### SUMMARY

This Item asks the City Council to waive the reading in full of all Ordinances on the Agenda (if any) and approve their reading by title only. The purpose of this Item is to help streamline the City Council meeting process, to avoid unnecessary delay and to allow more time for substantive discussion of Items on the agenda.

State law requires that all Ordinances be read in full either at the time of introduction or at the time of passage, unless a motion waiving further reading is adopted by a majority of the City Council. (Gov. Code, § 36934). This means that each word in each Ordinance would have to be read aloud unless such reading is waived. Such reading could substantially delay the meeting and limit the time available for discussion of substantive Items. Adoption of this waiver streamlines the procedure for adopting the Ordinances on tonight's Agenda (if any), because it allows the City Council to approve Ordinances by reading aloud only the title of the Ordinance instead of reading aloud every word of the Ordinance.

The procedures for adopting Resolutions are not as strict as the procedures for adopting Ordinances. For example, Resolutions do not require two readings for passage, need not be read in full or even by title, are effective immediately unless otherwise specified, do not need to be in any particular format unless expressly required, and, with the exception of fixing tax rates or revenue amounts, do not require publication. However, like Ordinances, all Resolutions require a recorded majority vote of the total membership of the City Council. (Gov. Code § 36936).

SUMMARY

The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has established the Prohousing Designation Program pursuant to California Government Code §65589.9. The Designation provides jurisdictions with incentives in the form of additional points and other preferences in several of the State's competitive housing and infrastructure funding programs, including the Infill Infrastructure Grant (IIG), Prohousing Incentive Pilot (PIP) Program, Affordable Housing & Sustainable Communities (AHSC) Program, Solutions for Congested Corridors Program, the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) and the Local Partnership Program (established by the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017). The State continues to add incentives for additional funding programs. Jurisdictions eligible for the Prohousing Designation are those with Housing Elements that are compliant with State housing law and that have enacted Prohousing policies that provide land use regulations favorable to housing, accelerate housing production timeframes, and provide financial incentives for housing.

As the City has a certified Housing Element and has enacted numerous Prohousing Policies, including an Essential Housing Program, a By-Right Housing Ordinance, objective design standards, a streamlined accessory dwelling unit (ADU) review process, and a waiver of ADU development impact fees, it is well-positioned for qualifying for HCD's Prohousing Designation. A Prohousing Designation would not commit the City to any policies or programs that the City has not already adopted.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This project is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3); the activity is not a project as defined in Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, because it has no potential for resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Upon a successful application, the City would be more competitive in obtaining funding from numerous State grants and programs.

#### SUMMARY

The City has received a request from a resident along with the signatures of five (5) neighbors to install permanent stop signs on Alphonse Street at the "T" intersection with Kerrigan Street (see Location Map, Exhibit A). Residents are concerned about the potential conflicts caused by vehicles traveling in both directions on Alphonse Street without stopping, causing conflicts and potential accidents. Staff performed a stop sign warrant analysis and determined that limited sight distance justified installation of an all-way stop control at this intersection. Based on travel speed on Alphonse Street the minimum corner sight distance required is 216 feet while the available sight distance is 125 feet for eastbound approach (see Attachments 1 and 2).

Currently the approach of Kerrigan Street is controlled by a stop sign. Staff recommends approving the installation of stop signs with "STOP" legends and limit lines on the Alphonse Street as it approaches the "T" intersection with Kerrigan Street. This recommendation is based on the fulfillment of the requirements in the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) for the installation of stop signs to ensure proper assignment of right-of-way, as well as, to eliminate potential conflicts of vehicles crossing the intersection due to restricted corner sight distance. Additionally, Santee Municipal Code Section 10.08.030 provides for the installation of stop signs at intersections where authorized by Council resolution. Supporting information along with diagrams of the proposed stop sign location can be found in the attachments.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

Categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15301 - Class 1 Exemption.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The installation cost of the stop signs and pavement marking is estimated to be \$450 and would be funded through the existing roadway signage and striping budget funded by the Gas Tax.





#### **SUMMARY**

On February 3, 2023, the City issued a Request for Proposals (RFP #22/23-40028) for City Hall Slope Landscape and Irrigation Rehabilitation and Revegetation ("Project"). The City solicited proposals from qualified individuals and/or organizations to develop and implement a comprehensive landscape maintenance plan for the Project. The Project will include complete removal and replacement of the existing inoperable irrigation system, design, purchase and installation of all landscaping materials such as trees, shrubs, and plants, taking into account existing trees, shade canopy of trees, and pine needle debris from existing trees, and using drought tolerant and native species where possible. One proposal was received and was reviewed by City staff.

Based upon the evaluation of the sole proposal, and staff meeting with the firm to discuss costsaving measures, staff recommends that the City enter into a professional services agreement with Steven Smith Landscape, Inc. for the Project. Steven Smith Landscape, Inc. has been servicing the City of Santee parks and facilities landscape maintenance needs for over 16 years. With the City's past working relationship with Steven Smith Landscape, Inc. and Steven Smith Landscape, Inc.'s extensive experience with municipalities, staff has confidence in the plan and proposal submitted.

Staff recommends the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute a professional services agreement with Steven Smith Landscape, Inc., for the Project in an amount not to exceed \$78,911.00. The scope of services to be provided includes complete replacement of the currently non-functional irrigation system in an area over 17,000 square feet in size, planting of over 1,200 new plants of 10 different varieties, and 15 new trees.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Funding for this contract is provided in the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Community Services Department operating budget.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines section 15304 (Class 4 – Minor Alterations to Land), which applies to new gardening or landscaping, including the replacement of existing conventional landscaping with water efficient or fire resistant landscaping. Additionally, the Project is exempt pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (Class 1 – Existing Facilities), which consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, or

minor alteration of existing public structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use, including maintenance of existing landscaping. None of the exceptions to the categorical exemptions found in State CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 apply to the Project.

#### SUMMARY

This item requests City Council authorization to purchase an additional fourteen (14) structural firefighting coats and fifteen (15) pairs of structural firefighting pants (turnouts) from Municipal Emergency Services (MES). This purchase is necessary in order to outfit the Fire Department's two (2) new firefighter-paramedics with properly fitting gear and to replace existing turnouts that failed annual testing and cannot remain in service.

Santee Municipal Code Section 3.24.130 authorizes the City to buy directly from a vendor at a price established by a competitive or competitively negotiated bid by another public jurisdiction in substantial compliance with the formal purchasing procedures as provided in Section 3.24.100 even if the City has not joined with that public agency in a cooperative purchase. On January 1, 2018 the County of Los Angeles, California completed a competitive request for bids process for the procurement of firefighting personal protective apparel, and accessories that substantially complied with the formal purchasing procedures in Section 3.24.100. Based on evaluation criteria such as pricing, selection and variety of products offered, customer support and ability to meet the contract requirements, Municipal Emergency Services (MES) was awarded Contract #MA-IS-1840141-6 for an initial term of three (3) years with the option to extend the agreement for up to two (2) additional one-year extension periods, for a maximum total term of five (5) years. On December 9, 2021 the agreement was extended for an additional twenty-four (24) month period by mutual consent, extending the contract through December 8, 2023. Staff has evaluated the pricing, products and support provided by the contract and the purchasing agent has determined that utilization of Contract #MA-IS-1840141-6 for the purchase of turnouts to be in the City's best interest.

Santee Purchasing Ordinance requires City Council approval of all purchases exceeding \$25,000 in any single fiscal year. The department has already ordered five (5) sets of turnouts in the amount of \$14,971.11 this fiscal year. Staff recommends utilizing the County of Los Angeles, California Contract #MA-IS-1840141-6 for the purchase of fourteen (14) structural firefighting coats and fifteen (15) pairs of structural firefighting pants from MES for an amount not to exceed \$49,679.26. The total cost for structural firefighting clothing (turnouts) ordered during FY 22/23 will be an amount not to exceed \$64,650.37.





#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Adequate funding for the purchase of the additional fourteen (14) structural firefighting coats and fifteen (15) structural firefighting pants (turnouts) is included in the amended FY 22/23 Fire Department budget.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The purchase of structural firefighting coats and pants for the Fire and Life Safety Department does not have the potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, and is therefore not a "project" subject to the California Environmental Quality Act. (State CEQA Guidelines § 15378.)

#### SUMMARY

On February 7, 2023, the San Diego County Office of Emergency Services approved Santee's 2022 State Homeland Security Grant (SHSG) request in the amount of \$30,467.00 for the purchase of an off-road vehicle to assist in responding to emergencies that traditional fire engines without off-road capabilities cannot access. The SHSG funds will be utilized to place into service a new 2023 Polaris Ranger Crew XP 1 off-road vehicle with select add-ons, one of which will be a transport bed insert.

Santee Municipal Code 3.24.130 authorizes the City to join with other public jurisdictions in cooperative purchasing plans or programs as determined by the purchasing agent to be in the City's best interest. On December 22, 2020, Sourcewell, a State of Minnesota local government agency and service cooperative, of which the City is a member, completed a competitive request for proposals for Utility, Transport, Golf, and Recreation Vehicles with Related Accessories, Equipment, and Services. Based on evaluation criteria such as pricing, selection and variety of products offered. customer support and the ability to meet the contract requirements per procedures set forth in Santee Municipal Code 3.24.100, Polaris Sales Inc. was the awarded the contract (Contract #122220).

Santee's Purchasing Ordinance requires City Council approval of all purchases exceeding \$25,000. Staff recommends utilizing the Sourcewell Contract #122220 for the purchase of a Polaris off-road vehicle and select add-ons. A MEDLITE Transport Basic MTB-101 bed insert or equivalent will be purchased per informal bidding procedures set forth in Santee Municipal Code 3.24.110. The total purchase of the 2023 Polaris Ranger XP 1 off-road vehicle with select add-ons, including the Transport bed insert are not to exceed the SHSG award amount of \$30,467.00.

The Polaris off-road vehicle and select add-ons purchase will comply with the standard assurances for Cal OES Federal Non-Disaster Grant Program and the City of Santee Purchasing requirements.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT



2022 State Homeland Security Grant funds will reimburse the City \$30,467.00 toward the cost of a Polaris off-road vehicle with select add-ons. No funds are being requested from the current Fiscal Year 2022-23 Fire Department adopted budget for this purchase. The deadline for reimbursement of the \$30,467.00 is May 31, 2024.

**SUMMARY** This item is a request for a Major Revision (MJR2022-3) to Conditional Use Permit P86-02 to authorize a change in use of a private children's daycare facility serving infants through 12-year-old children to a public charter elementary school serving Transitional/Kindergarten (TK) through 8th grade students on property located at 9580 Carlton Hills Boulevard in the Office-Professional (OP) zone. Conditional Use Permit (CUP) P86-02 authorized the establishment of a daycare facility with up to 152 children and 14 staff members, with hours of operation during weekdays from 6:30am to 6:30pm. The daycare was approved in 1986 and operated as the La Petite Academy children's daycare until 2013, when it was converted, without proper City land use authorization, to a public charter elementary school. As a public charter school, the facility has oversight from the San Diego County Office of Education and as part of a recent evaluation of the facility's lease agreement and underlying CUP, the Office of Education requested that the charter school obtain the proper land use permit from the City. Approval of the subject Major Revision request would formally authorize the establishment of the existing charter school.

The existing facility consists of a 6,655 sq. ft. building with an outdoor play area to the west of the building. The charter school has up to 120 students and 11 staff members and the hours of operation are between 8am and 4pm Monday through Thursday. The existing parking area consists of 43 spaces. No changes are proposed to the building size or number of parking spaces provided with the proposed change in use. The subject Major Revision request would modify the hours of operation, number of children served, age range of the children, and total number of staff members. Operationally, the primary effect of modifying the facility from a daycare to an elementary school has been in the nature of drop-offs and pick-ups of children. With the daycare facility drop-offs and pick-ups were staggered throughout the day, while with the existing charter school drop-offs and pick-ups are concentrated to a period in the morning and a period in the afternoon. The charter school has a process in place to control student drop-offs and pick-ups to ensure no adverse traffic impacts to surrounding roadways and properties.

**ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW** This project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), pursuant to Section 15301(c), Existing Facilities, of the CEQA Guidelines, and no exceptions to the Class 1 exemption apply to the project.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT Staff costs for application processing are paid on an actual cost recovery basis. No Development Impact Fees are estimated.



#### **B. BACKGROUND**

On November 29, 2022, Bill Hofman, on behalf of Element Education Inc., submitted a request for a Major Revision to Conditional Use Permit P86-02 to officially change the allowed use at 9580 Carlton Hills Boulevard from a children's daycare facility serving infants through 12-year-old children to a TK-8<sup>th</sup> grade public charter elementary school use. The daycare was approved in 1986 and operated as the La Petite Academy children's daycare until 2013, when it was converted, without proper City land use authorization, to a public charter elementary school. As a public charter school, the facility has oversight from the San Diego County Office of Education and as part of a recent evaluation of the facility's lease agreement and underlying Conditional Use Permit, the Office of Education requested that the charter school obtain the proper land use permit from the City. The Office of Education properly determined that Conditional Use Permit P86-02 did not authorize the use of the existing facility as a public charter school. Approval of the subject Major Revision request would formally authorize the establishment of the existing charter school.

The project site consists of a 0.95-acre site at the southwest corner of Carlton Hills Boulevard and Mast Boulevard. The site is currently in use as a Community Montessori Charter Elementary School. The existing daycare consists of a 6,655 square-foot building with 43 on-site parking spaces. There is a fenced outdoor play area for the children located to the west of the building. The building has four classrooms, a kitchen, one main office, six bathrooms and three small rooms which can be used as offices.

#### C. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project consists of a change of use from a children's daycare facility to a TK-8th grade public charter school operated as a Community Montessori School by Element Education, Inc. Community Montessori currently serves approximately 750 students in grades TK-8 throughout San Diego County. As public charter schools permitted by the San Diego County Office of Education the schools are tuition free. The Santee charter school caps enrollment at 120 students and has a total of 11 staff members. The original Conditional Use Permit approval authorized up to 152 students and 14 staff members. As the grades of the charter school are up to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade, the age of the students are up to 13 years old. The teachers at the charter school are required to have California State Teaching Credentials. The remaining staff include the Regional Manager and Learning Assistants to assist with the classroom activities.

The current hours of operation for the charter school are from 8am to 4pm Monday through Thursday. All students are on a home study program on Fridays, with the school closed Friday through Sunday. Classes are in session between 9am and 3pm, with staff arriving at 8am and leaving at 4pm. The previous children's daycare operated between 6:30am and 6:30pm Mondays through Fridays with staggered pickups and drop-offs of children throughout the day, depending on the needs of the parents and whether the children were there part time or for full days.

#### D. ANALYSIS

<u>Compatibility with Adjacent Land Uses</u>: The project site is surrounded by a diverse mixture of existing land uses adjacent to the site including commercial uses and a church to the north (across Mast Boulevard), offices to the west, and single-family homes to the east (across Carlton Hills Boulevard) and south of the site. No changes to the building, play-area or on-site parking and circulation are proposed at this time. The existing 6'-high perimeter wall along the south of the property will remain in place as a buffer for the residents to the south.

Traffic, On-site Circulation, Parking and On-site Improvements: The current charter school operation includes a drop-off period from 8:15 am to 8:45 am. Parents either park and walk their children to the gate or drive through the lot during this drop-off period. Staff members conduct car line routing in the morning and require parents to enter the facility's parking area from Mast Boulevard and exit onto Carlton Hills Boulevard to control traffic movement through the facility. For afternoon pick-up, the period lasts from 2:40 pm until 3:00 pm. Parents either park and walk to collect their children from the teacher or they drive through the lot for pick up. Car line routing for traffic control is also conducted in the afternoon, with parents required to enter the facility's parking area from Mast Boulevard and exit onto Carlton Hills Boulevard. The Traffic Engineering Division has not received complaints about adverse traffic impacts from the existing charter school to surrounding roadways or properties, nor observed such issues.

The site currently has 43 parking spaces to accommodate staff members and parents. Parking requirements for daycare facilities are different than for elementary schools. In accordance with Section 13.24.040 of the Santee Municipal Code, daycare facilities are required to provide one parking space for each staff member, plus one for each five children, while elementary schools are required to provide two parking spaces per classroom. As such, the charter school is required to provide eight parking spaces since it consists of four classrooms. As the current facility currently contains 43 parking spaces, the existing charter school parking facility exceeds the minimum parking requirement. The existing 43 parking spaces at the site were based on the daycare use. The City's Traffic Engineer, Civil Engineer, Fire Department and Building Department have reviewed the plans and have requested project conditions of approval that have been included in the attached Resolution, including a request for street dedications, reconstruction of the trash enclosure to meet current standards, and an accessible path of travel. With these conditions of approval, the charter school will be in full compliance with City requirements.

#### E. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 pertaining to existing facilities projects, as projects which consist of the permitting of existing facilities involving no expansion of existing or former use are exempt from environmental review.

#### F. ESTIMATED FEES

No Development Impact Fees have been assessed as there is no proposed construction, but only a proposal for a change of use.



RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTEE, CALIFORNIA APPROVING MAJOR REVISION (MJR2022-3) TO CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT PP86-02 TO ALLOW A CHANGE IN USE OF A CHILDREN'S DAYCARE FACILITY TO A PUBLIC CHARTER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AT 9580 CARLTON HILLS BOULEVARD AND FINDING THE PROJECT EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PURSUANT TO SECTION 15301 OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES.

WHEREAS, on November 29, 2022 Bill Hofman of Hofman Planning Associates, on behalf of Element Education, Inc., submitted a complete application for a Major Revision (MR2022-3) to Conditional Use Permit P86-02 to change the use of an existing children's daycare facility to a charter elementary school serving TK-8<sup>th</sup> grade students at 9580 Carlton Hills Boulevard in the Office/Professional (OP) Zone, in the City of Santee, County of San Diego, State of California; and

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with Table 13.12.030A.C of the Santee Municipal Code, daycare facilities and public schools are permitted with a conditional use permit in the OP Zone; and

**WHEREAS,** Conditional Use Permit P86-02 authorized the development of a daycare facility on the subject site; and

**WHEREAS,** in accordance with Section 13.06.030 of the Santee Municipal Code, a revision or modification to an approved conditional use permit such as, but not limited to, change in conditions of approval, expansions, intensification, location, hours of operation, may be requested by an applicant; and

**WHEREAS,** Major Revision MR2022-3 represents the first such Major Revision to Conditional Use Permit P86-02; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Major Revision would not increase the residential density permitted by law, make changes to the General Plan Residential Land Use categories that would intensify use, make changes to the land use designation of any parcel in a manner that intensifies use, nor make changes to slope criteria, minimum parcel sizes, or lot averaging provisions of the General Plan that would permit increased density or intensity of use, and, therefore, is not subject to Measure N; and

WHEREAS, the subject project is exempt from environmental review per Section 15301, Class 1 (Existing Facilities) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines, as projects which consist of the permitting of existing facilities involving no expansion of existing or former use are exempt from environmental review and no exceptions to the Class 1 exemption apply to the project;

**WHEREAS,** MR2022-3 and the CEQA exemption for the subject project were scheduled for a public hearing on April 12, 2023, and notice of the public hearing was provided as required by law; and

WHEREAS, on April 12, 2023 the City Council held a duly advertised public hearing on Major Revision MR2022-3 and CEQA exemption for the subject project; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council considered the Staff Report, the CEQA exemption, all recommendations by staff, public testimony, and all other relevant information contained in the administrative record regarding MR2022-3.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Santee, California, after considering the evidence presented at the public hearing, as follows:

**SECTION 1**: The findings in accordance with Section 13.06.030 of the Santee Municipal Code for a Major Revision to a Conditional Use Permit are made as follows:

- A. Major Revision MR2022-3 would result in a similar project as that approved under Conditional Use Permit P86-02 with the size, height, and building footprint of the charter school substantially the same as the original approval. The modified hours and staff level for the charter school would remain substantially the same to the original approval. No changes are proposed for the building or site layout and circulation. The revised project would continue to meet the development standards of the OP zone including setbacks, lot coverage, height and parking requirements.
- B. That the proposed use is in accord with the General Plan, the objectives of the Zoning Ordinance, and the purposes of the district in which the site is located.

The proposed use, as conditioned, is in accord with the General Plan, the objectives of the Zoning Ordinance, and the purposes of the district in which the site is located as the project is for a TK-8<sup>th</sup> grade charter school conforming to the General Plan and Municipal Code requirements for the Office Professional (OP) zoning district. The project is consistent with the Office Professional (OP) designation/district as it provides educational services to the surrounding community.

The project is consistent with applicable Land Use Element (LUE), Housing Element (HE), Conservation Element (CE), and Community Enhancement Element (CEE) objectives. The project will contribute to the development goal of providing a wide range of services, including providing educational services to the surrounding community (LUE Objective 3.0).

C. That the proposed use, together with the conditions applicable thereto, will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, or materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.

The operation of the charter school for TK-8<sup>th</sup> grades is similar to the previously authorized daycare use and will not result in conditions detrimental to the public

health, safety, or welfare, or materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.

D. That the proposed use complies with each of the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance.

The proposed use, as conditioned, complies with each of the applicable provisions of the Development Code because all development standards are met including landscaping and building setbacks, the project design is consistent with the requirements of the Fire Code, and all proposed public and private improvements will meet City standards. Specifically:

- Architectural Design: There is no change in the project design. The existing daycare consists of a 6,655 square-foot building with 43 on-site parking spaces. There is an outdoor play area for the children located to the west of the building. The building has four classrooms, a kitchen, one main office, six bathrooms and three small rooms which can be used as offices.
- <u>Traffic and Circulation</u>: There is no significant change to on-site circulation or traffic as compared to the daycare use. The charter school currently has a process in place to control student drop-offs and pick-ups to ensure no adverse traffic impacts to surrounding roadways and properties.
- <u>Parking</u>: There are no changes to the parking lot proposed. The existing site currently has 43 parking spaces to accommodate the proposed 11 staff members and parents as needed, exceeding the minimum parking requirement for the elementary school facility of eight spaces.
- E. Development and redevelopment shall be comprehensively designed, entitled and developed whenever it is determined by the City that the permitting of incremental construction and uses may significantly inhibit or otherwise be detrimental to fulfilling the economic and development potential of the site.

Development of the site has been comprehensively designed for an educational facility, such as a charter school. The existing facility consists of a building with classrooms, an outdoor playground area, a parking area that adequately accommodates the parking needs of such a facility, and landscaping that enhances the aesthetics of the site. The charter school use will not significantly inhibit or otherwise be detrimental to fulfilling the economic and development potential of the site.

**SECTION 3:** Major Revision MR2022-3 to Conditional Use Permit P86-02 is hereby approved subject to the following conditions as amended below:

- A. Unless superseded herein, the conditions of approval set forth in Conditional Use Permit P86-02 shall remain in effect.
- B. All construction shall be in substantial conformance with the project plans dated November 29, 2022, as amended by this Resolution.

- C. The applicant shall comply with all applicable Sections of the Municipal Code, Land Development Manual and Public Works Standards of the City of Santee.
- D. Minor or Major Revisions to the Conditional Use Permit, such as changes to the building elevations, site design, and landscaping design, shall be approved by the Director of Planning and Building, unless, in the Director's judgment, a Minor or Major Revision should be reviewed by the City Council.
- E. The applicant shall comply with all of the requirements of the Fire Marshal.
- F. Upon establishment of the use pursuant to this Major Revision MR2022-3, the following conditions shall apply:
  - 1. This project is subject to requirements for persons with disabilities per California Building Code (CBC) Title 24, Part 2, Sections 11B, including accessible path of travel from the public right of way.
  - The site shall comply with full trash capture requirements by providing a completely enclosed trash and recycling enclosure. The trash enclosure shall consist of a solid roof, and gaps between walls and roof must be screened with openings no larger than 5mm. See the attached City of Santee Trash Enclosure Requirements.
  - The project should dedicate right of way along both Mast Boulevard and Carlton Hills Boulevard to meet General Plan standards for a Major Roadway of 51' from roadway centerline.
  - 4. The parking areas and driveways shall be well maintained.
  - 5. Missing or deteriorated landscaping shall be rehabilitated in accordance with Chapter 13.36 of the Santee Municipal Code and to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning and Building by December 31, 2023.
  - 6. All required landscaping shall be adequately watered and maintained in a healthy and thriving condition, free from weeds, trash, and debris.

**SECTION 4:** The terms and conditions of this Major Revision (MR2022-3) approval shall be binding upon the permittee and all persons, firms and corporations having an interest in the property subject to these permits and the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of each of them, including municipal corporations, public agencies and districts.

<u>SECTION 5:</u> In addition to all other available remedies, the City of Santee Municipal Code, Chapter 1.08, provides for the issuance of administrative citations for Municipal Code violations. Should non-compliance with said terms and conditions of this Conditional Use Permit or any violation of the Municipal Code that includes the City's Storm Water Ordinance, the City has the right to issue administrative citations containing an assessment of civil fines for each violation and collect administrative fines for violations.

**SECTION 6:** Pursuant to Government Code Section 66020, the 90-day approval period in which the applicant may protest the imposition of any fees, dedications, reservations, or exactions imposed pursuant to this approval, shall begin on April 12, 2023.

**SECTION 7**: The applicant shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Santee and its officers, employees and agents from any claim, action, or proceeding against the City and/or its officers, employees or agents to attack or set aside, void, or annul the approval of the City of Santee concerning this Resolution or any action relating to or arising out of its approval.

**SECTION 8:** This Major Revision (MR2022-3) approval shall expire on April 12, 2026 except where substantial use has commenced prior to its expiration. If use of the development has not commenced within the three-year period, said expiration date may be extended pursuant to a request for time extension received 60 days prior to the original expiration date. The City Council expressly grants to the Director of Planning and Building the authority to extend the expiration date of this approval pursuant to Section 13.04.090(B) of the Santee Municipal Code, when a request for an extension is filed 60 days prior to the original expiration date.

<u>SECTION 9:</u> The documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings on which these findings have been based are located with the City Clerk at the City of Santee City Clerk's office at 10601 Magnolia Avenue, Building #3, Santee, CA 92071.

DECISION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY
OF SANTEE ON THE APPLICATION OF
LA PETITE ACADEMY, INC. FOR A CHILDREN'S DAY CARE FACILITY
CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (P86-02)

GRANT, a Conditional Use Permit, pursuant to Section 17.06.030 of the Zoning Ordinance, for the development of a children's day care facility for 152 children and 14 Staff members.

The following conditions are imposed with the granting of this conditional use permit:

- A. Prior to obtaining any building permit pursuant to this development plan, the applicant shall:
  - 1. Obtain approval of TPM86-01 and record parcel map in accordance with said approval.
  - Submit a revised site plan for the approval of the Director of Planning and Community Development. The revised site plan shall show the following:
    - a. A notation that the proposed black vinyl chain link fence will be no higher than 4 feet.
    - b. The trash enclosure shall be a minimum six foot high solid masonry block wall with solid metal gates.
    - c. Bicycle parking area that is to be provided.
    - d. The location of proposed play equipment.
    - e. All ground mounted utility appurtenances such as transformers shall be shown and shall be located out of public view and adequately screened through the use of combination of concrete or masonry walls, berming and landscaping.
  - 3. Submit detailed and complete landscaping plans for the approval of the Director of Planning and Community Development. The landscape plans shall include:
    - a. A complete planting plan including the names, sizes, and locations and quantity of all plant materials, including trees, shrubs and ground cover.
    - b. A complete watering system including the location, size and type of all backflow prevention devices, pressure and nonpressure water lines, valves and sprinkler heads in those areas requiring a

permanent irrigation system. For areas of native or naturalizing plant material, the landscape plan shall show a method of irrigation adequate to assure establishment and growth of plant material through two growing seasons.

- c. A decorative block wall, six feet in height, shall be contiguous to the southern property line, beginning at the western property line and continue east to a point 10 feet from the eastern property line, to provide a buffer to the single family residences immediately south.
- d. A solid wood fence, six feet in height, shall be contiguous to the western property line.
- e. The proposed black vinyl chain link fence shall be screened through provision of vines and/or shrubs along its entire length.
- f. Street trees shall be provided and maintained by the property owner in the areas between the edge of the sidewalk and the property line. The size and type of trees shall be approved by the Director of Planning and Community Development and Public Works.
- g. All parking areas shall be screened from view from public streets pursuant to Section 17.24.030 Item 9 of the Santee Zoning Ordinance.
- 4. Submit revised elevations for approval of the Director of Planning and Community Development to include the following:
  - a. Additional architectural detailing such as wood trim or variations in the wall surface on the side elevations to reduce the massiveness of the extended walls at the project entrance and provide more interest to the blank walls.
  - b. All roof appurtenances, including air conditioners shall be noted and shall be architecturally integrated, shielded from view, and buffered from adjacent properties and streets.
- B. Prior to occupancy or use of the premises pursuant to the Conditional Use Permit, the following conditions shall apply:
  - 1. All landscaping and improvements shown on the approved plot plan, landscaping plan and improvement plans shall be installed.
  - Install fire hydrant(s) to the satisfaction of the Santee Fire Marshal.
  - All parking spaces, aisles, entrances, and exits shall be striped per City standards.
  - 4. Final clearance for occupancy shall be obtained by signature on the building permit, from Building Inspection, Planning, Public Works, and the City Fire Marshal.

- 5. The applicant shall submit to the Director of Planning and Community Development a copy of the day care license issued for the facility by the State of California Health and Welfare Agency Department of Social Services.
- C. Upon certification by the Director of Planning and Community Development for occupancy or establishment of use allowed by this Conditional Use Permit, the following conditions shall apply:
  - All light fixtures shall be designed and adjusted to reflect light downward, away from any road or street, and away from any adjoining premises, and shall otherwise conform to the Zoning Ordinance.
  - 2. The parking areas and driveways shall be well maintained.
  - 3. All work shall be in compliance with the Santee Grading Ordinance.
  - 4. The applicant shall comply with all applicable sections of the Municipal Code, Land Development Manual, Public Works Standards, General Plan, and the Zoning Ordinance.
  - 5. Approval of this request shall not waive compliance with all sections of the Zoning Ordinance, all other applicable City Ordinances, and applicable community plans in effect at the time of building permit issuance.
- D. Pursuant to Section 17.06.030.F of the Zoning Ordinance, the following findings in support of the granting of the Conditional Use Permit are made:
  - 1. The proposed use is consistent with the goals, objectives, and policies of the General Plan; and
  - 2. The facility has been designed to mitigate impacts to adjacent residential uses and will not result in adverse impacts to the surrounding neighborhood; and
  - 3. The project is in compliance with the Santee Zoning Ordinance.
- E. The terms and conditions of this Conditional Use Permit shall be binding upon the permittee and all persons, firms and corporations having an interest in the property subject to this permit and the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of each of them, including municipal corporations, public agencies and districts.
- F. The decision of the Planning Commission becomes final on the eleventh day following the date on this permit unless prior to that date any aggrieved party files a written appeal. Filing of an appeal will stay the decision of the Commission until a hearing on your application is held and action is taken by the City Council. The City Council will consider the matter and may affirm or reverse wholly or partly the action which is in question.

G. The approval of this becomes final at the close of business on May 30, 1986 at 5:00 p.m. unless prior to that date you or a protestant file an appeal in writing to the City Clerk within ten (10) calendar days of the date of the written decision. The appeal must be accompanied by a fee made payable to the City of Santee, if paid by check. No fee is required for appeal by a City Councilmember or other City officer or City body. Filing an appeal will stay the decision until the City Council holds a hearing on your application. The City Council will consider the matter and may affirm or reverse, wholly or partly, the action which is in question.

In the event this is not appealed to the City Council, this Conditional Use Permit expires on May 20, 1988, at 5:00 p.m. except where substantial construction has commenced prior to its expiration. If construction of the development has not commenced within the two year period, said period may be extended by the Planning Commission pursuant to a request for time extension received prior to the original expiration date.

#### SUMMARY

On January 25, 2023, the City Council adopted the San Diego River Corridor Ordinance ("Ordinance"), which establishes specific time, place, and manner restrictions on certain activities within the San Diego River Corridor (as defined in the Ordinance). The Ordinance is codified as Santee Municipal Code Section 7.20.100, and became effective on February 24, 2023.

This item provides an update on implementation of the Ordinance. As discussed in the attached Staff Report, the City is currently in the process of educating the public regarding the Ordinance and will begin enforcement on May 15, 2023.

## UPDATE ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SAN DIEGO RIVER CORRIDOR ORDINANCE AND FINDING THE ACTION IS NOT A PROJECT SUBJECT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

#### CITY COUNCIL MEETING April 12, 2023

#### A. BACKGROUND

On January 25, 2023, the City Council adopted the San Diego River Corridor Ordinance ("Ordinance"), which establishes specific time, place, and manner restrictions on certain activities within the San Diego River Corridor (as defined in the Ordinance). The Ordinance is codified as Santee Municipal Code Section 7.20.100, and became effective on February 24, 2023.

The Ordinance makes it unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to engage in the following activities (see SMC § 7.20.130):

- 1. Using a Competent Ignition Source (any source capable of kindling a fire)<sup>1</sup> to cause or intend to cause a fire within the Corridor. This includes arson, burning of debris or wire, campfires, cooking, or use of explosive or fireworks.
- 2. Camping or using camp paraphernalia in the Corridor while using or possessing a Competent Ignition Source.
- 3. Camping or using camp paraphernalia in the Corridor in a manner that obstructs or could obstruct the flow of water within the Corridor.
- 4. Camping or using camp paraphernalia in the Corridor in a manner that causes or threatens to cause a discharge of any pollutant or waste within the Corridor.
- 5. Camping or using camp paraphernalia in the Corridor in a manner that causes or threatens to cause damage to any threatened or endangered species or critical habitat.

#### B. IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The City and Sheriff's Department have begun outreach and education efforts and will continue these efforts through the remainder of April 2023. Enforcement will begin on

May 15, 2023.

#### **Education Period (March and April 2023)**

During this period, City staff will continue to work with the Sheriff's Department and third party agencies (such as PATH and East County Transitional Living Center) to inform the public of the new prohibitions imposed by the Ordinance. This public education effort will include walking the Corridor to distribute information about the Ordinance using flyers or other materials, distributing information about the Ordinance at City events, installing signs in the Corridor area with easy-to-understand symbols indicating the prohibited activities, and posting a press release regarding the Ordinance on the City's website and social media accounts.

A sample flyer and sample sign are attached to the Council Agenda Statement. Staff plans to begin installing signs on April 13, 2023. The proposed locations for the signs are indicated on the map attached to the Council Agenda Statement.

#### **Enforcement Period (Beginning on May 15, 2023)**

The City will begin enforcement on May 15, 2023. City Code Enforcement officers and Sheriff's Department personnel may issue citations for violations of the Ordinance. The citations and any accompanying reports and / or photographic evidence will be transmitted to prosecuting attorneys in the City Attorney's Office who will review the citations and determine whether to prosecute. Prosecution would likely result in a fine imposed on the violator, but could result in jail time.








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### San Diego River Corridor - Proposed Sign Locations

#### SUMMARY

Staff recommends the City Council award the construction contract for the Prospect Avenue and Mesa Road Intersection Improvements (CIP 2020-01) Project ("Project") to LC Paving and Sealing, Inc. in the amount of \$750,927.00. This Project will modify the intersection by reconstructing the northeast, southeast and southwest corners of the intersection to construct pedestrian crossing that increase visibility and reduce pedestrian crossing distances to improve safety. Additional improvements include storm drain improvements, storm water bio filtration basins and angled parking on Mesa Road to provide additional parking for Big Rock Park and the Mission Trails Regional Park users. The attached project map identifies the location of the proposed work.

In compliance with the City's purchasing ordinance, Santee Municipal Code Section 3.24.100, City staff administered a formal bid process on February 8, 2023. Then on March 16, 2023, the City Clerk publicly opened and examined eight sealed bids. Upon review of the submitted bids the low bid was submitted by Tri-Group Construction and Development, Inc. in the amount of \$649,785.00. On March 17, 2023 Tri-Group Construction and Development, Inc. notified the City that mathematical error had been made while preparing their bid and has requested to be relieved of their bid pursuant to Public Contract Code section 5100 et seq.

Staff has reviewed the request made by Tri-Group Construction and Development, Inc. and has determined that a mathematical error was made, their request for relief was timely, and has merit. Staff recommends City Council grant the request to withdraw the bid submitted by Tri-Group Construction and award to the second low bidder. The second low bid was submitted by LC Paving & Sealing, Inc. and has been determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder in the amount of \$750,927.00.

Staff also requests authorization for the City Manager or Director of Engineering/City Engineer to approve change orders in a total amount not to exceed \$75,092.00 (10% of the contract price) for unforeseen items and additional work associated with the Project.



#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

This action is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), pursuant to Section 15301(c), Existing Facilities, of the CEQA Guidelines.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT



#### SUMMARY

The Fiscal Year 2021-22 salary updates were added to the Salary Schedule but the Fiscal Year 2022-23 salary updates were inadvertently omitted and as a result, the salary updates were not implemented. In order to correct this oversight and properly compensate the Mayor and the Council Members, an updated Salary Schedule will need to be approved by resolution by the City Council.

Staff also requests an appropriation of \$1,920 from General Fund Reserves to the City Council Department budget. This appropriation will cover the salary correction.
