SUMMARY

This Item asks the City Council to waive the reading in full of all Ordinances on the Agenda (if any) and approve their reading by title only. The purpose of this Item is to help streamline the City Council meeting process, to avoid unnecessary delay and to allow more time for substantive discussion of Items on the Agenda.

State law requires that all Ordinances be read in full either at the time of introduction or at the time of passage, unless a motion waiving further reading is adopted by a majority of the City Council. (Gov. Code, § 36934). This means that each word in each Ordinance would have to be read aloud unless such reading is waived. Such reading could substantially delay the meeting and limit the time available for discussion of substantive Items. Adoption of this waiver streamlines the procedure for adopting the Ordinances on tonight's Agenda (if any), because it allows the City Council to approve Ordinances by reading aloud only the title of the Ordinance instead of reading aloud every word of the Ordinance.

The procedures for adopting Resolutions are not as strict as the procedures for adopting Ordinances. For example, Resolutions do not require two readings for passage, need not be read in full or even by title, are effective immediately unless otherwise specified, do not need to be in any particular format unless expressly required, and, with the exception of fixing tax rates or revenue amounts, do not require publication. However, like Ordinances, all Resolutions require a recorded majority vote of the total membership of the City Council. (Gov. Code § 36936).

SUMMARY The City's contract for Sidewalk Cutting and Repair Services expired on June 30, 2019. In compliance with the City's purchasing ordinance, Santee Municipal Code 3.24.110, the Finance Department administered a formal bid process for a new contract for said services. On November 17, 2020, two bids were received and opened. Based on the requirements for lowest responsive responsible bid, staff recommends that City Council award the contract for Sidewalk Cutting and Repair Services to BPR Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$37,872.00 for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2020-21 and \$37,872.00 for Fiscal Year 2021-22.

The term of the initial contract shall be January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, with three (3) subsequent 12-month options to renew and one (1) optional 90-day extension. Annual increases for this contract, if any, shall be at the sole discretion of the City and shall not exceed the San Diego All-Urban Consumers Price Index (CPI) for the preceding calendar year. Staff also requests City Council authorization for the City Manager to approve future purchase orders per subsequent contract renewals and annual change orders up to ten percent (10%) of the then-current contract amount; and for the Director of Community Services to execute a Notice of Completion and the City Clerk to file said Notice of Completion for each term of the contract once the work for that term has been completed to the satisfaction of the Director.

- 4. Authorize the Director of Community Services to execute a Notice of Completion and the City Clerk to file said Notice of Completion upon satisfactory completion of work for each contract term.

SUMMARY The City's Safety Element is required to be updated to reflect a number of statutory requirements imposed by new California legislation, including Senate Bill (SB) 1000. This Bill requires local jurisdictions with disadvantaged communities to create an Environmental Justice Element with goals, policies, and objectives to mitigate existing and potential hazards, reduce health risks, and prioritize improvements that address the needs of disadvantaged communities. This includes the reduction of pollution exposure, hazard exposure, improvement of air quality, and the promotion of public facilities such as parks, food access, safe and sanitary homes, and physical activity. The California State Environmental Protection Agency (CEPA) and the Office of Planning and Research (OPR) encourage the use of the CalEnviroScreen 3.0 model, published by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, to identify disadvantaged communities. The City's identified disadvantaged area is depicted on the attached Exhibit.

OPR defines "disadvantaged communities" as an area identified by the California Environmental Protection Agency (CEPA) pursuant to Section 39711 of the Health and Safety Code or an area that is a low-income area that is disproportionately affected by environmental pollution and other hazards that can lead to negative health effects, exposure, or environmental degradation.

Staff's approach is to integrate environmental justice in the Safety Element, and to re-title the Safety Element to be the "Safety and Environmental Justice Element" (refer to draft Table of Contents). Given the introduction of significant new material, and a public outreach component, staff recommends entering into a Professional Services Agreement with Harris & Associates for an amount not to exceed \$30,000. This firm has expertise in Safety Elements, and has a working knowledge of the City's Sustainable Santee Plan and other General Plan Elements. A proposal is attached which also includes the preparation of the environmental document.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW Per California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines Section 15378, this action is not a project under CEQA and, therefore, is not subject to CEQA review. The Safety Element would be analyzed as a project under CEQA.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT Funding for the \$30,000 cost of this agreement is available in the adopted fiscal year 2020-21 Planning Division budget by utilizing \$10,000 of the \$37,500 currently appropriated for an inclusionary housing in-lieu fee study. Should the City Council decide to move forward with an inclusionary housing in-lieu fee study an additional appropriation may be required at that time.



Harris & Associates (Harris) proposes to assist the City of Santee (City) with updating its Safety and Environmental Justice Element to provide consistency with existing and updated General Plan goals, objectives, and policies and regulatory compliance with new California legislation. The Element will assess existing conditions of potential hazards, health risks, and disproportionate environmental burdens faced by disadvantaged communities, and identify objectives and policies that will:

- Mitigate existing and potential hazards in the City
- Reduce the unique or compounded health risks in disadvantaged communities
- Promote civil engagement in the public decision-making process
- · Prioritize improvements and programs that address the needs of disadvantaged communities


Harris understands that the City has already begun preparing the Safety portion of the Element and will continue to manage that effort in-house. Harris will assist the City by:

- 1. Preparing an environmental justice existing conditions assessment and drafting objectives and policies aimed at reducing the compounded health impacts in disadvantaged communities in compliance with Senate Bill 1000.
- 2. Supporting stakeholder engagement by preparing content and facilitating meetings and developing a community survey.
- 3. Preparing an Initial Study and either a Negative Declaration or Mitigated Negative Declaration to efficiently achieve compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Following are detailed descriptions of the tasks Harris will complete on behalf of the City.

TASK 1: ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ASSESSMENT

Harris will assist the City in preparing an existing conditions assessment of environmental justice topic areas. Harris will begin developing the existing conditions assessment by identifying disadvantaged communities in the City through the use of existing tools including the Senate Bill 1000 Toolkit, CalEnviroScreen 3.0, and the California Department of Water Resources Disadvantaged Communities Screening Tool. Incorporating public outreach input, Harris will draft an Environmental Justice Element that features the existing conditions assessment and objectives and policies that seek to address the unique or compounded health risks in the City's disadvantaged communities. These include pollution or hazard exposure and barriers to access public facilities and services, healthy food, safe and sanitary homes, and physical activity. Objectives and policies will also address underrepresentation of disadvantaged groups in public decision-making and other forms of civic engagement. Harris will participate in up to eight biweekly, 30-minute video/conference calls with the City to discuss project progress, share information, and resolve issues.

TASK 2: STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Harris will develop a community survey to collect input from the public. The goal of the survey will be to understand residents' concerns regarding potential hazards and public health threats and to better understand how residents experience environmental burdens or lack of access to public services that promote community health and well-being. Harris will draft survey questions in a Microsoft Word or Google Docs document and send it to City staff for review. After incorporating feedback, Harris will translate the survey into Spanish and insert the survey content (in English and Spanish) into ESRI's ArcGIS Survey123 application. Harris will export the survey results as tables and graphs so the City can easily incorporate the results directly into the Element. The survey results will help the City prioritize the Element's objectives and policies.

Harris will work with City staff to prepare content for up to two stakeholder meetings. Stakeholder meetings could be incorporated into community group or City Council meetings. Harris will be responsible for working with the City to develop a presentation and help facilitate each meeting. Harris will present the environmental justice existing conditions and the results of the community survey at the first stakeholder meeting. The team will solicit feedback on key opportunity areas and community priorities that will guide the development of goals and objectives. The second meeting will present the fully drafted Environmental Justice and Safety Element, including the goals and policies that will reduce the compounded or unique health impacts and safety risks of disadvantaged communities.



TASK 3: INITIAL STUDY/(MITIGATED) NEGATIVE DECLARATION

Harris will prepare an Initial Study and either a Negative Declaration or Mitigated Negative Declaration for the proposed Safety and Environmental Justice Element. For the purposes of this letter proposal, it is referred to as an "IS/(M)ND." Harris will work as a team with the City to comply with CEQA by completing the following subtasks:

- 1. Harris will prepare a project description, which will describe the basic characteristics of each component of the project, including location, environmental setting, and technical and environmental characteristics. The project description will be based on information provided by the City.
- 2. Harris will prepare the IS for the project. The IS will be based on readily available public information. This scope of work assumes that technical studies are not required. Should the need for technical studies change during the preparation of the IS/(M)ND, an amendment to the IS/(M)ND scope of work may be required.
- 3. Harris will prepare the ND form based on the environmental analysis from the IS.
- 4. Harris will submit to the City an electronic version of the First Draft IS/(M)ND and all appendices as PDF and editable (Word) files.
- 5. Harris will revise the First Draft IS/(M)ND based on comments from the City and prepare the Public Review Draft IS/(M)ND. This scope of work and cost assumes that there will be one round of City review and that City staff will reconcile and compile their comments into a single document for Harris' use.
- 6. Harris assumes that the Public Review Draft IS/(M)ND will undergo a 30-day public review and will be submitted to the State Clearinghouse for review by state agencies. Harris will produce an electronic version of the Public Review Draft



- IS/(M)ND and appendices as PDF and Word files and submit it to the City on a CD or flash drive. In addition, two paper copies of the Public Review Draft IS/(M)ND will be provided to the City.
- 7. The City will prepare the Notice of Intent (NOI) to adopt an (M)ND and submit it to a local newspaper in compliance with Section 15072 of the CEQA Guidelines. Per Executive Order N-80-20, the NOI is not required to be filed, posted, and made publicly available at the County Clerk's office, despite CEQA's requirements, if an appropriate alternative is provided. The City will prepare the Notice of Completion (NOC) and files necessary for electronic submittal to the State Clearinghouse.
- 8. Harris will prepare a Responses to Comments (RTCs) Memorandum including a summary of the comments received on the Draft IS/(M)ND during the public review period and responses to those comments. Harris will electronically submit a Draft and a Final RTCs Memorandum to the City. This scope of work assumes that the effort required to respond to comments will not exceed 16 professional staff hours or require substantial new analysis or substantial revisions to a section of the IS/(M)ND.
- 9. Harris will revise the IS/(M)ND, if required, for clarification based on public review comments received and will prepare the Final IS/(M)ND. Revisions made will be identified in strikeout/underline format in the Final IS/(M)ND.
- 10. Harris will prepare an electronic version of the Final IS/(M)ND as PDF and Word files and submit it to the City on a CD or flash drive.
- 11. If an MND is prepared, Harris will prepare the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) identifying the parties responsible for implementation, oversight, and verification of all mitigation measures. Note that an MMRP is not required if an ND is prepared.
- 12. The City will prepare the Notice of Determination (NOD) and be responsible for filing the NOD with the County Clerk's office and State Clearinghouse within 5 days of project approval, including payment of all fees. According to Executive Order N-80-20, the NOD is not required to be filed, posted, and made publicly available at the County Clerk's office if an appropriate alternative is provided. It is assumed that the City will sign and file the NOD at the County Clerk's office or State Clearinghouse or through an alternative method.
- 13. Harris will attend one public hearing to answer questions regarding the IS/(M)ND. This scope of work assumes that the City will prepare all necessary hearing materials, including presentations.



SCHEDULE

Harris understands that the City is coordinating the development of the Safety and Environmental Justice Element with the update of the City's Housing Element. While statutory mandates (Senate Bills 1035 and 1000) trigger the opening of the Safety and Environmental Justice Element upon the update of the Housing Element, the Safety and Environmental Justice Element does not need to be adopted at the same time as the Housing Element. Therefore, Harris recommends extending the adoption of the Safety and Environmental Justice Element to June 2020 to accommodate a more robust community engagement and environmental review process. A schedule with potential durations for each deliverable is provided below. This assumes a notice to proceed on November 23, 2020. A delay in the notice to proceed will result in an equal delay in the schedule.

SUMMARY

On August 14, 2019, City Council determined that the vacant parcel of real property located in Trolley Square identified as Parcel 4 of Map 18857 ("Property") was not appropriate for a public library. On September 5, 2019, the City and Excel Acquisitions, LLC entered into an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement ("ENA") to negotiate the terms of a Disposition and Development Agreement ("DDA") for the possible future construction of a hotel on Parcel 4, subject to all applicable legal requirements, including, without limitation the California Environmental Quality Act. On December 11, 2019, in accordance with Government Code section 37420 et seq., the City Council adopted a resolution finding that the public interest and convenience require the sale of the Property and declaring its intent to sell the Property. Since entering into the ENA, City staff and Excel have been negotiating the terms of a proposed DDA.

A Public Hearing to consider the DDA with Excel was first scheduled for January 8, 2020, but has been continued by the City Council, most recently to January 13, 2021. The City and Excel need additional time to negotiate the terms of the DDA. For this reason, it is recommended the City Manager be authorized to execute a Third Amendment to the ENA to extend the end of the negotiation period from December 31, 2020 to January 31, 2021.

CEQA COMPLIANCE

The Third Amendment to the ENA to allow for continued negotiations and discussions between the City and Excel regarding the DDA is not a project subject to CEQA review under State CEQA Guidelines section 15378. The proposed hotel project subject to the DDA was previously analyzed under CEQA in the Supplemental Environmental Checklist for the Arts and Entertainment Overlay District adopted by the City on December 11, 2019. No approval action has been taken for the proposed hotel project, however, as negotiations between the parties are still ongoing and the City has made no legal commitment to the hotel.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT Am

If the City approves the DDA, the City would gain the purchase price of \$1.4 million, minus sale costs.

SUMMARY On November 14, 2018, the City and Eneract, LLC ("Developer") entered into a Disposition and Development Agreement ("DDA") for the development and operation by Developer of a theater on the property known as Parcel 3 of Parcel Map 20177, located north of Town Center Parkway between Cuyamaca Street and Riverview Parkway, also known as the Cinema Parcel ("Property"). On June 3, 2019, the City and Developer executed the First Amendment to the DDA to extend the schedule of performance by 180 days. On August 23, 2019, City and Developer executed the Second Amendment to the DDA indicating that the Due Diligence Period would end 15 days after the Developer receives a determination from the Department of Industrial Relations as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification ("DIR Determination"), or 270 days from the Effective Date of the Second Amendment, whichever occurs first, and making other changes regarding funding mechanisms and payment obligations. On October 7, 2020, City and Developer executed the Third Amendment to the DDA to provide that the Due Diligence Period will terminate 15 days after the Developer receives the DIR Determination, or December 31, 2020, whichever occurs first. On October 19, 2020, City and Developer executed the Fourth Amendment to the DDA, to indicate that the City would release \$90,000 of the \$100,000 Developer Deposit provided certain conditions were satisfied.

Due to unforeseen delays, City and Developer now desire to execute a Fifth Amendment to the DDA to provide that the Due Diligence Period will terminate 15 days after the Developer receives the DIR Determination, or June 30, 2021, whichever occurs first. Staff recommends that the City Council approve the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute the Fifth Amendment.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The City's approval of the Fifth Amendment does not constitute approval by the City of any development of the Property or of other activity on the Property that would have a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect environmental impact pursuant to CEQA. (See 14 C.C.R. §§ 15060(c); 15378(b).) Developer's future use or development of the Property is expressly conditioned on CEQA compliance. City will conduct environmental review in accordance with CEQA prior to taking any discretionary action with regard to any proposed development of the Property.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT The City's approval of the Fifth Amendment does not have any immediate financial impact on the City.

WHEREAS, the City and Developer executed that certain First Amendment to the Agreement, dated June 3, 2019, to extend the Due Diligence Period by 90 days, to expire on the two hundred and tenth (210th) day following the Escrow Opening Date; and

WHEREAS, City and Developer executed that certain Second Amendment to the Agreement, dated August 23, 2019, indicating that the Due Diligence Period would terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives a determination from the Department of Industrial Relations as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification ("DIR Determination"), or two hundred seventy (270) days from the Effective Date of the Second Amendment, whichever occurs first, and making other changes regarding funding mechanisms and payment obligations; and

WHEREAS, City and Developer executed that certain Third Amendment to the Agreement, dated October 7, 2020, indicating that the Due Diligence Period would terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives the DIR Determination, or on December 31, 2020, whichever occurs first; and

WHEREAS, following direction from Council reported out of closed session, City and Developer executed that certain Fourth Amendment to the Agreement, dated October 19, 2020, indicating that City would release \$90,000 of the \$100,000 Development Deposit provided certain conditions were satisfied. The term of the Fourth Amendment is co-terminous with the extended Due Diligence period established by the Third Amendment; and

WHEREAS, City and Developer now desire to revise the Agreement to indicate that the Due Diligence Period will terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives the DIR Determination, or on June 30, 2021, whichever occurs first; and

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. CEQA Compliance. The City's approval of this Fifth Amendment to the Agreement does not constitute approval by the City of any development of the Property or of other activity on the Property that would have a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect environmental impact pursuant to CEQA. (See 14 C.C.R. §§ 15060(c); 15378(b).) Moreover, Developer's future use or development of the Property is expressly conditioned on CEQA compliance. City shall conduct environmental review in accordance with CEQA prior to taking any discretionary action with regard to any proposed development of the Property.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Approval of Amendment.</u> The City Council hereby approves the Fifth Amendment to the Agreement, in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A," subject to any non-substantive revisions which do not increase the City's liability and are approved by the City Attorney, and authorizes the City Manager to execute the Fifth Amendment.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Resolution or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The City declares that the City would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion of this Resolution.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

THIS FIFTH AMENDMENT TO THE DISPOSITION AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (this "Fifth Amendment") is dated as of December ____, 2020 for reference purposes only, and is entered into by and between the City of Santee, a California charter city ("City") and Eneract, LLC, a Texas limited liability company ("Developer") (collectively, the "Parties," and each a "Party"). The Parties enter into this Fifth Amendment with reference to the following recited facts (collectively, the "Recitals," and each a "Recital"):

RECITALS

- A. The City owns 6.74 acres of real property ("Cinema Parcel") known as Parcel 3 of Parcel Map 20177 located north of Town Center Parkway between Cuyamaca Street and Riverview Parkway in Santee, California, being Assessor's Parcel No. 381-050-66; County Parcel 2014-0156-A (the "Property"); and
- B. The Developer desires to acquire the Property and construct Cinema Improvements¹ for the development and operation by Developer of the Cinema Improvements consistent with the Deed Restrictions; and
- C. The City and Developer entered into that certain Disposition and Development Agreement, dated November 14, 2018, ("Agreement") for the sale and development of the Property; and
- D. City and Developer executed that certain First Amendment to the Agreement, dated June 3, 2019, to extend the Due Diligence Period by 90 days, to expire on the two hundred and tenth (210th) day following the Escrow Opening Date; and
- E. City and Developer executed that certain Second Amendment to the Agreement, dated August 23, 2019, indicating that the Due Diligence Period would terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives a determination from the Department of Industrial Relations ("DIR") as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification, or two hundred seventy (270) days from the Effective Date of the Second Amendment, whichever occurs first, and making other changes regarding funding mechanisms and payment obligations; and
- F. City and Developer executed that certain Third Amendment to the Agreement, dated October 7, 2020, indicating that the Due Diligence Period would terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives a determination from the DIR as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification or on December 31, 2020, whichever occurs first; and

- G. City and Developer executed that certain Fourth Amendment to the Agreement, dated October 19, 2020, indicating that City would release \$90,000 of the \$100,000 Development Deposit provided certain conditions were satisfied. The term of the Fourth Amendment is co-terminous with the extended Due Diligence period established by the Third Amendment; and
- H. City and Developer now desire to revise the Agreement to indicate that the Due Diligence Period will terminate fifteen (15) days after the Developer receives a determination from the DIR as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification or on June 30, 2021, whichever occurs first; and
- I. City will continue to work and cooperate with DIR to expedite DIR's prevailing wage determination; and
- J. Pursuant to Section 7.18.4 of the Agreement, the Parties may amend the Agreement by an amendment in writing signed by the authorized representative(s) of all Parties.
- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth in this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by City and Developer, the Parties agree as follows:
- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Fifth Amendment by this reference.
- 2. <u>Incorporation of Defined Terms</u>. All terms, phrases and words indicated to be defined terms by initial capitalization in this Fifth Amendment that are not specifically defined in this Fifth Amendment shall have the meaning ascribed to the same term, phrase, or word, respectively, in the Agreement.
- 3. <u>Amendment to Agreement</u>. Section 1.1.27 of the Agreement is amended and restated to read as follows:
 - 1.1.27 "Due Diligence Period" means the date commencing on the Escrow Opening Date and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the fifteenth (15th) day following the date that the Developer receives a determination from the Department of Industrial Relations as to whether or not laborers employed relative to the construction of the Project must be paid the prevailing per diem wage rate for their labor classification, or on June 30, 2021, whichever occurs first.
- 4. <u>Effect on Agreement</u>. All terms and conditions of the Agreement that are not modified by this Fifth Amendment shall remain unmodified, in full force and effect and binding on the Parties. This Fifth Amendment shall be enforceable and interpreted in accordance with a subject to all of the terms, provisions, conditions, covenants and agreements set forth in the Agreement, except as specifically and expressly modified in this Fifth Amendment.

- 5. <u>Conflict</u>. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of this Fifth Amendment and the terms and conditions of the Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Fifth Amendment shall control.
- 6. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Fifth Amendment may be signed in counterparts (including facsimile or electronic counterparts), each of which shall be deemed an original, and all such counterparts, when taken together, shall constitute one agreement.
- 7. <u>No Intended Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. None of the terms or provisions of this Fifth Amendment are intended to benefit any person or entity other than City or Developer.
- 8. <u>Governing Law</u>. The laws of the State of California shall govern the interpretation and enforcement of this Fifth Amendment, without application of conflicts or choice of laws principles.
- 9. <u>Interpretation</u>. The terms, provisions, conditions, covenants, restrictions and agreements contained in this Fifth Amendment shall not be construed in favor of or against any Party, but shall be construed as if each Party prepared this Fifth Amendment.
- 10. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. The Agreement, as amended by this Fifth Amendment, represents the entire understanding between the Parties as to the subject matter of the Agreement, as so amended.
- 11. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Fifth Amendment shall be effective on the date last signed by all Parties following all required approvals.

SUMMARY

A General Municipal Election for one Mayor, one Member of the City Council, District 3, and one Member of the City Council, District 4, and for the submission to the voters of three ballot measures, was held and conducted in the City of Santee, California, on Tuesday, November 3. 2020.

Pursuant to Resolution No. 059-2020 adopted June 24, 2020, the Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to the City Clerk of the City of Santee. This item is placed before the City Council in order to declare the results of the November 3, 2020 General Municipal Election. The certified election results are attached to the Resolution.

The City Clerk shall enter into the minutes a statement of the results and administer the Oath of Office to each elected official. Certificates of Election were provided at the December 8, 2020 ceremony.

Section 1 of the Resolution, which lists the number of ballot cards cast (each ballot is comprised of 1 card) in the City, will be updated as soon as the number is available from the Registrar of Voters Office.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

A total of \$202,000 is budgeted for costs related to the November 3, 2020 General Municipal Election. Advance deposits were recently paid to the Registrar of Voters Office in the amounts of \$30,000 for the mayoral election, \$25,000 total for the two city council district elections and \$141,000 total for the three ballot measures. In addition, the budget includes \$6,000 for other election-related costs incurred by the City. The final cost should be provided to the City by the Registrar of Voters Office in the next several months.

the matter, unless an exception applies. The interested individual shall openly state that he or she is abstaining because of a disqualifying financial or other conflict of interest. The Mayor or any Council Member who is disqualified due to a financial interest shall publicly identify the financial interest in detail sufficient to be understood by the public except that disclosure of the exact street address of a residence is not required. A Council Member who is disqualified by a conflict of interest in any matter shall not remain in the room during the discussion and vote on such matter unless the matter has been placed on the consent agenda. In that case, the Council Member must identify the conflict and abstain from voting on the consent calendar, but may remain in the room while the consent calendar is voted upon. (2 Cal. Code Regs. § 18707(a)(3)(A).)

5. Appointment of Vice Mayor

- 5.1 The Vice Mayor is appointed by the City Council for a one-year term. The Vice Mayor is appointed in December at the Regular Meeting or the meeting at which the declaration of the election results for a general municipal election is made, whichever occurs first. (See Gov. Code § 36801.) To be eligible for appointment as Vice Mayor, a Council Member must have served at least one year of his or her current term on the Council. The office of Vice Mayor shall annually rotate by Council District to the next eligible Council Member.
- 5.2 The Vice Mayor position shall be filled in accordance with the following rotation, beginning in December 2019:

2022	District 3
2023	District 4
2024	District 1
2025	District 2
2026	District 3
2027	District 4

6. Roles of Mayor and Vice Mayor

- 6.1 The Mayor shall act as the primary spokesperson and official representative of the City Council, unless such responsibility is delegated by the Mayor, or otherwise assigned by a majority of the City Council.
- 6.2 The Mayor shall preside at all Regular, Adjourned Regular, Special and Emergency Meetings of the City Council, including joint meetings with commissions and committees and closed sessions.
