Getting to Brews & Bites:

From the 52 East

- Exit at Cuyamaca Street
- Turn left onto Cuyamaca Street
- Turn right onto Riverwalk Drive
- Turn right onto Park Center Drive and follow it until it dead ends into the festival parking lot

From the 125 North

- Exit at Mission Gorge Road
- Turn right onto Mission Gorge Road
- Turn left onto Cuyamaca Street
- Turn right onto Riverwalk Drive
- Turn right onto Park Center Drive and follow it until it dead ends into the festival parking lot

From the 8 East

- Exit the 8 onto 67 North
- Exit 67 onto 52 West
- Exit 52 at Cuyamaca Street
- Turn left onto Cuyamaca Street
- Turn right onto Riverwalk Drive
- Turn right onto Park Center Drive and follow it until it dead ends into the festival parking lot

From the 67 South

- Exit 67 onto Woodside Avenue
- Follow Woodside Avenue until it turns into Mission Gorge Road
- Turn right onto Magnolia Avenue
- Turn left onto Cuyamaca Street
- Turn left onto Mast Boulevard
- Turn left onto Park Center Drive and follow it until it dead ends into the festival parking lot

Parking:

There is limited on-site parking. Additional parking can be found at the Cameron YMCA and the surrounding neighborhood. We strongly encourage guests to use ridesharing services or carpool. Do not drink and drive.

Guest Drop Off & Pick Up:

Drop Off

We encourage guests to be dropped off in the Cameron YMCA parking lot next to the foot bridge.

<u>Pick Up</u>

At the end of the night, guest pick up will be at the end of Park Center Drive in the cul-de-sac.

How much are fundraiser tickets?*

- \$55 per ticket
- \$40 Designated Driver Ticket (limited number available)
 - Participants that purchase the Designated Driver ticket will not be allowed to sample any alcoholic beverages and will receive a souvenir tumbler instead of a sampling cup. They may still sample all of the food and there will be non-alcoholic beverages available.
- \$175 Reserved Table one (1) table with eight (8) chairs
 - We have a total of 30 tables
 - Reserved tables DO NOT include the ticket prices. Tickets must be purchased in addition to the reserved table.
- \$315 Six-Pack of Tickets
 - \$52.50 per ticket and can be shared with of-age friends and family.
- \$50 Military & Senior (55+) Tickets *All purchases subject to processing fees

Are food and beverages included in the ticket price?

Yes. Guests pay one price for admission and enjoy free samples from several restaurants, breweries and wineries while supplies last. Complimentary soft drinks and water are also provided. Each participant will receive a souvenir sampling cup.

Festival Beneficiary:

People, Parks & Programs. Funds raised will benefit the Santee Teen Center, park improvement projects and the Recreation Scholarship Program which provides financial assistance to qualifying Santee children, teens and seniors who take part in City recreation programs.

Festival Entertainment:

Fast Times, an 80's concert experience, will be bringing the energy to this year's Santee Brews and Bites Festival Fundraiser.

Are children allowed?

No, this festival is for adults 21 years old and up.

Event Reminders:

- City of Santee special events are for the enjoyment of all attendees. The city reserves the right to take all steps necessary to ensure the safety, security and reduce risk to the public.
- Participants must show ID before entering the event.



Do I have to be a Santee resident to attend?

No, you don't need to be a resident to purchase a ticket. There are no resident discounts on tickets.

How do I participate in the Opportunity Drawings?

Festival volunteers will roam the festival site selling opportunity drawing tickets. \$20 will get you a sheet of 26 tickets. \$40 will get you two sheets of tickets plus one free sheet (78 tickets total). Additional fundraising opportunities may be available.

How do I participate in the Silent Auction?

A few hand-selected items have been pulled for the Silent Auction. The bidding will be open all night. Help us support people, parks & programs. Auction winners do not need to be present to win, but if you are, please pay before leaving the event.

What if I get tired? Are there places to sit down?

Seating is not provided. You are welcome to bring lawn chairs and set them up in any open grass area of the event.

I use a wheelchair/walker/cane; will I be able to enjoy the festival?

Yes. The festival takes place on an area that is level, however, it is on grass so be prepared. If you need further assistance please contact (619) 258-4100 x222 to arrange accommodation.

What should I wear?

A light jacket and comfortable shoes are recommended. Heels are not recommended as the festival takes place on grass and the food, beverages and entertainment are spread throughout the park.

Is smoking allowed?

This is a non-smoking festival. Smoking is not allowed in any City park.

What can I bring?

May I bring my dog?

Only service animals are allowed. Please leave all other pets at home.

Are there restrooms?

Restrooms are located at the North/West side of the park in the permanent building by Riverwalk Grill. Porta Potties are also available.

What if it rains?

This is a rain or shine event. If you decide not to attend, please consider your ticket purchase a donation.

Refunds:

No refunds will be issued. If you have purchased a ticket and are now unable to attend, you are welcome to give your ticket to friends or family who are 21 and up. Each ticket has a unique QR code. Please ensure the new ticketholder has the correct QR code to gain entry to the event. If you are unable to find a new user for your ticket, please consider your purchase a donation. 
