What is the schedule for the Santee Summer Concert Series?

- 6:20 PM - Opening Ceremony
- 6:30 PM - Concert Begins
- 8:00 PM - Concert Ends
- 8:15 PM - Park closes

How much does it cost to participate?

The Santee Summer Concert Series is free. However, we will have food trucks on-site for an easy and convenient dinner as well as on-site concessions at Riverwalk Grill.

Where will the band be playing? Can I bring chairs or a blanket?

The band will be playing on the main stage adjacent to the parking lot. The venue is set up for lawn and picnic-style seating. Remember to bring your chairs and blankets. Canopies and umbrellas are allowed behind the canopy line. When the concert begins, we ask that large umbrellas in front of the canopy line be taken down to prevent viewing obstructions.



Are there other activities to take part in?

There is a playground on site located on the north/west side of the park and plenty of room to bring soccer balls, footballs, etc. to play in the park. Each week there will also be various outreach booths and activities on-site.

Are food & drink available on-site?

Yes, there will be Food Trucks each night as well as on-site concessions at Riverwalk Grill. Please click on the icon for the concert night you are interested and the food vendor information will be available for that concert night. Participants are allowed to bring their own food and drinks (BBQ's are prohibited; beer and wine are allowed, no glass containers).

Is this a rain or shine event?

Yes, the event will be held rain or shine. The City of Santee may cancel the event due to dangerous weather conditions

What should I wear/bring?

It will be warm/hot when the concert begins but the temperature cools down in the evening, a light jacket is recommended. Surrounding areas are sprayed for mosquitos. We suggest bringing bug repellent, sunscreen and water. Candles are prohibited including bug citronella candles.

Can I bring my dog?

Yes, dogs are welcome at the event as long as they are well behaved, on a leash no longer than six feet and you have doggie pick-up bags on hand. There is a doggie bag station behind the stage right next to the kiosk and another to the left of the sundial.

Where are the restrooms located?

Restrooms are located at the North/West side of the park in the permanent building by Riverwalk Grill. Porta Potties are also be available near the South park entrance.

Parking/drop-off zone:

Arrive early, as parking fills up quickly. We suggest you walk or ride your bike. On-site parking is available at the Town Center Community Park East and West parking lots adjacent to the park, and additional parking available at the City of Santee Aquatics Center/Cameron Family YMCA (use the foot bridge at the south/east side of the parking lot to get to the event). Handicap parking is available on site, but is limited. Loading/unloading zone and ride-share dropoff is located in the Town Center Community Park East parking lot.

Event reminders:

- The west Pedestrian Bridge will become exit only after 6:30 PM.
- Town Center Community Park East will close immediately after the conclusion of the Concert.
- City of Santee special events are for the enjoyment of all attendees. The city reserves the right to take all steps necessary to ensure the safety, security and reduce risk to the public.
