Regulations Governing Movement of Construction Equipment and Materials

General Requirements

1. All moves shall be made from sunrise to sunset unless otherwise noted on the face of the permit.
2. No moves shall be made on Saturday, Sunday, Holidays, or at night unless authorized on the face of the permit.
3. No moves shall be made between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. or between 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. over congested roads.
4. Each applicant for a permit shall provide proof of INSURANCE IN FORCE in accordance with Section 11.34.255 of the City Code.
5. All provisions of the Vehicle Code and City Ordinance shall be complied with at all times.

Single Trip Permits

1. An application must contain:
 - a. Name and address of mover.
 - b. Object(s) to be transported.
 - c. Dimensions, height, width, length.
 - d. Object weight.
 - e. Gross weight.
 - f. Composition of hauling equipment.
 - g. Maximum axle loads (not to exceed "PURPLE" weight as specified by California Department of Transportation).
 - h. Origin, route, destination.

- i. Hauling equipment identification.
Make, model, license number.
 - j. Permit fee is \$19.00 (FY21-22)
 - k. Permit issued for one-week period.
2. Restrictions
- a. Loads exceeding 12'-6" in width require a pilot car; loads in excess of 14'-0" in width require a pilot car before and after. Loads over 90'-0" long require 2 pilot cars.
 - b. Loads exceeding 15'-0" in width or 15'-0" in height require route evaluation. These applications must be submitted to the Department of Development Services at least 8 days prior to the intended move.
 - c. The Department of Development Services may impose such other restrictions deemed necessary by the specific conditions of the move applied for.
 - d. Night and Saturday moves will be considered upon request in accordance with the Department of Development Services Regulations covering night and Saturday moves.

Blanket (Annual) Permit:

- 1. Annual permits will be issued for moving construction equipment under the following conditions:
 - a. Permit to be issued to a specific truck and trailer combinations, truck cranes, etc. to be identified by year, make, license number, I. D. number, number of axles, number of tires, width of trailer.
 - b. For construction equipment moved with a truck-trailer combination.
 - (1) Vehicle and load shall not exceed 13'-6" in width 15'-0" in height and 90'-0" overall length.
 - (2) Loads with overhang require a pilot vehicle (see diagrams).
 - c. For truck cranes.

Vehicle shall exceed 11'-0" plus 2" on each side for tire bulge, clearance lights and safety devices required by California Vehicle Code (mirrors may extend on either side as necessary to conform with Section 26709

of the Vehicle Code); height must be legal; length shall not exceed 75'-0" overall not including boom or 80'-0" overall including boom, subject to the restrictions as specified by the California State Department of Transportation. Application for moving a truck crane must be accompanied by a copy of valid State Transportation Permit and/or a copy of weight and inspection report not more than one year old.

- d. Proof of Insurance meeting the criteria set for in Section 11.34.255 of the City code.
- e. Applicant must be a licensed dealer, transporter, or contractor.
- f. Applicant must be an owner of the vehicle of the authorized representative.
- g. Permits for "GREEN" loads will be limited to those City roads not posted for a lesser load limit. Permits for "PURPLE" loads will be limited to a specific list of County roads. ("GREEN" and "PURPLE" weights are specified by California State Department of Transportation.)
- h. Permits for oversize loads shall be deemed to cover only those roads over which a load of that size can be moved safely.
- i. Movements of loads in excess of 12'-6" will REQUIRE a pilot car. Those loads in excess of 14'-0" will require a pilot car fore and aft.
- j. Night and Saturday moves will be made in accordance with Department of Development Services regulations covering night and Saturday moves.
- k. Permit fee is \$109.00 for period not to exceed one year.
 - (1) If permit is issued for less than one year because of insurance, it can be extended to one year upon proof of insurance.
 - (2) If the tractor identified on a blanket permit is sold, the permit may be assigned to a new tractor for the remainder of the permit life.

Repetitive Haul Permits:

- 1. Repetitive haul permit may be issued where multiple units of similar cargo is hauled over the same route. An application can contain:
 - a. All information required for a single move permit will be required on repetitive permits.

- b. Individual tractor and trailers need not be identified if the cargo is unique.
- c. Permit fee is the same as a blanket permit, \$109.00 (FY21-22).
- d. Permits shall be issued for a period sufficient to cover hauling operation but must not be longer than one year.
- e. Applicant must be a licensed dealer, transporter, or contractor.
- f. Applicant must be the owner of the vehicle or the authorized representative.

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Regulations Governing the Movement of Extra-Legal Loads and Escort Vehicles

General Requirements

1. ACCEPTANCE OF PERMIT. The moving of any load or the doing of any work on the highway in accordance with this permit shall be regarded as an acceptance by the Permittee of all terms and conditions of the permit. This permit is effective only between the hours stated on the face of the permit or as may be specified in additional regulations.

This permit is to be strictly construed and any move other than specifically mentioned on the face of this permit will render this permit null and void.

The use of this permit is prima facie evidence that the driver has checked the load and/or vehicle and know it to be within the limits as set forth hereon and has verified the routing accuracy.

This permit is not valid unless signed by an authorized representative of the Department of Development Services.

This permit is automatically canceled if the move is made by crews or equipment of any organization or individual other than the one named on the face of the permit, or if any alteration or attempted alteration is made upon any portion, section or part of this permit (see Vehicle Code Sec. 27900), or if a reproduced copy of the permit is used.

Work authorized under this permit is subject to inspection by representatives of the Department of Development Services and costs of such inspection shall be borne by the Permittee.

2. COMPLY WITH APPLICABLE LAWS. This permit is issued pursuant to Section 35780 of the Vehicle Code. Except as specifically provided herein, the requirements of the Vehicle Code and any vehicle registration requirements and other applicable laws must be complied with in all particulars.
3. PERMIT SUBJECT TO INSPECTION. This permit must be carried-on the equipment or load at all times while it is being moved within the highway limits. It shall be submitted for inspection on demand of an authorized employee of the Department of Development Services or of any law enforcement officer.

4. FACSIMILE PERMIT. Each Facsimile Permit shall have an authorized signature of a Department of Development Services employee certifying it to be a true copy. A reproduced or altered facsimile permit will not be allowed and shall be automatically canceled.
5. REDUCIBLE LOADS. This permit is issued on the premise that the load described hereon has been loaded in a manner consistent with the California Department of Development Services reducible load policy. This policy does not authorize over legal dimension(s) by loading side by side, by stacking nor by loading end to end. Over legal weight is not authorized if two or more non-related items are transported as a single load. This permit is automatically canceled if any permitted dimension or weight can be reduced to legal limit by repositioning and/or practical removal of a part, portion, or unit therefrom. Trusses as defined by Section 657 of the Vehicle Code are exempt from the repositioning requirement as intended by Section 35708.5 of the Vehicle Code. Items not listed on the permit may be hauled provided they do not increase the dimensions of the vehicle or permitted item and the loaded vehicle is of legal axle and gross weights. All tampers, rollers, and other compaction equipment ballasted with water, earth or metal must have such ballast removed unless all axle and gross weights do not exceed Vehicle Code legal maximums. Integral components of construction equipment and implements of Husbandry need not be removed providing the overall width does not exceed 14'-0", except the draft arms of a scraper and dozer blades cannot exceed 14'-6".

Limit of Authorization

6. CITY HIGHWAYS. This permit only covers portion of move on City highways under jurisdiction of the Department of Development Services. This permit neither implies nor grants otherwise. City and State permits must be secured for travel on roads and streets under their respective jurisdiction.
7. TRIP LIMIT. Unless specifically stated on the face hereof, this permit is good for only one trip between the points d e s i g n a t e d .
8. SAFETY. Permittee shall at all times give strict attention to the safety and rights of the traveling public.
9. TRAVELED WAY. The vehicle must be kept to the right of the highway centerline at all times and must stay off shoulders except when entering or leaving the highway or when necessary to allow trailing traffic to pass. On narrow or winding roads, flagmen shall effectively warn and direct traffic. Movement in convoy shall not be permitted unless specified on the face of the permit.
10. BRIDGE STRUCTURES. Extra-legal weight vehicles or loads shall not cross bridge structures simultaneously with other heavily laden vehicles. Before entering upon any bridge structure, the Permittee shall observe approaching

traffic from both directions and should it appear that a second heavily laden vehicle would pass in the opposing lane of traffic or overtake the vehicle, the driver shall pull unit clear of the traveled way and wait until the unregulated load or loads have crossed the bridge structure before entering thereon.

11. PROTECTION ON BRIDGES OR NARROW ROADS. When crossing bridges or on roads so narrow that it is impossible to comply with Regulation 9, a flagman shall be posted ahead of such equipment to warn and direct approaching traffic (see Escort Vehicle Regulations 36 and 37).
12. NIGHT MOVING. Night or weekend moving of extra-legal loads or vehicles will only be permitted when specifically stated on the face of the permit. When night moving is permitted, clearance and side marker lamps must be installed on load at all times and mounted to conform to Section 25100 (c) of the Vehicle Code. Vehicles used for night or weekend moving of permit loads must meet the following requirements:
 - a. performance shall be comparable with vehicles moving legal loads.
 - b. shall have the ability to maintain normal highway speeds.
 - c. shall avoid undue interference with other traffic.
13. MOVING IN FOGGY, RAINY OR WINDY WEATHER. No moving shall be done in foggy, rainy or windy weather when visibility is restricted to less than 1,000 feet except on special authorization. Movement is prohibited when road surfaces are hazardous due to rain, ice, snow or frost or when use of tire chains is mandatory. No moving shall be done when velocity of the wind is such that it causes the vehicle being towed to whip or swerve from side to side or fall to follow substantially in the path of the towing vehicle. Any accident caused by excessive wind conditions shall be considered a prima facie violation of this restriction.
14. PARKING ON HIGHWAY. If necessary to park equipment or load on the highway at night, it shall be moved off the traveled way or pavement so as not to interfere with passing traffic in any way. Warning lights shall be displayed so as to fully protect said traffic. Parking on freeways will be allowed only in case of emergency.
15. NO MOVING DURING HEAVY TRAFFIC. Unless authorized on the face of this permit equipment or load covered by this permit shall not be moved over the highways on Saturdays, Sundays and the following holidays (or any of these holidays falling on a weekend and celebrated on a weekday):

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Washington's Birthday (3rd Monday in Feb.)	Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day (Last Monday in May)	Christmas Day
Independence Day	

When one of the above listed holidays falls on Monday or Friday, permit movements will not be allowed on a holiday nor the immediately preceding or following weekend, unless authorized on the face of the permit.

Responsibility of Permittee

16. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR BRIDGES.** This permit does not authorize crossing any posted bridges with gross load exceeding posted limits. Permittee shall comply with all rules posted on any bridges over which are passed and shall assume all risks relative thereto.
17. **OVERHEAD CLEARANCE.** When height of load exceeds legal limit, it becomes the responsibility of the Permittee to check all underpasses, bridges, overhead wires or other structures for impaired vertical clearance and to bypass or arrange clearance at such locations.
18. **REPAIR OF DAMAGE.** In accepting this permit, the Permittee agrees to repair at their own expense and to the satisfaction of the Director, any damage to the highway or structures. Work of repair may be done by the Department of Development Services forces at the option of the Director of Development Services, the cost to be borne by the Permittee. In the event of damage to City highway facilities such as bridges, traffic signals, light standards and so forth, a written report must be filed with the Department within 72 hours after such damage has been done. Failure to make this report will be considered cause for cancellation of all permit privileges pending a satisfactory arrangement with the Department for repair or replacement of the damaged facility.
19. **LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES.** The Permittee is responsible for all liability for injury to or death of any person or damage to property which may occur through any act or omission of either the Permittee or the City of Santee. In the event any claim, suit, or action is brought against the City of Santee, its officer, or employee thereof, by reason of, or in connection with any such act or omission, Permittee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its officers and employees from such claim, suit, or action.
20. **OTHER LEGAL LIMITATIONS.** All vehicles, utilized as laden or unladen under this permit must conform to legal length, width, and/or overall combination length as defined in the California Vehicle Code, except as specifically stated on the permit. Outriggers may extend to maximum 10'-6" width on legal width vehicles only when laden.
21. **AUXILIARY EQUIPMENT.** All trailers or dollies being towed by truck cranes, boom trucks, "A" frame units, drill rigs or similar units and/or any transported load on such trailer or dolly must conform to legal length, width and/or weights as defined in the California Vehicle Code unless specifically exempt on the face of the permit.

22. **MAXIMUM WEIGHT AND SIZE.** The maximum limits for weight and size of vehicles and loads set forth in the Vehicle Code shall not be exceeded except as specifically stated on the face of this permit. Permitted axle weights do not authorize exceeding rated capacity of vehicle tires as specified in 1086 California Administration Code.
23. **BOOSTER TYPE AXLES.** A booster axle is an axle generally having an air or hydraulic cylinder suspension system that can be actuated independently to assume a portion of the load that would otherwise be carried by adjacent axles. Booster axles and add on or "Joe Dog" axles shall not be used in the movement of permit loads.
24. **TRAILERS AND/OR DOLLIES.** Not more than two trailers or one trailer and one dolly in combination shall be moved over the highway at any one time behind the towing equipment. Exceptions will be considered if transported item is of an unreducible weight and extra axles are mandatory to achieve weight limitations.
25. **REARVIEW MIRRORS.** Mirrors on power units must be located so as to reflect to the driver a view of the highway for a distance of at least 200 feet to the rear, but may not exceed 10" beyond the permitted width.
26. **TIME RESTRICTIONS.** Movement is not allowed between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. nor between 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on any City highway within the restricted area shown on attached map. Permit invalid unless map is attached.
27. **SIGNS.** Unless specifically stated otherwise on the face of the permit, all loads or vehicles being moved on highways under the provisions of Section 35780, exceeding 8'-0" in width, 80'-0" in length, or with more than 10'-0" of overhang must display appropriate warning signs. All signs shall be removed immediately upon completion of the work.

Signs shall be posted on front and rear and shall read "LONG LOAD" or "OVERSIZE". The "LONG LOAD" sign shall be used whenever overall length exceeds 100 feet. The "OVERSIZE" sign shall be used for shorter lengths and other oversize features. The more definite signs reading "WIDE LOAD", "LONG LOAD", "OVERSIZE LOAD", "EXCESSIVE FRONT OVERHANG" or "EXCESSIVE REAR OVERHANG" may be substituted for the "OVERSIZE" sign when appropriate. The "LONG LOAD" sign shall have preference when length exceeds 100'-0" and other oversize features exist. The lettering shall be a 10" minimum height with a 1-5/8" minimum brush stroke, and a minimum 1" all around. All signs shall be black letters on a yellow background, mounted at least 18" above the road surface front and rear. Signs must be neat, clean, legible, mounted securely and visible from straight ahead or behind and to 45° either side thereof.

Trailer Coaches and Building Modules

28. COACHES AND MODULES TOWED ON OWN AXLES
 - a. Shall not exceed 6,000 pounds per axle.
 - b. Exceeding 11'-6" in width shall have a minimum of 2 axles.
 - c. Exceeding 60'-0" in length shall have a minimum of 3 axles.
 - d. Units with 2 or more axles shall be equipped with full braking on a minimum of 2 axles.
 - e. May exceed 60 feet but may not exceed 65'-0" in length with a minimum of two axles when equipped with 8 x 14.5 mobile home 8-ply or 10-ply rated tires. (Ref. HUD regulations 24 CFR Section 280.904(b)(6).
29. TOWING UNITS. Tractor units towing trailer coaches and modules exceeding 10'-0" in width shall be equipped with dual rear wheels, and shall have an unladen weight as defined in Section 660 of the California Vehicle Code of not less than 6,500 pounds.
30. OPEN SIDE COVERING. Open sided units shall be covered by plywood, hard board or other rigid material. In lieu of rigid material, suitable plastics, or other flexible material may be used. Billowing or flapping of plastic or flexible side covering in excess of 6" in any one place will not be permitted.

Tow Truck

31. LENGTH. The length of tow truck and tow bar added to a legal vehicle or combination of vehicles is permitted within the radius specified on the permit. (See Vehicle Code 25780.)
32. DANGEROUS CARGO.
 - a. A disabled vehicle or vehicle combination containing a flammable or corrosive cargo, or poison gas may be towed without length limitation to the nearest petroleum distribution center, truck service stop, or destination, if closer.
 - b. A disabled vehicle or vehicle combination containing or carrying explosives may be towed without length limitations only over approved routes and only to an approved safe parking spot as authorized by the California Highway Patrol for this type of cargo, or to destination, if closer.

33. LEGAL SIZE. Any disabled vehicle or vehicles, including load, to be towed shall be of legal size and weight (see Regulation 35 for exceptions).
34. UNRESTRICTED MOVEMENT. Unrestricted day and night movements, including Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, are authorized provided that only essential minimum distances (point of breakdown to nearest off-ramp) are traveled in metropolitan areas between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. as shown on the attached Restricted Hours map.
35. TOWING PERMIT LOADS AND/OR VEHICLES.
 - a. Disabled oversize and/or overweight vehicles, if covered by a valid Transportation permit issued by the Department of Development Services, may be towed on the City highways authorized by that transportation permit but only to the closest freeway off-ramp, city street, or truck service stop.
 - b. Any disabled vehicle or combination of vehicles which because of damage has incurred distortion in width or height hereby causing an excess in legal dimensions or the dimensions authorized by a Transportation permit adhere to the following provisions:
 - (1) When such damage occurs on the City highway other than a freeway, the disabled vehicle or combination shall be towed either to the nearest City street over which travel can be continued by other permits or towed to the nearest parking spot until a "single trip" permit can be obtained covering the existing oversize dimensions to further travel.
 - (2) When such damage occurs on any full freeway, the vehicle or combination may be towed to the nearest off-ramp of the City street over which travel can be continued by other permits. Any such width over 12'-0" will require a front and rear pilot car as escort for any distance over one-half mile.

Escort Vehicle and Flagging

36. PERMITTEE'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR PROPER PILOTING AND FLAGGING PROCEDURES. It shall be the responsibility of the Permittee to ensure that pilot car vehicles, operators, and/or flagmen employed carry out the provisions of this permit, and all personnel are properly equipped and briefed as to their responsibilities prior to the movement. Failure of pilot car operators and flagmen to comply with these provisions in properly warning and directing traffic is considered a violation of the terms of this permit.

37. FLAGMAN. When necessary to post a flagman or flagmen in order to warn and direct approaching traffic, each flagman must be wearing a red jacket or vest and equipped with a red flag and paddle reading "STOP" in white letters with red background. Flagmen shall not be less than 18 years of age and capable of carrying out flagging responsibilities.
38. PILOT CARS. Pilot cars when specified on the face of the permit shall be furnished by the Permittee.

When one pilot car is required it shall precede on two or three lane conventional roads or follow on four or more lane divided roads. When two pilot cars are required one shall precede and one shall follow piloted load or vehicle. Exceptions to these provisions are to be specifically stated on the face of the permit. The permit may require additional pilot cars.

Pilot cars and permit move shall remain right of the centerline of the roadway at all times except when prevented by the physical limitations of the highway. The use of a pilot car does not grant to the Permittee the right to pre-empt the opposing traffic lane. When it becomes necessary because of physical limitations of the highway to use a portion of the opposing traffic lane the permit move shall not occupy that lane until it has been advised by the pilot car that the lane is clear of all on-coming traffic. Opposing traffic is not to be stopped, except in extreme emergencies. It shall be the responsibility of the permit move to stop safely and wait until the opposing lane is free of traffic before proceeding.

Pilot cars shall also comply with provisions of Section 21650 of the Vehicle Code with regard to driving upon the right side of the roadway.

Pilot cars shall not be used to tow another vehicle while being utilized as a pilot car.

Convoying, or using one pilot car for more than one extra-legal load, will not be permitted unless specifically authorized on the face of the permit.

All vehicles or loads exceeding 12'-0" in width, or the lane width will require a pilot car and those exceeding 14'-0" in width shall have a pilot car, both front and rear. In some areas a pilot car will be required for loads of lesser width or additional pilot cars will be called for depending on the character of the road and the traffic volume. For example, pilot cars may be specified for loads or vehicles exceeding 10'-0" in width on two-lane roads traversing mountain areas.

All loads exceeding 25'-0" front/rear overhang measured from the last visible means of support will require a pilot car.

All mobile vehicles, the boom rear overhang exceeding 25'-0" measured from the center of the rear most axle of the vehicle, boom dolly, or boom trailer, or

with boom front overhang exceeding 25'-0" measured from the front of the front tire of the vehicle, will require a pilot car if so stated on the face of the permit.

Pilot cars will also be required for loads where any part of the vehicle or load will be expected to encroach on opposing traffic lanes due to alignment, lane width, traffic density, etc., or if assistance is needed at on or off ramps in interchange areas.

The interval *to* be maintained between pilot car(s) and the escorted load or vehicles shall provide the maximum warning to other traffic. The interval shall provide the maximum warning to other traffic. The interval shall also be adequate to allow traffic to pass each vehicle separately where possible.

Pilot car shall be in accordance with the following requirements:

- a. SIZE. Minimum: 60" in width. Maximum: 1-1/2 ton truck.
- b. LIGHTS. Display top mounted flashing or totaling amber light(s), which must be operated at all times while escorting a load unless otherwise specified on the face of the permit. Lights shall be visible *to* the front when leading, and to the rear when following. Lights must be a type as listed on the California Highway Patrol list of approved lighting devices.
- c. SIGNS. Display a top-mounted sign with minimum height of the bottom of the sign 48" above the roadway. The sign shall contain the message "OVERSIZE LOAD AHEAD/FOLLOWING", as appropriate. The more definitive signs reading "OVERSIZE LOAD AHEAD/FOLLOWING", "WIDE LOAD AHEAD/FOLLOWING", or "LONG LOAD AHEAD/FOLLOWING" may be substituted for the "OVERSIZE LOAD AHEAD/FOLLOWING" sign when appropriate. The sign shall be printed with 5" minimum height black letters on a yellow background, using a minimum 1" brush stroke. Signs must not be displayed when not escorting a load.
- d. RADIO. Two-way radio communications between pilot cars and transporting vehicles will be required where the vehicle and/or load encroaches into opposing lanes of travel due to lane widths, highway alignment, side clearance restrictions, length and/or width of load, etc. when specified on the face of the permit.
- e. RED FLAGS. Each pilot vehicle shall be equipped with (1) slow/stop hand paddle, (2) red hand flag, (3) red vest or jacket. These items are to be utilized by the pilot car operator in the event it becomes necessary to park the pilot car and stop or control highway traffic. Flagging procedures shall be in accordance with state's pamphlet entitled "Instructions to Flagmen". At no time will the slow/stop hand paddle be displayed out of the window of a moving vehicle.

Route Evaluation

Any load exceeding 110'-0" length, 15'-0" in width and 16'-0" in height is subject to a route evaluation and inspection by Department of Development Services personnel. Arrangements must be made eight (8) calendar days prior to the move.

Regulations Governing Movement of Mobile Homes

General Requirements

1. All moves shall be made from sunrise to sunset unless otherwise noted on the face of the permit.
2. No moves shall be made on Saturdays, Sundays, Holidays or at night unless authorized on the face of the permit.
3. No moves shall be made between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. or between 3:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. over congested roads.
4. Each applicant for a permit shall provide proof of insurance in Force in accordance with Section 11.34.255 of the Municipal Code.
5. All provisions of the Vehicle Code and Municipal Ordinance shall be complied with at all times.
6. Loads in excess of 12'-6" will require a pilot car and the loads in excess of 14'-0" will require a pilot car fore and aft.

Single Trip Permits

1. Name and address of mover.
2. Make and serial number of coaches.
3. Dimensions of load, including width and length.
4. Point of origin, routing and destination.
5. Maximum axle loading.
6. Single trip permits will be good for calendar days.

Permit fee for single trip permit is \$19.00 (FY21-22)

Blanket /Annual) Permit.

Annual permits will be issued for towing mobile homes under the following conditions:

1. The towing vehicle will be identified on permit.
2. Power units to tow loads having a gross weight of more than 18,000 pounds shall be a 1-1/2 ton vehicle or larger, equipped with dual wheels.
3. Vehicle shall be identified by make, year, license number and I.D. number.
4. Vehicle and mobile home combination shall not exceed 13'-6" in width, 15'-0" height and 90'-0" in length.
5. Applicant must be a licensed manufacturer, dealer or transporter.
6. Applicants must be the owner of the vehicle or the appointed authorized representative.

Permit fee is \$109.00 (FY21-22) for a period not to exceed one year.

1. If the permit is issued for less than one year because of insurance, it can be extended to one year upon proof of issuance.
2. If the tractor identified on an annual blanket permit is sold the permit may be assigned to a new tractor for the remainder of the year.

VERTICAL AND HORIZONTAL CLEARANCE FOR THE MOVEMENT OF OVERSIZED LOADS ON VARIOUS CITY ROADS

The areas where there would be some height restrictions would be at signalized intersections. The minimum allowable vertical clearance for any obstruction hanging from a signal arm is 15'-0". Therefore, if the vertical dimension of the load exceeds 15'-0", it should either be rerouted or provisions should be made to allow the load to travel against traffic through the signalized intersection as required.

The following is a list of street intersections along some of the major hauling routes which are equipped with traffic signals.

1. Night and Saturday moves are authorized only when shown on the face of the moving permit. Blanket permits for night moves will not be authorized for loads in excess of: Height 14'-0", Width 12'-0", Length 90'-0".
2. Any requests for night or Saturday moves involving equipment in excess of the above dimensions will be considered on a single even permit basis.
3. Any load moved during night-time hours shall meet all requirements of this permit, State and County regulations and shall be properly lighted with warning lights and signs as may be required by law or ordinance.

**NIGHT MOVE
MINIMUM LIGHTING REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH UNIT**

1. Steadily burning amber lights at outer extremities, and all protrusions, and at 5'-0" intervals completely around structure except the lights in the rear may be red. Maximum heights above ground is 5'-0".
2. A minimum of the following high intensity amber electric lights must be in operation. These lights must be at least 4" in diameter.

Approximate height above ground is 8'-0".

Left front and Right rear - 2 lights (one blinker and one steady or both blinking)

Right front and Left rear - 1 light blinker or steady

3. White flood light projecting from the towing truck to flood entire front of each unit 15'-0" or wider, adjusting so that lights will not project beyond maximum width of the unit.
4. Lighting on EACH UNIT being moved shall meet these requirements.
5. These requirements may be modified and/or additional requirements may be requested by the Department of Development Services.

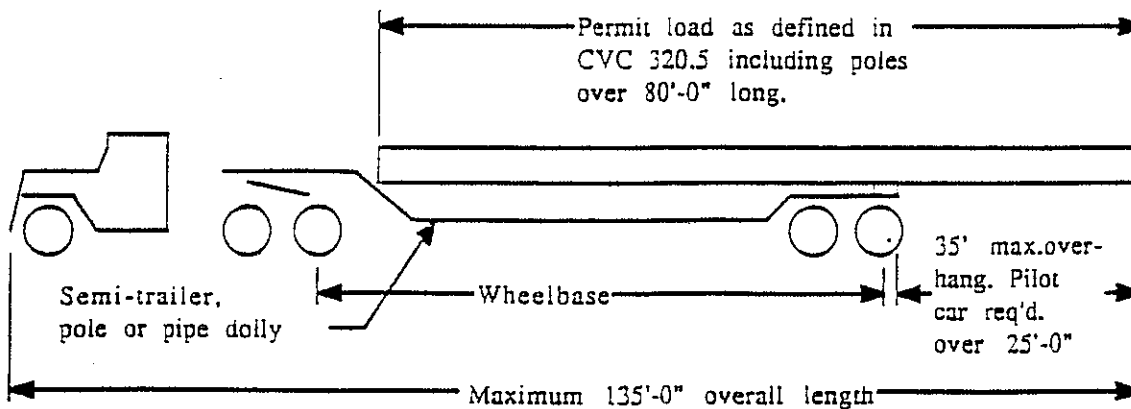

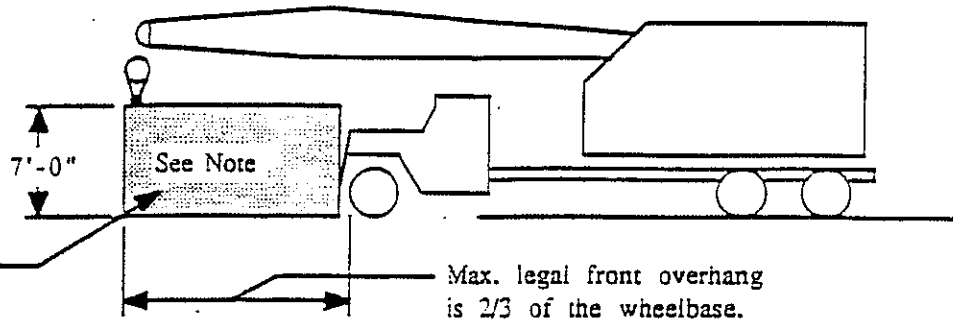

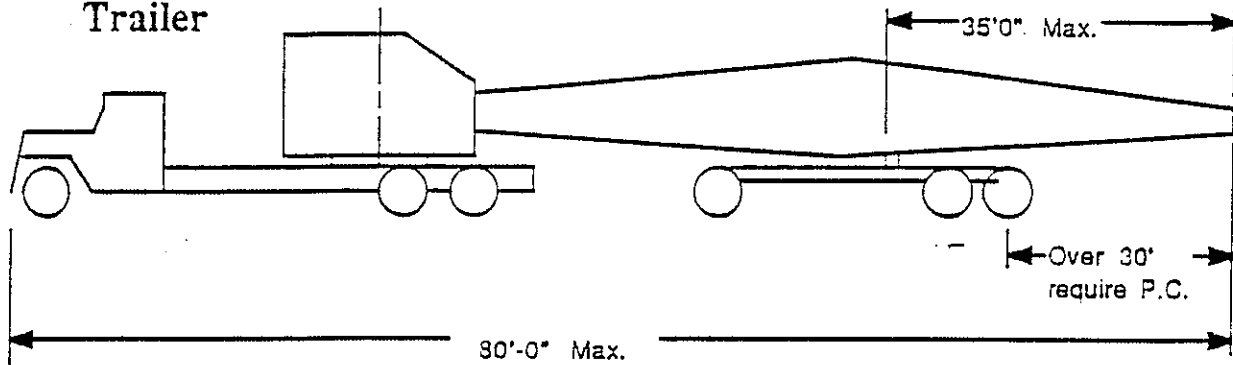

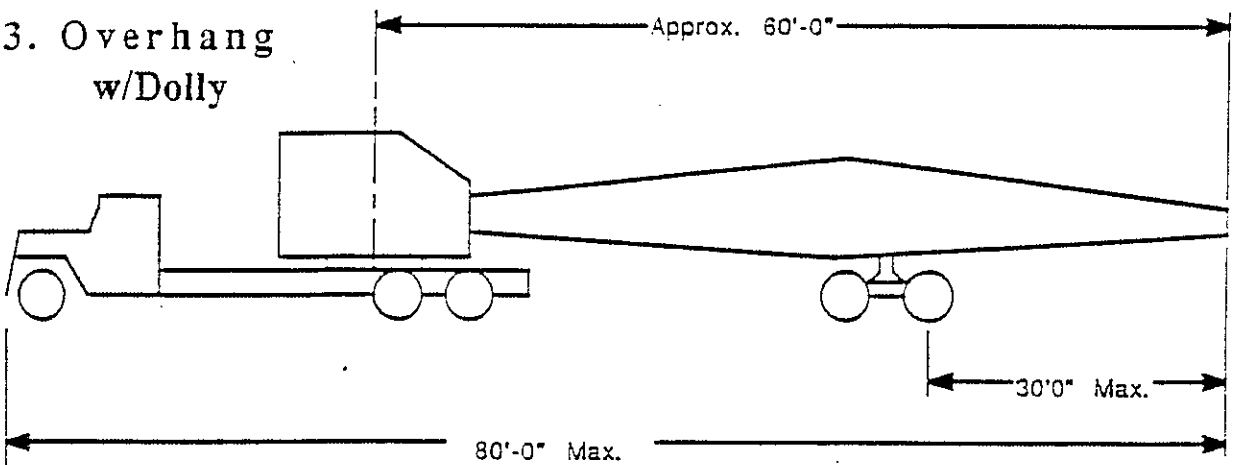

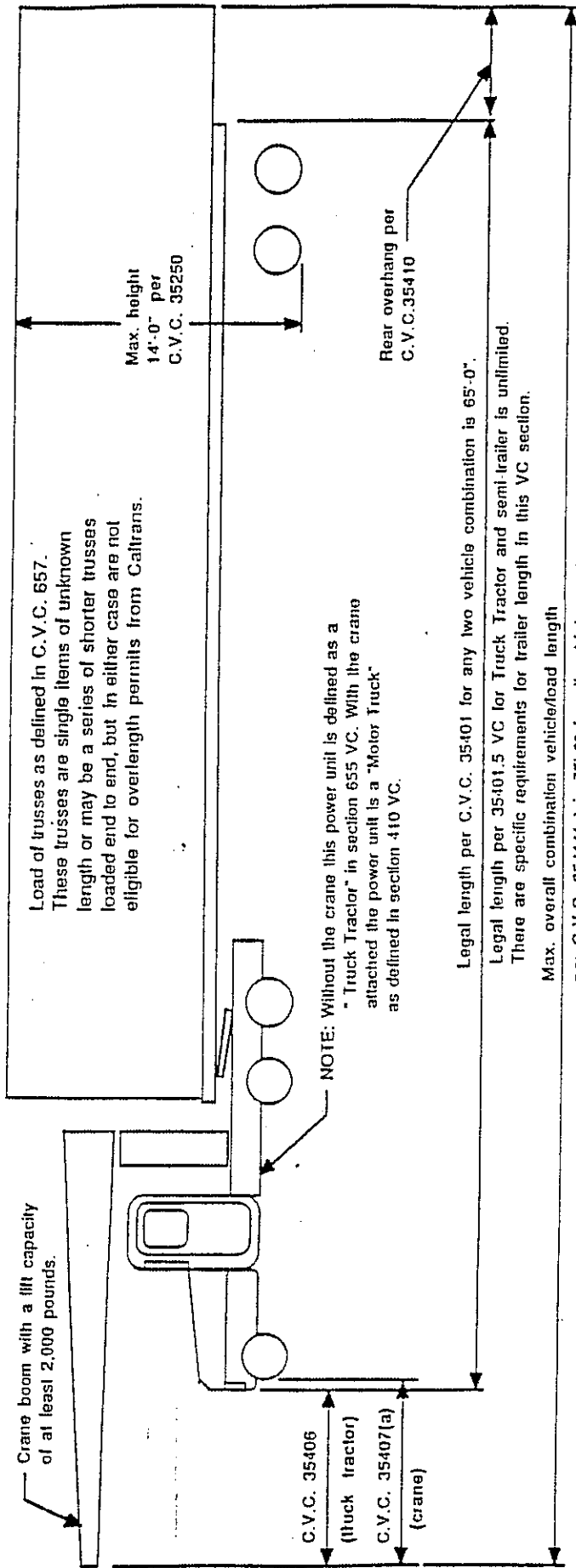


3. Overhang w/Dolly

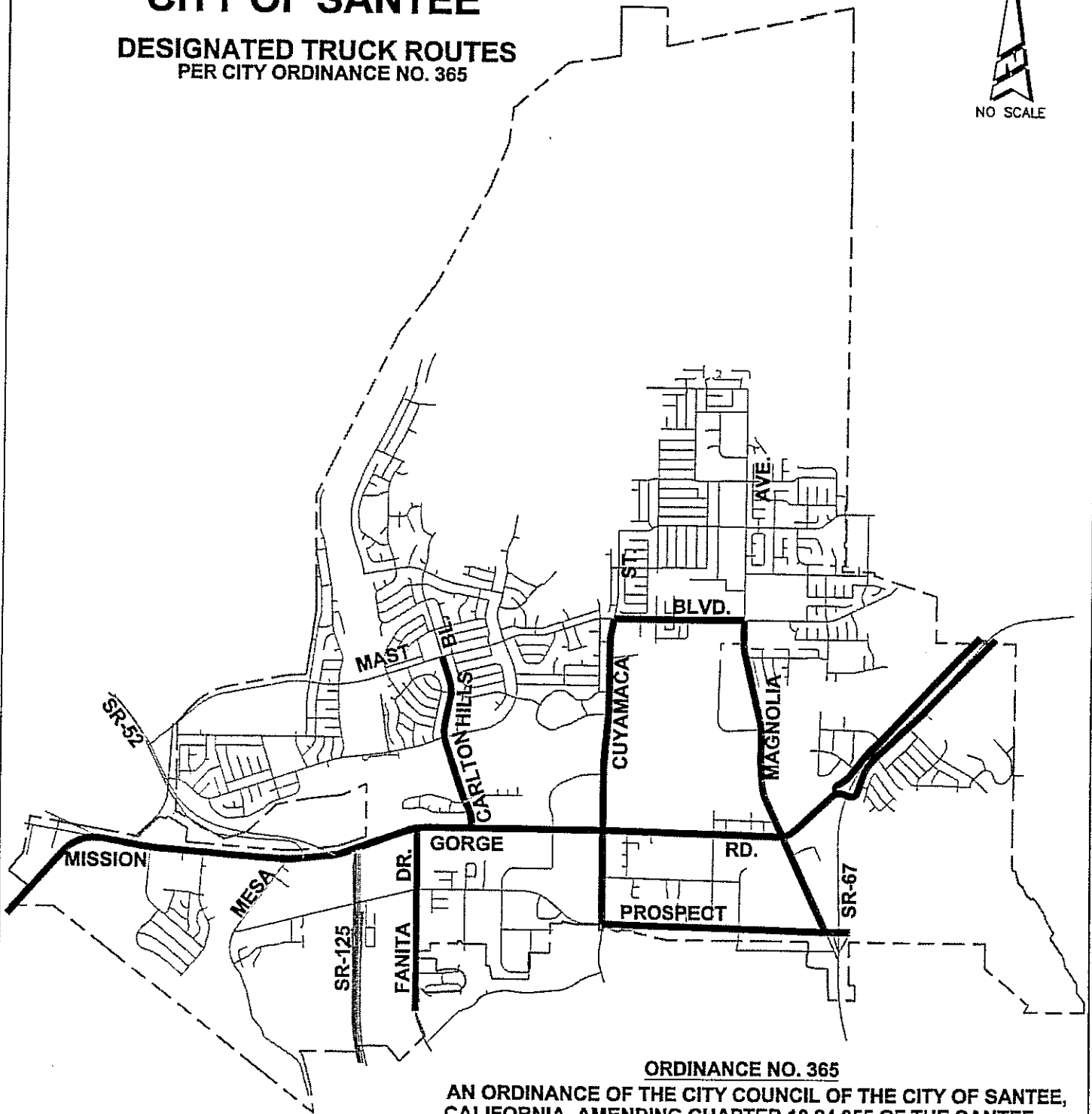
