitted by Hydro-Scape. Upon review by staff, the bid submitted by Hydro-Scape did not meet the minimum technical requirements. Therefore staff recommends deeming the bid submitted by Hydro-Scape as a non-responsive bid. The second low bid of \$42,627.60 submitted by John Deere Landscapes meets all requirements, and based on the requirements for the lowest responsive and responsible bid, staff recommends awarding the bid to John Deere Landscapes for total amount of \$42,627.60

Staff also requests City Council authorization for the City Manager to execute the necessary documents, and authorization for the Director of Development Services to approve change orders in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the bid amount for unforeseen incidentals. Incidental installation costs are anticipated in the amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for pump station electrical wiring, concrete foundations and miscellaneous irrigation plumbing work. The total anticipated project cost is \$56,890.36.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT—An appropriation of Gas Tax Funds in the amount of \$56,890.36 is required. This appropriation is funded by FY 2014-15 Gas Tax Fund revenues and budget savings.
