SUMMARY

National Small Business Week is an annual May event organized by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to recognize the achievements and contributions of small businesses across the nation. This year, **National Small Business Week** is being recognized from April 28 to May 4, 2024, with national recognitions, and a two-day virtual summit featuring federal resources and educational workshops for small businesses.

There are over 33.5 million small businesses nationwide that contribute to both the local and national economy. According to the SBA, it is estimated that more than half of employed Americans either own or work for a small business and they create about two out of every three new jobs in the U.S. each year.

The City of Santee honors and appreciates the perseverance, resilience and entrepreneurial spirit of our small businesses, which create jobs and strengthen our local economy.

James Sly, CEO of the East County Economic Development Council, will be accepting the City Proclamation for National Small Business Week on behalf of the East County Small Business Development Center (SBDC), which has provided significant assistance to small businesses in Santee and East County. The City will also be recognizing a Santee small business owner representing the local business community. ITEM TITLE APPROVAL OF READING BY TITLE ONLY AND WAIVER OF READING IN FULL OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS ON THE AGENDA

SUMMARY

This Item asks the City Council to waive the reading in full of all Ordinances on the Agenda (if any) and approve their reading by title only. The purpose of this Item is to help streamline the City Council meeting process, to avoid unnecessary delay and to allow more time for substantive discussion of Items on the agenda.

State law requires that all Ordinances be read in full either at the time of introduction or at the time of passage, unless a motion waiving further reading is adopted by a majority of the City Council. (Gov. Code, § 36934). This means that each word in each Ordinance would have to be read aloud unless such reading is waived. Such reading could substantially delay the meeting and limit the time available for discussion of substantive Items. Adoption of this waiver streamlines the procedure for adopting the Ordinances on tonight's Agenda (if any), because it allows the City Council to approve Ordinances by reading aloud only the title of the Ordinance instead of reading aloud every word of the Ordinance.

The procedures for adopting Resolutions are not as strict as the procedures for adopting Ordinances. For example, Resolutions do not require two readings for passage, need not be read in full or even by title, are effective immediately unless otherwise specified, do not need to be in any particular format unless expressly required, and, with the exception of fixing tax rates or revenue amounts, do not require publication. However, like Ordinances, all Resolutions require a recorded majority vote of the total membership of the City Council. (Gov. Code § 36936).

SUMMARY

This item recommends the award of the Traffic Signal and Communication Systems Maintenance Contract ("Contract") for FY 2024-25 to Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc. Santee is part of a four-city consortium which jointly bid the Contract for economy of scale savings. The cities of El Cajon, La Mesa, Lemon Grove, and Santee jointly prepared bid specifications for the Contract, as well as, related construction services and emergency repairs. The City of El Cajon was the lead agency.

A request for contract bids was publicly advertised in March 2024. The bids were opened on April 15, 2024. Southwest Traffic Signal Services, Inc. was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder with a total bid in the amount of \$473,740.40 for the four-city consortium. Based on Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc.'s bid, the City of Santee's portion of the four-city contractual work for traffic signals and communication system maintenance is estimated to be \$110,880.08 for FY 2024-25.

Staff recommends finding Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc. to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and awarding the contract in the amount of \$110,880.08 and authorizing the City Manager to sign the contract and up to four annual contract extensions, subject to the San Diego Area Consumer Price Index (CPI) increases up to 5%. Staff also requests authorization to allow the Director of Engineering to execute change orders up to \$11,088 (10%) for unforeseen emergency repair work for FY 2024-25 and each annual contract extension with CPI increases. Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc. is the current signal maintenance contractor for the City and has been performing satisfactorily.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This item is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15301 - Class 1 Exemption.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

This item is contingent on the approval of the FY 2024-25 Gas Tax Budget. The proposed FY 2024-25 Gas Tax Fund budget includes \$150,000.00 for the maintenance of traffic signals and communication systems, unforeseen emergency work such as traffic signal knockdowns, and replacement of traffic signal equipment. The contract and change order amounts are within the proposed budget.

WHEREAS, Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc. was the lowest responsible and responsive bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santee's portion of the four-city contractual work is estimated to be \$110,880.08 for FY 2024-25; and

WHEREAS, the contract for FY 2024-25 will begin on July 1, 2024 and end on June 30, 2025; and

WHEREAS, \$150,000.00 is included in the proposed FY 2024-25 Santee Gas Tax Fund budget for the contract work; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends awarding the contract to Southwest Traffic Signal Service, Inc., totaling \$110,880.08; and

WHEREAS, staff requests authorization for the Director of Engineering to execute change orders up to \$11,088.00 for unforeseen additional work that could include emergency and construction-related work involving signal knockdowns, equipment replacement, and rewiring; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Signal and Communications Systems Maintenance Contract may be extended on a year-to-year basis, not to exceed four additional years, upon mutual agreement between the City and the Contractor; and

WHEREAS, Staff requests authorization for the City Manager to sign up to four additional annual contract extensions and for the Director of Engineering to approve change orders with annual increases based on San Diego Area Consumer Price Index (CPI) percentage up to 5%; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that there will be sufficient Gas Tax funds in future budgets for the contract extensions; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic Signal and Communication Systems Maintenance Contract is categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to Section 15301- Class 1, of the Guidelines of the California Environmental Quality Act, which provides an exemption for repair, operation and maintenance of existing public structures.

SUMMARY

This is a City-initiated request in response to complaints regarding the parking of large vehicles for extended periods of time on Railroad Avenue between Mission Gorge Road and SR 52. Some of the vehicles identified have inhabitants resulting in litter and storm water violations. Residents desire restricting overnight parking to reduce the number of vehicles stored on the street for extended periods.

Per the California Vehicle Code Section 22507, a local authority may by resolution restrict parking of vehicles that are six feet or more in height during certain hours of the day.

Staff recommends installing "No Parking" signs that prohibit parking of vehicles over eight feet in height between the hours of 12 AM and 6 AM to discourage storage of large vehicles in the area, as shown on the attached map. Enforcement would be conducted by the City's Code Enforcement staff, and the Sheriff's Department.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15301 - Class 1 Exemption.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Staff estimates the total cost to purchase and install the "No Parking" signs will be \$3,000.00. Funding for the installation is included in the adopted fiscal year 2023-24 Gas Tax Fund operating budget.

In the past, the City has utilized Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds to perform upgrades and maintenance to the clock tower at the transit station in Trolley Square. These funds are from a legacy program and are limited to making improvements to and maintaining transit facilities. Past work included the replacement of the LED sign panels and maintenance of the clocks which serve the transit station.

The City currently has \$4,240 in TDA funds appropriated for the maintenance and upgrades to the clock tower. This item requests the appropriation of the remaining \$953 in legacy TDA funds for a total of \$5,193. The funds will be used to service the clocks and upgrade the lighting to LED on the clock tower.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This item is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15301 - Class 1 Exemption.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The remaining TDA funds of \$953 are available to be appropriated for transit related use. This project qualifies for this use.

SUMMARY

This item requests that the City Council authorize the appropriation of \$25,000 from the General Fund Reserves to the Planning Department Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Operating Budget for the preparation of a Water Supply Assessment by the Padre Dam Municipal Water District (Padre Dam) to support environmental work related to the Program Environmental Impact Report (EIR) under preparation for the Town Center Specific Plan Update.

On November 8, 2023, the City Council was presented the draft Town Center Specific Plan (project) along with a schedule for the preparation of the corresponding EIR. Significant progress has been made on the preparation of the EIR by the City's environmental consultant, Helix Environmental, Inc. Staff reviewed the first administrative draft received on March 11, 2024 and determined, through consultation with the City Attorney's Office, that a Water Supply Assessment (WSA) would be needed. As the project is located within the Padre Dam service area, the WSA would need to be prepared by Padre Dam. On March 18, 2024, the City made a formal agency-to-agency request to Padre Dam for preparation of a WSA in accordance with California Public Resources Code Section 15155 and Water Code Section 10910-10915 (Exhibit A).

In coordination with the Planning and Building Department and Padre Dam, on April 22, 2024, the City received a scope of work and fee from Padre Dam for preparation of a WSA (Exhibit B). The estimated cost to prepare the WSA is \$25,000. This amount would fund the Padre consultant costs and Padre Dam staff costs for the review, processing, and Board action. This is an unanticipated cost that was not budgeted with the scope of work for the project EIR. The WSA is a critical component of the EIR and for future water supply determinations in the City. The project schedule has been modified and is attached (Exhibit C). The requested appropriation per the attached resolution is for an amount not to exceed \$25,000. Because the total for the subject agency-to-agency contract is less than \$50,000, the City Manager is authorized to execute the contract under Santee Municipal Code Section 3.24.180(A)(3).

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This agreement is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it is not a "project" pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21065 and CEQA Guidelines Section 15378, as it involves an administrative activity of government without the potential of a significant impact on the environment.





FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Funding of \$25,000 for the Water Supply Assessment will be provided by the General Fund Reserves and appropriated to the Planning Department Fiscal Year 2023-24 Operating Budget.

Dear Mr. Clapp:

The City of Santee is preparing a comprehensive update to its Town Center Specific Plan (TCSP), including updates to the Arts and Entertainment Neighborhood, and development of concept plans for four strategic Housing Element sites (Figure 1). The update would allow development to occur in the TCSP area shown in Figure 1 per the projections provided in the tables included on the following page. Table 1 represents the complete buildout of the TCSP; the projections for the AEN (Table 2) and four Housing Element sites (Table 3) are sub-geographies fully contained within the TCSP area and Table 1 projections. These development potentials are consistent with adopted plans and zoning, including the recently approved Housing Element, approved in October 2022. However, we understand not all of this development may have been anticipated in the most recent Urban Water Management Plan.

Because the project is located within the Padre Dam Municipal Water District service area and the projected buildout may not have been previously considered by the District, we are requesting a Water Supply Assessment in accordance with California Public Resources Code Section 15155 and Water Code Section 10910 - 10915. Please include in your analysis a discussion of whether the recent applicable Urban Water Management Plan addresses the proposed project water use, availability of both the potable and recycled water supplies during normal, single dry, and multiple dry water years during a 20-year projection, and potential impacts of its use on water availability and reliability.

Staff is prepared to work with you to ensure you have the information necessary to complete the assessment in a timely manner. Currently, we anticipate releasing the public review draft EIR in June 2024, and the requested Water Supply Assessment should be included within the public review draft EIR. I received a scope and fee for the WSA from our consultant. Listed below is the main scope item regarding the WSA.

- Water Supply Assessment
 - California law requires water districts to prepare a SB 610 Water Supply Assessment (WSA) for large development projects of 500 or more dwelling units, or projects with equivalent water use. The WSA demonstrates that the agency has sufficient water supply to serve the development for the next 20 years during average year, dry year, and sequential dry-year scenarios.
 - HDR will prepare a WSA for the TCSP and submit it to the District for approval. The WSA will be prepared in conformance with the requirements of the SB 610 legislation and will rely on water supply reliability findings from the District and San Diego County Water Authority 2020 UWMP documents.
 - To complete the necessary WSA, the following tasks are proposed.
 - Review TCSP project components and calculate associated water demands using water unit factors from the District UWMP and/or 2020 Comprehensive Facility Master Plan
 - Review the City of Santee updated Housing Element, focusing on the TCSP area
 - Document changes in land use and housing density between the TCSP components, City of Santee Housing Element, and the District 2020 UWMP
 - Summarize potable and recycled water demands for the TCSP and identify associated demands anticipated within the District 2020 UWMP.
 - Summarize currently available water supply sources and potential water supply sources
 - Prepare water demand and supply reliability tables under normal, single dry, and multiple
 - dry water years over a 20-year projection in five year increments
 - Provide mitigation strategies to supply unanticipated demands, if necessary including appropriate and required statements regarding the limits of this report in terms of the committing the District to provide service to the proposed TCSP.
- Deliverables: Prepare and submit to the District a draft WSA in electronic pdf format. HDR will participate in one conference call or virtual meeting to review comments with the District. Based on District input and review comments, HDR will prepare and submit a final technical memorandum. HDR will also attend one District Board meeting for adoption of SB 610 WSA to address any questions that may arise. Respond to additional comments or concerns by the District staff or Board.

The total fee for the preparation is \$21,130 which will need to be paid prior to starting the work. Please review and let me know if there is anything that you want specifically added or deleted form the scope and I can review and revise as necessary.

On September 28, 2022, the City entered into an agreement with The Dog Haus Disc Golf Shop, LLC for Concession Services at Mast Park. Since opening, approximately \$28,000 in rent and revenue has been received by the City.

The Parties have agreed to amend the Agreement to change the Compensation formula, extend the Term of Agreement and add Additional Work as follows:

- Contractor will pay to the City, through June 30, 2025: \$400 monthly rent and 5% of total gross sales per month.
- An increase of 2%, from 5% to 7%, of gross sales will occur July 1, 2025, and will continue for the duration of the Agreement. As such, Contractor will pay to the City, From July 1, 2025, onward: \$400 monthly rent and 7% total gross sales per month.
- The City exercises its extension option of an additional five (5) years through June 30. • 2029.
- One additional extension option of an additional five (5) years is added to the Agreement, • which City can exercise by giving Contractor written notice by or before May 31, 2029.
- If Contractor desires to obtain all applicable state and local licenses, and Director of • Community Services approves, Contractor may sell alcoholic beverages in the park.
- As allowable by City's laws and policies, Contractor may apply to install and maintain, at • own expense, no more than three (3) light pole banners on preapproved light poles throughout park, with prior approval of design or concept by the Director of Community Services.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Although there may be a decrease in revenue with the new Compensation formula, staff believe the new formula will allow for long-term success and stability of the business and continued activation of the area of the park.

 - B. <u>COMPENSATION</u>: Exhibit 'B' of the Agreement is hereby amended to change the formula paid for services rendered by Contractor pursuant to the Agreement. The Schedule of Charges set forth in Exhibit "B" of the Agreement is hereby amended and replaced by Exhibit "B" Schedule of Charges (AMENDED), attached to this Amendment and incorporated into this Amendment by this reference.
 - C. <u>OPTION TO EXTEND</u>: The City hereby exercises its extension option pursuant to Section 4 of the Agreement, extending the Agreement for an additional five (5) years through June 30, 2029. Additionally, the Parties hereby grant City another option to extend the Agreement, in the City's sole discretion, for an additional five years, which City can exercise by giving Contractor written notice by or before May 31, 2029.

3. Except for the changes specifically set forth herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

EXHIBIT 'A'

SCOPE OF SERVICES (AMENDED)

The Contractor shall provide or perform the following:

- Contractor shall maintain agreed upon regular business hours and other hours as designated and agreed to with the Director of Community Services or designee ("Director"). Director will notify the Contractor a minimum of 48 hours in advance of special events. Contractor shall observe the park opening and closing hours, provided that Concession operations can be closed and staff departed up to one (1) hour after park closes. Contractor shall provide snack bar/concession services, including offering the popular and standard food and beverage items commonly affiliated with concession stands, as approved by the Director, at the concession building in Mast Park located between the dog park and the first hole of the disc golf course, during these business hours and shall diligently conduct business thereon to produce the best customer service that can be reasonably expected. Contractor shall also offer merchandise including disc golf accessories and equipment, dog accessories and equipment, miscellaneous outdoor recreational accessories and equipment.
- Contractor shall provide adequate staff and manage all concession operations.
- Contractor will not be allowed to park vehicles or trailers inside Mast Park, other than
 parking in the parking lot. However, Contractor will be allowed to temporarily park
 vehicles adjacent to the concessions building only to load and unload
 equipment/produce. Failure to comply with park rules may result in the termination
 of this Agreement.
- Contractor shall maintain the interior and exterior of the concession building and adjacent area in a safe, clean, and sanitary condition during the term of the Agreement. Contractor shall leave the concession building in as good a condition as when received.
- Contractor shall clean and remove all trash-to-trash containers at the concessions building each time Contractor uses the facility.
- Contractor shall provide security for concession area.
- Contractor shall provide the general cleaning of picnic tables adjacent to the concession building during business hours.
- Contractor shall obtain and maintain a current appropriate Health Permit from San Diego County Health Department. Contractor is responsible for payment of Health Permit as required for operation by the San Diego County Health Department. Contractor shall obtain and maintain all other permits and licenses required by law.
- Contractor shall provide all concession equipment to operate the facility per San Diego County Health Standards and provide snack bar/concession services, as approved by the Director.

- Contractor shall furnish at Contractor's own expense all furniture, fixtures and equipment needed for the operation of the concession. Contractor acknowledges that the building has electrical service, but no water or sewer connections.
- Contractor shall maintain all personal property belonging to Contractor in good condition during the term of this Agreement. Any personal property belonging to the City shall not be removed from the concession building by Contractor and shall be surrendered at the end of the term in good condition. Contractor agrees to remove all equipment and personal property belonging to the Contractor at the end of the term without causing damage to the concession building. Any damage to the concession building resulting from the removal of Contractor's personal property/equipment shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to fix at the Contactors expense.
- Contractor shall keep books and account of the concession operation in a method and form as approved by the Director. Said books and accounts must be open for inspection and audit by Director or Director's authorized agents.
- Contractor shall not permit signs or advertisements to be displayed outside the concession building without first obtaining in writing approval of the Director.
- Contractor shall not make changes in, or alterations, or additions to, or remove any portion, of the building, facility, etc. belonging to the City without first obtaining in writing approval of the Director.
- Contractor will be responsible for any damages whatsoever to City property as applicable when such property is the responsibility or in the custody of the Contractor or its employees.
 - Prior to beginning work at the Mast Park concession building, Contractor shall provide to Director documentation of a thorough background check satisfactory to Director for each adult employee assigned to the Mast Park concession. The background check must be performed by a qualified firm who is duly licensed to conduct criminal background checks. The background check will include all of the following:
 - An address history search for each employee for the last ten years; and
 - County Criminal Court records search for each employee who will be assigned to work under the Agreement and for each address in (1), above; and
 - US District Criminal Court records search for each employee who will be assigned to work under the Agreement and for each address listed in (1), above.
 - Contractor will assign only those employees who have successfully completed and passed a criminal background check to work under the Agreement. "Passing" shall be defined as employees or agents of Contractor who have not had convictions for any of the following:
 - A serious felony as defined in Section 1192.7(c) of the Penal Code.
 - A violent felony as defined in Section 667.5(c) of the Penal Code.

- Any crime substantially similar to those described above that occurred in another state or jurisdiction.
- Prior to starting any work, Contractor shall certify that it has completed the required background checks by providing the City a new or updated list of all authorized employees who have successfully completed and passed their criminal background checks per the terms of this Agreement. Only persons whose names appear on said certified authorization list will be allowed to perform any work or services on or about any City property or facilities.
- Contractor has been notified and acknowledges that the concession building is located within a FEMA-designated 100-year floodplain and is subject to inundation. Contractor shall hold City harmless in the event of flood damage to Contractor's personal property installed or stored in or adjacent to the concession building.
- Contractor has been notified and acknowledges that no vehicle, wheeled trailer, mobile kitchen or similar equipment shall be placed or positioned within 10 feet of concession building.
- Contractor shall maintain insurance against claims resulting from Contractor's use of electrical extension cords, including those covered by cable/cord protectors. Contractor shall not use extension cords to power fixed equipment (appliances, freezers, refrigerators, coolers, cash registers, etc.).
- Contractor shall not operate deep fat fryers or other grease producing equipment utilized indoors without a Commercial Stove Hood and integrated fire protection equipment.
- Contractor may only use gas, coal, charcoal, or similar portable cooking equipment with (1) prior written approval from the Director, (2) City of Santee Fire Department permit(s), and (3) San Diego County Health Department approval.
- Contractor shall also abide by the following:
 - No vending machines may be installed.
 - No tobacco, smoking or vaping materials may be sold or used/consumed in the park.
 - No alcoholic beverages may be sold or used/consumed in the park, unless and until all applicable state and local licenses are obtained by Contractor and Director of Community Services has approved.
 - Contractor shall abide by all applicable local and state laws and regulations relating to alcoholic beverages, including but not limited to Alcohol and Beverage Control (ABC) regulations and stipulations.
 - Alcohol content and price point to be approved by the Director of Community Services.
 - No signage is to be posted in or around the park. If and as allowable by City's laws and policies, Contractor may apply to install and maintain, at own

expense, no more than three (3) light pole banners on preapproved light poles throughout park, with prior approval of design or concept by the Director of Community Services.

- No styrofoam containers may be used.
- No items in glass containers may be sold.
- All condiments must be in plastic squeeze or pump containers
- Tournament requests are handled outside of this agreement and must be submitted on Park Event Permit application, no less than 30 days prior to requested date. Approval is on a case by case basis, fees to be determined based on impact.

SUMMARY

The purpose of this workshop is to provide Council with information and seek policy direction on potential revisions to the Santee Municipal Code ("SMC") in preparation for its annual update, tentatively scheduled for a first reading on May 22, 2024.

Topics for discussion include:

1. <u>Accessory structures</u>: Currently, accessory structures are not allowed to project within the required front and exterior side yard setbacks (SMC Section 13.10.050) At the September 13, 2023, City Council meeting, the City Council directed staff to conduct additional research and return with proposed changes to the SMC") to allow residential accessory structures in the front and exterior side yard setbacks.

This workshop allows for a discussion on potential changes to accessory structure development standards including, but not limited to, setbacks, building height, square footage, and materials.

2. <u>Privately owned walls within the public right-of-way</u>: This workshop will review the purposes and intended uses of a City right-of-way and current prohibition on the construction of retaining walls by private property owners within a right-of-way and seek confirmation or clarification of the current regulations (SMC Section 8.02.201).

Any potential proposed changes will be included in the first reading of the annual Municipal Code Update which is tentatively scheduled for May 22, 2024.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This item only seeks input for potential changes to the Santee Municipal Code without any action to enact such changes and, therefore, is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") as defined in Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines.

STAFF REPORT MUNICIPAL CODE POLICY WORKSHOP CITY COUNCIL MEETING May 8, 2024

A. **BACKGROUND**

At the September 13, 2023 City Council meeting, staff solicited discussion about potential changes to the Santee Municipal Code (SMC) related to front yard accessory structures. Currently, accessory structures are not allowed to project within the required front and exterior side yard setbacks. At this workshop, City Council directed staff to conduct additional research and return with potential changes to the SMC.

B. **OBJECTIVE**

This workshop will provide additional research on front yard accessory structures as well as solicit clarification about the SMC's prohibition on retaining walls within the public right-of-way. No action is proposed with this workshop. Any City Council directed changes will be included in the annual Municipal Code update tentatively scheduled for May 22, 2024. Notice of the workshop was posted on the City's website.

C. OVERVIEW OF EXISTING SANTEE REGULATIONS

Accessory Structures

SMC Section 13.10.050 Special Development Criteria

Pursuant to SMC Section 13.10.050A, detached accessory structures are prohibited in the front yard and exterior side yard setbacks and shall not be placed in front of the main structure. Except as otherwise permitted, front and exterior side yards shall be used only for landscaping, pedestrian walkways, driveways, or off-street parking (SMC 13.10.150H.1.) The purpose of setbacks requirements is to: 1) provide open space and privacy; 2) enhance traffic safety and visibility; 3) provide direct sunlight and ventilation; 4) provide access to and around structures; 5) enhance fire and life safety through adequate building separation; and 6) enhance neighborhood aesthetics by minimizing visual clutter. Accessory structures, as currently defined, include, but are not limited to, unenclosed patio covers, cabanas, garages, carports, and storage buildings.

Walls in the Right-of-Way SMC Section 8.02.201 Permit Restrictions

It is unlawful for any person to install walls, fences, retaining structures, slopes or other modification in the right-of-way, except for what is found on an existing approved building permit specific for that encroachment and/or an approved precise grading and/or plot plan.

However, per SMC 8.02.205 Permit Exemptions E., installation of decorative gravel, sand, rock, mulch, grass, artificial turf that is level with the sidewalk and/or does not exceed 2% slope is allowed.



D. POTENTIAL CHANGES TO SANTEE REGULATIONS

Discussion on allowing accessory structures in the front and exterior side yards, retaining walls in the public right-of-way and special events are summarized on the next page.

Accessory Structures

SMC Section 13.10.050 Special Development Criteria

Types of Structures:

Define permanent and temporary accessory structures: Consider what types of accessory structures could be allowed such as permanent front yard shade structures like patio covers, pergolas, gazebos, cabanas, arbors, and similar ornamental structures.

Discuss whether to allow carports and their relationship with the maximum paving requirement of 50 percent in the front yard.

Number of Structures:

Discuss setting a maximum number of allowed accessory structures to minimize visual clutter and maintain open space in the front yard.

Maximum Square Footage:

Discuss the maximum square footage of accessory structures.

Materials:

Discuss the materials for permanent accessory structures, their architectural compatibility and maintenance.

Height:

Discuss the maximum height for an accessory structure.

Rear and Exterior Yard Setbacks:

Discuss minimum setbacks to allow for open space, landscaping, and privacy in the rear and exterior side yards.

Location Considerations:

Discuss compliance with the Building and Fire Codes related to anchoring and building separation.

Walls in the Right-of-Way SMC Section 8.02.201 Permit Restrictions

Discussion related to the reservation of the Right-of-way for its intended uses including:

- Existing utilities
- Installation of new utilities (broadband / fiberoptic communications)
- Accessibility improvements (pedestrian ramps, sidewalk widening)
- Signage
- Utility pull box access and maintenance
- Fire hydrant access and maintenance
- Street Light access and maintenance
- Sight visibility cars and pedestrians

SUMMARY

The San Diego River Conservancy (SDRC) is an independent, non-regulatory state agency established to preserve, restore, and enhance the San Diego River Area. The San Diego River Conservancy's mission is accomplished by conserving land, and protecting or providing recreational opportunities, open space, wildlife species and habitat, wetlands, water quality, natural flood conveyance, historical, cultural, and tribal resources, and educational opportunities.

The City of Santee submitted two grant applications to the SDRC for consideration related to wildfire threat mitigation, equipment procurement, and training for fire personnel. The two grants were approved during the March 28, 2024, public meeting of the Governing Board of the SDRC. This item requests City Council accept and appropriate two SDRC grants to improve fire safety in the San Diego River area that runs through the City of Santee.

Grant SDRG-B21-17 is \$907,568 to assist with the grant match requirement for a FEMA Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP). The City of Santee applied for HMGP assistance in April 2022, to assist with clearing hazardous fuel loads across 415 acres in the wildland-urban interface in Santee. Fire reduction activities will include thinning out brush, reducing the amount of non-native vegetation and trees, and clearing debris in the San Diego River Watershed.

Grant SDRG-B23-11 is \$210,000 to purchase equipment for a Type 6 fire engine and firefighter personal protective equipment (PPE). The grant also will provide wildland firefighting training for all Santee Fire Department fire personnel. Equipment, PPE, and Training will be reimbursed up to the allocated amount.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

\$907,568 in SDRC grant funds will be appropriated in the FY 2024-2028 Capital Improvement Program as matching funds for a FEMA Hazardous Mitigation Grant; \$210,000 in SDRC grant funds will be appropriated in the FY 2023-2024 Fire Operating Budget to purchase equipment for a Type 6 Fire Engine, PPE, and wildland firefighting training for all Santee Fire Department personnel.

Special Provisions & Conditions Precedent

1. Term of Grant Agreement performance period is April 15, 2024, through April 24, 2026.

2. As precedent to the San Diego River Conservancy's (Conservancy) obligation to provide funding, upon completion of detailed Project design, plans and specifications, Grantee shall provide to the Conservancy for review and approval a scope of work, tasks, detailed budget, detailed site plan and planting palette demonstrating use of native vegetation and attached hereto as Exhibit A. Approval by Conservancy of such plans and specifications, or any other approvals provided for in this Grant Agreement, shall be for scope and quality of work and shall not relieve Grantee of the obligation to maintain the facilities, or carry out any other obligations required by this Grant Agreement, in accordance with applicable law or any other standards ordinarily applied to such work or activity.

3. The Board of the Grantee has adopted a resolution or provided letter designating positions whose incumbents are authorized to negotiate and execute this agreement and amendments to it on behalf of the Grantee.

4. On March 28, 2024, the Conservancy adopted Resolution 24-13. This Agreement is executed under that authorization.

5. Provide Acknowledgment of Grant Funding and Sign Requirements installation to the Conservancy for approval prior to commencement of work (see sections M and N).

General Conditions

A. Project Execution

1. Subject to the availability of Grant monies allocated by the Budget Act of 2023, the Conservancy hereby grants to the Grantee a sum of money (Grant Funds) not to exceed the amount approved by the Governing Board of the Conservancy and on the signature page in consideration of and on condition that the sum be expended in carrying out the purposes as set forth in the description of Project in this Agreement,

under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and its Exhibits, hereby incorporated by reference.

2. Grantee shall assume any obligation to furnish any additional funds that may be necessary to complete the Project.

3. Grantee shall complete the Project in accordance with the term of the Agreement, unless a written amendment has been formally granted by the Conservancy under the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Extensions may be requested in advance and will be considered in the event of circumstances beyond the control of the Grantee, but no later than 90 days before the end of the grant term

4. Grantee shall at all times ensure that Project complies with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code, Division 13, commencing with Section 21000, et. seq., California Code of Regulations Title 14, Section 15000 et. seq.) and all other environmental laws, including but not limited to obtaining all necessary permits, if applicable.

5. Project must comply with Labor Code Section 1771.5 regarding the payment of prevailing wages and the labor compliance program as outlined in the Labor Code Section 1771.5 (b).

6. Grantee certifies that the Project does and will continue to comply with all current local, state and federal laws and regulations which apply to the Project, including, but not limited to, legal requirements for construction contracts, building codes, environmental laws, health and safety codes, and disabled access laws. Grantee certifies that prior to commencement of construction, all applicable permits, right of entries and licenses will have been obtained.

7. Grantee shall permit site visits by the Conservancy to determine if Project work is in accordance with the approved Scope of Work, including a final inspection upon Project completion.

8. Prior to the commencement of any work, Grantee agrees to submit in writing to the Conservancy for prior approval any deviation from the original Scope of Work per Exhibit A. Changes in scope must continue to meet the need cited in the original application or they will not be approved. Any modification or alteration in the Project as set forth in the Application on file with the Conservancy must be submitted to the Conservancy for approval.

9. Grantee shall provide photographs of the site and the Project before, during and after implementation of Project with quarterly billing in the progress report and the final report. Grantee will provide spreadsheet with list of address locations or project site with each quarterly billing and in the final report.

B. Project Costs

1. The Conservancy may disburse to Grantee the Grant Funds as follows, but not to exceed in any event the amount set forth on the signature page of this Agreement:

a. On a reimbursement basis for project cost incurred withing the invoice period.

b. Remaining Grant Funds shall be paid up to the total amount of the Grant Funds on completion of the Project, receipt of a detailed summary of Project costs from the Grantee found to be satisfactory by the Conservancy, and the satisfactory completion of a site inspection by the Conservancy.

2. Payment & Documentation:

a. The Conservancy shall disburse funds for costs incurred to date, upon the Grantee's satisfactory progress on each Project task identified in the approved Scope. The Conservancy shall make the final disbursement and upon the Conservancy's acceptance of the Project.

b. The Conservancy will reimburse the Grantee for expenses upon receipt of a "Request for Disbursement" form. The Conservancy will reimburse travel and related expenses at actual costs not to exceed the rates provided in Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 3, Subchapter 1, Article 2 of the California Code of Regulations ("CCR"), except that reimbursement may be in excess of these rates upon documentation that these rates are not reasonably available to the Grantee. Reimbursement for the cost of operating a private vehicle shall not, under any circumstance, exceed the current mileage rate specified by the State of California.

c. The Grantee shall request disbursements by filing a fully executed "Request for Disbursement" form on or quarterly basis. The Grantee shall include in the form its name and address, the number of this agreement, the date of the submission, the amount of the invoice, the invoice period; cumulative expenditures to date, expenditures during the reporting period, and the unexpended balance of funds under the Grant Agreement (see Exhibit C). An authorized representative of the Grantee shall sign the form. Each form shall be accompanied by:

 A supporting progress report summarizing the current status of the Project, identify locations served and comparing it to the timeline and budget including written substantiation of completion for the portion of the Project for which the Grantee is requesting disbursement and copies of all invoices submitted by Grantee's subcontractors; and before and after photos. d. The Grantee's failure to fully execute and submit a Request for Disbursement form and invoice on a quarterly basis will relieve the Conservancy of its obligation to disburse funds to the Grantee unless and until the Grantee corrects all deficiencies.

All payment requests must be submitted using a completed Request for Disbursement form. Any penalties imposed on the Grantee by a contractor because of delays in payment will be paid by the Grantee and is not reimbursable under this Agreement.

3. Grant Funds in this award have a limited period in which they must be expended. All Grantee expenditures must occur prior to the end date of the period of performance.

4. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Grantee shall expend Grant Funds in the manner described in the Project Budget included in Exhibit A.

C. Project Administration

1. Grantee shall promptly submit written progress reports with each Request for Disbursement or as the Conservancy may request. In any event, Grantee shall provide Conservancy a final report showing all Project expenditures.

2. Grantee shall make Project site available for inspection upon request by the Conservancy.

3. Grantee shall submit all documentation for Project completion and final reimbursement within 90 days of Project completion.

4. This Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement in writing between Grantee and Conservancy. Any request by the Grantee for amendments must be in writing stating the amendment request and reason for the request. The Grantee shall make requests 30 days prior to end of grant term.

5. All notices, requests, and other communications required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given or served for all purposes if emailed, delivered personally or deposited in the United States mail by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses (or to such other addresses as either Party shall designate by notice in writing to the other Party in accordance herewith):

If to the Conservancy: Executive Officer 11769 Waterhill Road, Building 2 Lakeside, CA 92040

If to the Grantee: City of Santee 10601 Magnolia Avenue Santee, CA 92071 6. Grantee must report to the Conservancy all sources of other funds including matching funds and in-kind labor for the Project with its final Request for Disbursement and final report. The Conservancy will request an audit of any Project that does not fully comply with this provision.

D. Project Completion

1. The Grantee shall complete the Projects by the completion date provided in the "Term of Agreement" section, above. Upon completion of the Projects, the Grantee shall supply the Conservancy with evidence of completion by submitting:

a. The plan and any other work products specified in the work program for the Project, each in a format or formats (for example, paper, digital, photographic) approved by the Executive Officer.

b. A fully executed final "Request for Disbursement." The final disbursement form shall provide for cost accounting for all the tasks completed for the Project.

c. Within thirty days of the Grantee's submission of the above, the Conservancy shall determine whether the Grantee has satisfactorily completed the Project. If so, the Conservancy shall issue to the Grantee a letter of acceptance of the Project. The Project shall be deemed complete as of the date of the letter.

d. Final site inspection

E. Project Termination

1. If the Grantee fails to complete the Project in accordance with this Agreement, or fails to fulfill any other obligations of this Agreement prior to the termination date, the Grantee shall be liable for immediate repayment to the Conservancy of all amounts disbursed by the Conservancy under this Agreement (plus accrued interest) and attorneys' fees. The Conservancy may, at its sole discretion, consider extenuating circumstances and not require repayment for work partially completed. This paragraph shall not be deemed to limit any other remedies the Conservancy may have for breach of this Agreement.

2. If the Conservancy terminates prior to the completion date, the Grantee shall take all reasonable measures to prevent further costs to the Conservancy under this Agreement. The Conservancy shall be responsible for any reasonable and non-cancelable obligations incurred by the Grantee in the performance of the agreement prior to the date of the notice to terminate, but only up to the unpaid balance of funding authorized in this Agreement.

3. Failure by the Grantee to comply with the terms of this Agreement may be cause for suspension of all obligations of the Conservancy hereunder.

4. Failure of the Grantee to comply with the terms of this Agreement shall not be cause for the suspension of all obligations of the Conservancy hereunder if in the judgment of the Conservancy such failure was due to no fault of the Grantee. At the discretion of the Conservancy, any amount required to settle at minimum cost any irrevocable obligations properly incurred shall be eligible for reimbursement under this Agreement.

5. Final payment will not be made until the Project conforms substantially to this Agreement, as determined by the Conservancy.

F. Indemnification

1. To the extent permitted by law, Grantee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Conservancy, its officers, employees and agents ("Indemnified Persons") from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for any and all losses, claims, damages, liabilities, or expenses, of every conceivable kind, character, and nature whatsoever arising out of, resulting from, or in any way connected with (1) the Project or the conditions, occupancy, use, possession, conduct, or management of, work done in or about, or the planning, design, acquisition, installation, or construction, of the Project or any part thereof; (2) the carrying out of any of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement or any related document; (3) any violation of any applicable law, rule or regulation, any environmental law (including, without limitation, the Federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the California Hazardous Substance Account Act, the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, the Clean Air Act, the Toxic Substances Control Act, the Occupational Safety and Health Act, the Safe Drinking Water Act, the California Hazardous Waste Control Law, and California Water Code Section 13304, and any successors to said laws), rule or regulation or the release of any toxic substance on or near the Project; or (4) any untrue statement or alleged untrue statement of any material fact or omission or alleged omission to state a material fact necessary to make the statements required to be stated therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading with respect to any information provided by the Recipient for use in any disclosure document utilized in connection with any of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement, except those arising from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnified Persons.

2. Grantee must also provide for the defense and indemnification of the Indemnified Parties in any contractual provision extending indemnity to Grantee in any contract let for the performance of any work under this Agreement, and must cause the Indemnified Parties to be included within the scope of any provision for the indemnification and defense of Grantee in any contract or subcontract. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Grantee agrees to pay and discharge any judgment or award entered or made against Indemnified Persons with respect to any such claim or action, and any settlement, compromise or other voluntary resolution. The provisions of this section survive the term of this Agreement. Grantee agrees that in the event Conservancy is named as a party in any action arising out of this Agreement, the Grantee shall notify Conservancy of such fact and shall represent Conservancy in such legal action unless Conservancy undertakes to represent itself in such legal action in which event Grantee shall reimburse Conservancy for its reasonable litigation costs, expenses, and attorney's fees.

G. Financial Records

1. Grantee shall maintain satisfactory financial accounts, documents and records for the Project and to make them available to the Conservancy for auditing at reasonable times. Grantee shall also retain such financial accounts, documents and records for twenty (20) years after final payment and three (3) years following an audit.

2. Grantee and Conservancy agree that during regular office hours each of the parties hereto and their duly authorized representatives shall have the right to inspect and make copies of any books, records or reports of the other party pertaining to this Agreement or matters related thereto. Grantee shall maintain and make available for inspection by the Conservancy accurate records of all of its costs, disbursements and receipts with respect to its activities under this Agreement.

- 3. Grantee shall use any generally accepted accounting system.
- H. Proof of Insurance
 - 1. Insurance

Throughout the term of this contract, the Grantee shall procure and maintain insurance, as specified in this section, against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property that may arise from or in connection with any activities by the Contractor or its agents, representatives, employees, or subcontractors associated with the project undertaken pursuant to this contract.

a. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

i. Insurance Services Office ("ISO") Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001) or ISO Comprehensive General Liability form (1973) or comparable with Broad Form Comprehensive General Liability endorsement.

ii. Automobile Liability coverage - ISO Form Number CA 0001, Code 1 (any auto).

iii. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the Labor Code of the State of California. The policy must include an acceptable "Waiver of Right to Recover From Others Endorsement" naming the Conservancy as an additional insured.

b. Minimum Limits of Insurance. The Grantee shall maintain limits no less than:

i. General Liability: (Including operations, products and completed operations, as applicable) \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and broad form property damage and \$2,000,000 general aggregate limit. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the activities under this contract or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

ii. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

c. Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Executive Officer.

d. Required Provisions. Each insurance policy required by this section shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty days' prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the Conservancy. <u>The general liability and automobile</u> <u>liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:</u>

i. The State of California, its officers, agents and employees are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.

ii. For any claims related to this contract, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the State of California, its officers, agents and employees.

iii. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of section 2782 of the Civil Code.

e. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers admitted to transact business in the State of California and having a Best's rating of "B+" or better or, in the alternative, acceptable to the Conservancy and approved in writing by the Executive Officer.

f. Subcontractors. The Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall require each subcontractor to provide and maintain coverage consistent with the requirements of this section.

g. Claims Made. If errors-and-omissions coverage is written on a claimsmade form:

i. The "Retro Date" must be shown, and must be before the date of this contract or the beginning of work.

ii. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five years after completion of the work.

iii. If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a "Retro Date" prior to the effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five years after completion of the work under this contract.

iv. A copy of the claims reporting requirements must be submitted to the Executive Officer for review.

h. Verification of Coverage. The Contractor shall furnish the Conservancy with original certificates amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the Executive Officer before work commences. The Conservancy reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage, at any time.

i. Premiums and Assessments. The Conservancy is not responsible for premiums and assessments on any insurance policy.

I. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

J. Waiver

No term or provision hereof will be considered waived by either party, and no breach excused by either party, unless such waiver or consent is in writing and signed on behalf of the party against whom the waiver is asserted. No consent by either party to, or waiver of, a breach by either party, whether expressed or implied will constitute consent to, waiver of, or excuse of any other, different, or subsequent breach by either party.

K. Assignment

This Agreement is not assignable by the Grantee either in whole or in part unless approved in writing by the Conservancy.

L. Work Products

The Grantee shall include in any contract with a third party for work under this agreement terms that preserve the rights, interests, and obligations created by this section, and that identify the Conservancy as a third-party beneficiary of those provisions.

The Grantee shall not utilize the work produced under this agreement for any profit-making venture, or sell or grant rights to a third party for that purpose.

M. Acknowledgment of Grant Funding

Prior to beginning the Project, the Grantee shall submit a plan to the Executive Officer to acknowledge the Conservancy's support.

This plan must include:

- 2 press releases: once at the beginning and one upon completion of the project
- 24 social media postings during the agreement term, a minimum of 2 per month with photographs
- Acknowledging Conservancy funding when speaking with the media, volunteers, and the public about this Project
- Include a description of the Project on the Grantee's website acknowledging funding from the Conservancy.

This plan must be submitted and approved by the Conservancy before work begins.

N. Sign Requirements

The Grantee shall submit plans describing the number, design, placement and wording of the signs, or the specifications of a proposed, alternative method. The cost of the signs is an eligible cost. Temporary and permanent signage are required conditions under this agreement.

Sign Guidelines

- 1. During Project Implementation—A temporary sign acknowledging the funding source is required to be in place at the areas where work is performed.
- 2. Permanent signage—All grantees are required to post a sign at the project's completion. The sign must be available for the final inspection and be in place for a minimum of ten years from the date of completion. The grantee is responsible for replacing the sign if it is destroyed or removed prior to ten years after completion. The minimum sign size is 2' X 3', and the minimum size for the Conservancy or Grantee logo is 12" X 12".

Permanent Signs

All materials used shall be durable and resistant to the elements and graffiti. The California Department of Parks and Recreation and California Department of Transportation standards can be used as a guide for gauge of metal, quality of paints used, mounting specifications, etc.

- 3. Language for Signs. All signs will contain the following minimum language as seen on the panel below. The name of the director of the local public agency or other governing body may also be added. The sign may also include the names (and/or logos) of other partners, organizations, individuals, and elected representatives. These logos maximum size shall be 9" x 9".
- 4. Logo All signs must contain the San Diego River Conservancy logo. Contact the project manager for a copy of the logo. The logo must be mounted in an area to maximize visibility and durability. Each edge of the logo itself must be a minimum of 12" X 12" and include the following text:

Project Title/Description: (Insert project title) This project was funded through the San Diego River Conservancy GAVIN NEWSOM, GOVERNOR Wade Crowfoot, Secretary for Natural Resources

5. The Grantee shall submit proposed locations, size, number of signs and language for the Conservancy's approval prior to ordering signs. The Conservancy will withhold final disbursement until the permanent signs are installed.

O. Bonding

If the Grantee intends to use any contractors on any portion of the project to be funded under this agreement, construction shall not begin until each contractor has furnished a performance bond in favor of the grantee in the following amounts: for faithful performance, one hundred percent (100%) of the contract value; and for labor and materials, one hundred percent (100%) of the contract value. This requirement shall not apply to any contract for less than \$20,000.

Any bond furnished under this section shall be executed by an admitted corporate surety insurer licensed in the State of California.

P. Nondiscrimination

During the performance of this agreement, the Grantee and its contractors shall not unlawfully discriminate against, harass, or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, ethnic group identification, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, gender, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status (Government Code Section 12940). The Grantee and its contractors also shall not unlawfully deny a request for or take unlawful action against any individual because of the exercise of rights related to family-care leave (Government Code Sections 12945.1 and 12945.2). The Grantee and its contractors shall ensure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination, harassment and unlawful acts.

Consistent with Government Code Section 11135, the Grantee shall ensure that no one, on the basis of race, national origin, ethnic group identification, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation,

color, genetic information, or disability, is unlawfully denied full and equal access to the benefits of, or is unlawfully subjected to discrimination under, the work funded by the Conservancy under this agreement.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 12990, the Grantee and its contractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the applicable regulations (California Code of Regulations Title 2, Section 7285.0 et seq.). The regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission regarding Contractor Nondiscrimination and Compliance (Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations) are incorporated into this agreement by this reference.

The Grantee and its contractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement. This nondiscrimination clause shall be included in all contracts and subcontracts entered into to perform work provided for under this agreement.

Q. Independent Capacity

The Grantee, and the agents and employees of Grantee, in the performance of this agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the San Diego River Conservancy - State of California.

R. Assignment

Without the written consent of the Executive Officer, the Grantee may not assign this agreement in whole or in part.

S. Timeliness

Time is of the essence in this agreement.

T. Executive Officer's Designee

The Executive Officer may designate a Conservancy Project manager who shall have authority to act on behalf of the Executive Officer with respect to this agreement.

U. Amendment

As expressly provided in this agreement, no change in this agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties to the agreement. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated in this agreement shall be binding on any of the parties.

V. Locus

This agreement is deemed to be entered into in the County of San Diego. Any action arising out of this Agreement shall be filed and maintained in the Superior Court in and for the County of San Diego, California.

Exhibit A Scope of Work Santee Wildfire Equipment and Training

INTRODUCTION

The City of Santee (Santee) has grown since its incorporation in 1980 to feature major commercial centers and a business community and various recreational opportunities. The Fire Department was established in 1956 prior to the City's incorporation as a County Fire Protection District. Today, the Department serves a population of 60,000 and covers an area of 16.5 square miles with an expansive Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) area.

The Fire Department offers fire suppression and prevention services such as plan reviews, business inspections, public education, vegetation management, fire investigation, community programs, water supply, and pre-fire planning. The Fire Department protects a diverse community consisting of large residential development areas, commercial/retail centers, office buildings, industrial parks, open space, and conserved lands. The Department protects and manages several thousand acres in the WUI.

PROJECT SUMMARY

The Project aims to provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), firefighting equipment for a Type 6 Engine, and training for fire personnel on firefighting tactics and strategy. Santee plans to hire six new firefighters to fill current and future vacancies in 2024. Additionally, they will deploy a new Type 6 Engine that will significantly improve responses in Santee's Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) area.

By providing firefighting equipment to outfit the Type 6 Engine, PPE, and training for firefighters, the Fire Department will be able to enhance their response capabilities and improve personnel safety. The new hires will also receive regular training, which the Fire Department provides annually.

These funds will also be utilized to acquire fire hoses, nozzles, chainsaws, and other essential tools and equipment to aid the Fire Department in fire prevention and suppression activities.

The San Diego River area near Santee is challenging for the current fire apparatus to access due to low clearance and narrow trails. A fully manned and equipped Type 6 Fire Engine is a smaller vehicle that can reach areas larger fire engines are unable to access. The smaller fire engine will enhance response time and assist in extinguishing fires in the San Diego River region before they become established and cause significant harm to wildlife, native habitats, historical and archeological resources, human life, and property. By providing quick access to fires in the initial stages, the Type 6 Fire Engine can help reduce the fire size and the risk to homes and structures located in the WUI areas. Coupled with enhanced firefighter training, the Type 6 Fire Engine will help decrease the fire hazard for Santee residents who live and recreate along the San Diego River Trail and other outdoor facilities adjacent to the river.

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SAN DIEGO RIVER CONSERVANCY

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO GRANT \$210,000.00 FROM THE BUDGET ACT OF 2023 TO THE CITY OF SANTEE TO PROCURE ESSENTIAL EQUIPMENT TO OUTFIT A TYPE 6 FIRE ENGINE AND FIREFIGHTER PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE) AND TO PROVIDE WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING TRAINING FOR ALL SANTEE FIRE DEPARTMENT FIRE PERSONNEL

WHEREAS, the mission of the San Diego River Conservancy is to further the goals of its enabling legislation by conserving and restoring the lands and waters of the San Diego River watershed; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California has provided funds under the Budget Act of 2023 to fund programs and activities that advance climate resilience, natural and cultural resource protection, wildfire resilience, and community access projects; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego River Conservancy has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of this grant program, establishing necessary procedures and guidelines in accordance with statewide priorities and plans; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santee's Fire Department applied to the San Diego River Conservancy for a grant to procure essential equipment to outfit one Type 6 Fire Engine and firefighter PPE and also to provide wildland firefighting training for all fire personnel from the Santee's Fire Department, which is in the San Diego River watershed (Project); and

WHEREAS, San Diego River Conservancy staff recommends funding in the amount of \$210,000.00 to implement the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Project is consistent with the Conservancy's Strategic Plan, with Program 2 Support and Encourage Recreation and Education Program 3 Preserve and Restore Natural Resources and Program 6, Expand the Organization's Capacity and Public Outreach.

WHEREAS, the San Diego River Conservancy staff have reviewed the grant application, met with applicant and recommends the Project for approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the San Diego River Conservancy's Governing Board, based on the accompanying staff report and attached exhibits:

- 1. The proposed Project is consistent with the purposes and intent of the Budget Act of 2023.
- 2. The proposed authorization is consistent with the purposes and objectives of the San Diego River Conservancy Act (Public Resources Code, Sections 32630-32659.9).

- 3. The San Diego River Conservancy hereby authorizes the disbursement of up to \$210,000.00 (Two Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents) to implement the Project.
- Appoints the Executive Officer, or her designee, as an agent to execute all agreements, grants, sub-contracts, and other documents needed for the completion of the Project.
- 5. Prior to the disbursement of funds, the grantee shall submit for the review and written approval of the Executive Officer of the Conservancy a scope of work, budget, and schedule.

The Grantee, for and in consideration of the covenants, conditions, agreements, and stipulations of the Conservancy hereinafter expressed, does hereby agree as follows:

The San Diego River Conservancy ("Conservancy") acting pursuant to Division 22.9 of the California Public Resources Code, Sections 32630-32658, and its Resolution 24-18 approved on March 28, 2024, hereby grants to the City of Santee ("the Grantee") a sum not to exceed \$907,568.00 (Nine Hundred Seven Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars), subject to the terms and conditions of this grant agreement (Agreement).

The recipient of this grant shall use Conservancy's monies as matching funds for a FEMA Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program grant that, if approved, shall clear hazardous fuel loads across 415 acres in the wildland-urban interface in Santee. Fire reduction activities include thinning out brush, reducing the amount of non-native vegetation and trees, and clearing debris in the San Diego River watershed (Project). The Project must be carried out in accordance with the Scope of Work as outlined in Exhibit A.

Special Provisions & Conditions Precedent

1. Term of Grant Agreement performance period is upon the signature of both parties to this Agreement, through April 24, 2026.

2. As precedent to the San Diego River Conservancy's (Conservancy) obligation to provide funding, upon completion of detailed Project design, plans and specifications, Grantee shall provide to the Conservancy for review and approval a scope of work, tasks, detailed budget, detailed site plan and planting palette demonstrating use of native vegetation and attached hereto as Exhibit A. Approval by Conservancy of such plans and specifications, or any other approvals provided for in this Grant Agreement, shall be for scope and quality of work and shall not relieve Grantee of the obligation to maintain the facilities, or carry out any other obligations required by this Grant Agreement, in accordance with applicable law or any other standards ordinarily applied to such work or activity.

3. The Board of the Grantee has adopted a resolution or provided letter designating positions whose incumbents are authorized to negotiate and execute this agreement and amendments to it on behalf of the Grantee.

4. On March 28, 2024, the Conservancy adopted Resolution 24-18. This Agreement is executed under that authorization.

5. Provide Acknowledgment of Grant Funding and Sign Requirements installation to the Conservancy for approval prior to commencement of work (see sections M and N). **General Conditions**

A. Project Execution

1. Subject to the availability of Grant monies allocated by the Budget Act of 2023, the Conservancy hereby grants to the Grantee a sum of money (Grant Funds) not to exceed the amount approved by the Governing Board of the Conservancy and on the signature page in consideration of and on condition that the sum be expended in carrying out the purposes as set forth in the description of Project in this Agreement,

under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and its Exhibits, hereby incorporated by reference.

2. Grantee shall assume any obligation to furnish any additional funds that may be necessary to complete the Project.

3. Grantee shall complete the Project in accordance with the term of the Agreement, unless a written amendment has been formally granted by the Conservancy under the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Extensions may be requested in advance and will be considered in the event of circumstances beyond the control of the Grantee, but no later than 90 days before the end of the grant term.

4. Grantee shall at all times ensure that Project complies with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code, Division 13, commencing with Section 21000, et. seq., California Code of Regulations Title 14, Section 15000 et. seq.) and all other environmental laws, including but not limited to obtaining all necessary permits.

5. Project must comply with Labor Code Section 1771.5 regarding the payment of prevailing wages and the labor compliance program as outlined in the Labor Code Section 1771.5 (b).

6. Grantee certifies that the Project does and will continue to comply with all current local, state and federal laws and regulations which apply to the Project, including, but not limited to, legal requirements for construction contracts, building codes, environmental laws, health and safety codes, and disabled access laws. Grantee certifies that prior to commencement of construction, all applicable permits, right of entries and licenses will have been obtained.

7. Grantee shall permit site visits by the Conservancy to determine if Project work is in accordance with the approved Scope of Work, including a final inspection upon Project completion.

8. Prior to the commencement of any work, Grantee agrees to submit in writing to the Conservancy for prior approval any deviation from the original Scope of Work per Exhibit A. Changes in scope must continue to meet the need cited in the original application or they will not be approved.

9. Grantee shall provide photographs of the site and the Project before, during and after implementation of Project with quarterly billing in the progress report and the final report. Grantee will provide spreadsheet with list of address locations or project site with each quarterly billing and in the final report.

B. Project Costs

1. The Conservancy may disburse to Grantee the Grant Funds as follows, but not to exceed in any event the amount set forth on the signature page of this Agreement:

a. On a reimbursement basis for project cost incurred withing the invoice period.

b. No mark ups on direct expenditures or contractors invoices.

c. Remaining Grant Funds shall be paid up to the total amount of the Grant Funds on completion of the Project, receipt of a detailed summary of Project costs from the Grantee found to be satisfactory by the Conservancy, and the satisfactory completion of a site inspection by the Conservancy.

2. Payment & Documentation:

a. The Conservancy shall disburse funds for costs incurred to date, upon the Grantee's satisfactory progress on each Project task identified in the approved Scope. The Conservancy shall make the final disbursement and upon the Conservancy's acceptance of the Project.

b. The Conservancy will reimburse the Grantee for expenses upon receipt of a "Request for Disbursement" form. The Conservancy will reimburse travel and related expenses at actual costs not to exceed the rates provided in Title 2, Division 1, Chapter 3, Subchapter 1, Article 2 of the California Code of Regulations ("CCR"), except that reimbursement may be in excess of these rates upon documentation that these rates are not reasonably available to the Grantee. Reimbursement for the cost of operating a private vehicle shall not, under any circumstance, exceed the current mileage rate specified by the State of California.

c. The Grantee shall request disbursements by filing a fully executed "Request for Disbursement" form on or quarterly basis at minimum. The Grantee shall include in the form its name and address, the number of this agreement, the date of the submission, the amount of the invoice, the invoice period; cumulative expenditures to date, expenditures during the billinh period, and the unexpended balance of funds under the Grant Agreement (see Exhibit C). An authorized representative of the Grantee shall sign the form. Each form shall be accompanied by:

• A supporting progress report summarizing activities completed during the billing period, identify locations served, how many acres treated and compare it to the timeline and budget for which the Grantee is requesting disbursement and copies of all invoices submitted by Grantee's subcontractors; and before and after photos.

d. The Grantee's failure to fully execute and submit a Request for Disbursement form and invoice on a quarterly basis will relieve the Conservancy of its obligation to disburse funds to the Grantee unless and until the Grantee corrects all deficiencies.

3. Grant Funds in this award have a limited period in which they must be expended. All Grantee expenditures must occur prior to the end date of the period of performance.

4. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Grantee shall expend Grant Funds in the manner described in the Project Budget included in Exhibit A.

5. Any penalties imposed on the Grantee by a contractor because of delays in payment will be paid by the Grantee and is not reimbursable under this Agreement.

C. Project Administration

1. Grantee shall promptly submit written progress reports with each Request for Disbursement or as the Conservancy may request. In any event, Grantee shall provide Conservancy a final report showing all Project expenditures.

2. Grantee shall make Project site available for inspection upon request by the Conservancy.

3. Grantee shall submit all documentation for Project completion and final reimbursement within 90 days of Project completion.

4. This Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement in writing between Grantee and Conservancy. Any request by the Grantee for amendments must be in writing stating the amendment request and reason for the request. The Grantee shall make requests 30 days prior to end of grant term.

5. All notices, requests, and other communications required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given or served for all purposes if emailed, delivered personally or deposited in the United States mail by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses (or to such other addresses as either Party shall designate by notice in writing to the other Party in accordance herewith):

If to the Conservancy: Executive Officer 11769 Waterhill Road, Building 2 Lakeside, CA 92040

If to the Grantee: City of Santee 10601 Magnolia Avenue Santee, CA 92071 6. Grantee must provide a final report to the Conservancy showing all sources of other funds including matching funds and in-kind labor for the Project with its final Request for Disbursement. The final report shall include before and after photos of target work locations, total acres treated, discuss chanlenges faced and lessons learner. The Conservancy will request an audit of any Project that does not fully comply with this provision.

D. Project Completion

1. The Grantee shall complete the Projects by the completion date provided in the "Term of Agreement" section, above. Upon completion of the Projects, the Grantee shall supply the Conservancy with evidence of completion by submitting:

a. The plan and any other work products specified in the work program for the Project, each in a format or formats (for example, paper, digital, photographic) approved by the Executive Officer.

b. A fully executed final "Request for Disbursement." The final disbursement form shall provide for cost accounting for all the tasks completed for the Project.

c. Within thirty days of the Grantee's submission of the above, the Conservancy shall determine whether the Grantee has satisfactorily completed the Project. If so, the Conservancy shall issue to the Grantee a letter of acceptance of the Project. The Project shall be deemed complete as of the date of the letter.

d. Final site inspection

E. Project Termination

1. If the Grantee fails to complete the Project in accordance with this Agreement, or fails to fulfill any other obligations of this Agreement prior to the termination date, the Grantee shall be liable for immediate repayment to the Conservancy of all amounts disbursed by the Conservancy under this Agreement (plus accrued interest) and attorneys' fees. The Conservancy may, at its sole discretion, consider extenuating circumstances and not require repayment for work partially completed. This paragraph shall not be deemed to limit any other remedies the Conservancy may have for breach of this Agreement.

2. If the Conservancy terminates prior to the completion date, the Grantee shall take all reasonable measures to prevent further costs to the Conservancy under this Agreement. The Conservancy shall be responsible for any reasonable and non-cancelable obligations incurred by the Grantee in the performance of the agreement prior to the date of the notice to terminate, but only up to the unpaid balance of funding authorized in this Agreement.

3. Failure by the Grantee to comply with the terms of this Agreement may be cause for suspension of all obligations of the Conservancy hereunder.

4. Failure of the Grantee to comply with the terms of this Agreement shall not be cause for the suspension of all obligations of the Conservancy hereunder if in the judgment of the Conservancy such failure was due to no fault of the Grantee. At the discretion of the Conservancy, any amount required to settle at minimum cost any irrevocable obligations properly incurred shall be eligible for reimbursement under this Agreement.

5. Final payment will not be made until the Project conforms substantially to this Agreement, as determined by the Conservancy.

F. Indemnification

1. To the extent permitted by law, Grantee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Conservancy, its officers, employees and agents ("Indemnified Persons") from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorney's fees, or claims for any and all losses, claims, damages, liabilities, or expenses, of every conceivable kind, character, and nature whatsoever arising out of, resulting from, or in any way connected with (1) the Project or the conditions, occupancy, use, possession, conduct, or management of, work done in or about, or the planning, design, acquisition, installation, or construction, of the Project or any part thereof; (2) the carrying out of any of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement or any related document; (3) any violation of any applicable law, rule or regulation, any environmental law (including, without limitation, the Federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the California Hazardous Substance Account Act, the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, the Clean Air Act, the Toxic Substances Control Act, the Occupational Safety and Health Act, the Safe Drinking Water Act, the California Hazardous Waste Control Law, and California Water Code Section 13304, and any successors to said laws), rule or regulation or the release of any toxic substance on or near the Project; or (4) any untrue statement or alleged untrue statement of any material fact or omission or alleged omission to state a material fact necessary to make the statements required to be stated therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading with respect to any information provided by the Recipient for use in any disclosure document utilized in connection with any of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement, except those arising from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnified Persons.

2. Grantee must also provide for the defense and indemnification of the Indemnified Parties in any contractual provision extending indemnity to Grantee in any contract let for the performance of any work under this Agreement, and must cause the Indemnified Parties to be included within the scope of any provision for the indemnification and defense of Grantee in any contract or subcontract. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Grantee agrees to pay and discharge any judgment or award entered or made against Indemnified Persons with respect to any such claim or action, and any settlement, compromise or other voluntary resolution. The provisions of this section survive the term of this Agreement. Grantee agrees that in the event Conservancy is named as a party in any action arising out of this Agreement, the Grantee shall notify Conservancy of such fact and shall represent Conservancy in such legal action unless Conservancy undertakes to represent itself in such legal action in which event Grantee shall reimburse Conservancy for its reasonable litigation costs, expenses, and attorney's fees.

G. Financial Records

1. Grantee shall maintain satisfactory financial accounts, documents and records for the Project and to make them available to the Conservancy for auditing at reasonable times. Grantee shall also retain such financial accounts, documents and records for twenty (20) years after final payment and three (3) years following an audit.

2. Grantee and Conservancy agree that during regular office hours each of the parties hereto and their duly authorized representatives shall have the right to inspect and make copies of any books, records or reports of the other party pertaining to this Agreement or matters related thereto. Grantee shall maintain and make available for inspection by the Conservancy accurate records of all of its costs, disbursements and receipts with respect to its activities under this Agreement.

- 3. Grantee shall use any generally accepted accounting system.
- H. Proof of Insurance
 - 1. Insurance

Throughout the term of this contract, the Grantee shall procure and maintain insurance, as specified in this section, against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property that may arise from or in connection with any activities by the Contractor or its agents, representatives, employees, or subcontractors associated with the project undertaken pursuant to this contract.

a. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

i. Insurance Services Office ("ISO") Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001) or ISO Comprehensive General Liability form (1973) or comparable with Broad Form Comprehensive General Liability endorsement.

ii. Automobile Liability coverage - ISO Form Number CA 0001, Code 1 (any auto).

iii. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the Labor Code of the State of California. The policy must include an acceptable "Waiver of Right to Recover From Others Endorsement" naming the Conservancy as an additional insured.

b. Minimum Limits of Insurance. The Grantee shall maintain limits no less than:

i. General Liability: (Including operations, products and completed operations, as applicable) \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and broad form property damage and \$2,000,000 general aggregate limit. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to the activities under this contract or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

ii. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

c. Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Executive Officer.

d. Required Provisions. Each insurance policy required by this section shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty days' prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the Conservancy. <u>The general liability and automobile</u> <u>liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:</u>

i. The State of California, its officers, agents and employees are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations.

ii. For any claims related to this contract, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the State of California, its officers, agents and employees.

iii. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of section 2782 of the Civil Code.

e. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers admitted to transact business in the State of California and having a Best's rating of "B+" or better or, in the alternative, acceptable to the Conservancy and approved in writing by the Executive Officer.

f. Subcontractors. The Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall require each subcontractor to provide and maintain coverage consistent with the requirements of this section.

g. Claims Made. If errors-and-omissions coverage is written on a claimsmade form:

i. The "Retro Date" must be shown, and must be before the date of this contract or the beginning of work.

ii. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five years after completion of the work.

iii. If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a "Retro Date" prior to the effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five years after completion of the work under this contract.

iv. A copy of the claims reporting requirements must be submitted to the Executive Officer for review.

h. Verification of Coverage. The Contractor shall furnish the Conservancy with original certificates amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the Executive Officer before work commences. The Conservancy reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage, at any time.

i. Premiums and Assessments. The Conservancy is not responsible for premiums and assessments on any insurance policy.

I. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

J. Waiver

No term or provision hereof will be considered waived by either party, and no breach excused by either party, unless such waiver or consent is in writing and signed on behalf of the party against whom the waiver is asserted. No consent by either party to, or waiver of, a breach by either party, whether expressed or implied will constitute consent to, waiver of, or excuse of any other, different, or subsequent breach by either party.

K. Assignment

This Agreement is not assignable by the Grantee either in whole or in part unless approved in writing by the Conservancy.

L. Work Products

The Grantee shall include in any contract with a third party for work under this agreement terms that preserve the rights, interests, and obligations created by this section, and that identify the Conservancy as a third-party beneficiary of those provisions.

The Grantee shall not utilize the work produced under this agreement for any profit-making venture, or sell or grant rights to a third party for that purpose.

M. Acknowledgment of Grant Funding

Prior to beginning the Project, the Grantee shall submit a plan to the Executive Officer to acknowledge the Conservancy's support.

This plan must include:

- 2 press releases: once at the beginning and one upon completion of the project
- 24 social media postings during the agreement term, a minimum of 2 per month with photographs
- Acknowledging Conservancy funding when speaking with the media, volunteers, and the public about this Project
- Include a description of the Project on the Grantee's website acknowledging funding from the Conservancy.

This plan must be submitted and approved by the Conservancy before work begins.

N. Sign Requirements

The Grantee shall submit plans describing the number, design, placement and wording of the signs, or the specifications of a proposed, alternative method. The cost of the signs is an eligible cost. Temporary and permanent signage are required conditions under this agreement.

Sign Guidelines

- 1. During Project Implementation—At least one temporary sign acknowledging the funding source is required to be in place at the areas where work is performed.
- 2. Permanent signage—Grantees is required to post a sign at the project's completion. The sign must be available for the final inspection and be in place for a minimum of ten years from the date of completion. The grantee is responsible for replacing the sign if it is destroyed or removed prior to ten years after completion. The minimum sign size is 2' X 3', and the minimum size for the Conservancy or Grantee logo is 12" X 12".

Permanent Signs

All materials used shall be durable and resistant to the elements and graffiti. The California Department of Parks and Recreation and California Department of Transportation standards can be used as a guide for gauge of metal, quality of paints used, mounting specifications, etc.

- 3. Language for Signs. All signs will contain the following minimum language as seen on the panel below. The name of the director of the local public agency or other governing body may also be added. The sign may also include the names (and/or logos) of other partners, organizations, individuals, and elected representatives. These logos maximum size shall be 9" x 9".
- 4. Logo All signs must contain the San Diego River Conservancy logo. Contact the project manager for a copy of the logo. The logo must be mounted in an area to maximize visibility and durability. Each edge of the logo itself must be a minimum of 12" X 12" and include the following text:

Project Title/Description: (Insert project title) This project was funded through the San Diego River Conservancy GAVIN NEWSOM, GOVERNOR Wade Crowfoot, Secretary for Natural Resources

5. The Grantee shall submit proposed locations, size, number of signs and language for the Conservancy's approval prior to ordering signs. The Conservancy will withhold final disbursement until the permanent signs are installed.

O. Bonding

If the Grantee intends to use any contractors on any portion of the project to be funded under this agreement, construction shall not begin until each contractor has furnished a performance bond in favor of the grantee in the following amounts: for faithful performance, one hundred percent (100%) of the contract value; and for labor and materials, one hundred percent (100%) of the contract value. This requirement shall not apply to any contract for less than \$20,000.

Any bond furnished under this section shall be executed by an admitted corporate surety insurer licensed in the State of California.

P. Nondiscrimination

During the performance of this agreement, the Grantee and its contractors shall not unlawfully discriminate against, harass, or allow harassment against any employee or applicant for employment because of sex, race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, ethnic group identification, physical disability (including HIV and AIDS), mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, gender, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, age, sexual orientation, or military and veteran status (Government Code Section 12940). The Grantee and its contractors also shall not unlawfully deny a request for or take unlawful action against any individual because of the exercise of rights related to family-care leave (Government Code Sections 12945.1 and 12945.2). The Grantee and its contractors shall ensure that the evaluation and treatment of their employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination, harassment and unlawful acts.

Consistent with Government Code Section 11135, the Grantee shall ensure that no one, on the basis of race, national origin, ethnic group identification, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation,

color, genetic information, or disability, is unlawfully denied full and equal access to the benefits of, or is unlawfully subjected to discrimination under, the work funded by the Conservancy under this agreement.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 12990, the Grantee and its contractors shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code Section 12900 et seq.) and the applicable regulations (California Code of Regulations Title 2, Section 7285.0 et seq.). The regulations of the Fair Employment and Housing Commission regarding Contractor Nondiscrimination and Compliance (Chapter 5 of Division 4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations) are incorporated into this agreement by this reference.

The Grantee and its contractors shall give written notice of their obligations under this clause to labor organizations with which they have a collective bargaining or other agreement. This nondiscrimination clause shall be included in all contracts and subcontracts entered into to perform work provided for under this agreement.

Q. Independent Capacity

The Grantee, and the agents and employees of Grantee, in the performance of this agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the San Diego River Conservancy - State of California.

R. Assignment

Without the written consent of the Executive Officer, the Grantee may not assign this agreement in whole or in part.

S. Timeliness

Time is of the essence in this agreement.

T. Executive Officer's Designee

The Executive Officer may designate a Conservancy Project manager who shall have authority to act on behalf of the Executive Officer with respect to this agreement.

U. Amendment

As expressly provided in this agreement, no change in this agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties to the agreement. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated in this agreement shall be binding on any of the parties.

V. Locus

This agreement is deemed to be entered into in the County of San Diego. Any action arising out of this Agreement shall be filed and maintained in the Superior Court in and for the County of San Diego, California.

Exhibit A Scope of Work

INTRODUCTION

The Santee Fire Department (Fire Department) protects and manages several thousand acres of Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) land while offering fire suppression and prevention services.

The Project area has large quantities of invasive non-native plant species that have significantly increased the risk and severity of fire occurrence. All such hazardous vegetation put multiple homes, businesses, and critical infrastructure at severe risk of being damaged or destroyed because of wildfire. Several recent wildfires have resulted in the evacuation of hundreds of residents and caused significant fire damage to private property. For example, from September 2020 through December 2023, approximately 309 fires have occurred in the targeted work area and surrounding waterways.

PROJECT SUMMARY

The Project will reduce risk of wildfire across 415 acres within the fire prone WUI areas of Santee. Mitigation of fire threats will be achieved through the reduction of non-native, invasive fuels that exacerbate fire intensity in an area of high fire susceptibility.

The Grantee shall only use Conservancy's monies as matching funds for a FEMA Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program grant that, if approved, will clear hazardous fuel loads across 415 acres in the wildland-urban interface in Santee. Fire reduction activities include thinning out brush, reducing the amount of non-native vegetation and trees, and clearing debris in the San Diego River watershed

The City will establish three defensible Space Zones based on the distance from existing structures, and mitigation efforts will vary depending on the zone and individual vegetation, debris, and other types of combustible fuels located within those zones. "Zone 1" will have all combustible material removed within 30 feet of existing structures. "Zone 2" will have all non-native and dead vegetation removed as well as dead and dying branches removed from trees and shrubs. "Zone 3" will have all non-native and dead vegetation pruned horizontally and vertically to reduce potential fuel.

Project locations include the WUI from the western limits at Forester Creek to the Lakeside Boundary on the east at the fringe of habitable structures in the County of San Diego. Target locations include Mast Park West, Mast Park Wetland Restoration Area, Mast Park East Mission Creek, Walker Trails Open Space, and Walker Preserve.

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO GRANT UP TO \$907,568.00 FROM THE BUDGET ACT OF 2021 AND/OR 2023 TO THE CITY OF SANTEE TO REMOVE FLAMMABLE FUEL LOADS ACROSS 415 ACRES IN THE WILDLAND URBAN INTERFACE AREA INCLUDING BRUSH THINNING, REDUCTION OF NON-NATIVE VEGETATION AND TREES, AND DEBRIS REMOVAL IN THE SAN DIEGO RIVER WATERSHED

WHEREAS, the mission of the San Diego River Conservancy is to further the goals of its enabling legislation by conserving and restoring the lands and waters of the San Diego River watershed; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of California has provided funds under the Budget Act of 2023 to fund programs and activities that advance climate resilience, natural and cultural resource protection, wildfire resilience, and community access projects; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego River Conservancy has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of this grant program, establishing necessary procedures and guidelines in accordance with statewide priorities and plans; and

WHEREAS, City of Santee's Fire Department applied for grant funding to the San Diego River Conservancy in the amount of \$907,568, to remove flammable fuel loads within city boundaries across 415 acres in the Wildland Urban Interface area including brush thinning, reduction of non-native vegetation and trees, and debris removal in the San Diego River watershed (Project). The Conservancy funding will be used as matching funds for a larger grant applied for from California Governor's Office of Emergency Services for funding to implement a Fire Hazard Mitigation Project; and

WHEREAS, San Diego River Conservancy staff recommends funding up to the amount of \$907,568.00 to implement the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Project is consistent with the Conservancy's Strategic Plan, with Program 2 Support and Encourage Recreation and Education Program 3 Preserve and Restore Natural Resources and Program 6, Expand the Organization's Capacity and Public Outreach.

WHEREAS, the San Diego River Conservancy staff have reviewed the grant application, met with applicant and recommends the Project for approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the San Diego River Conservancy's Governing Board, based on the accompanying staff report and attached exhibits:

1. The proposed Project is consistent with the purposes and intent of the Budget Act of 2021 and/or 2023.

- The proposed authorization is consistent with the purposes and objectives of the San Diego River Conservancy Act (Public Resources Code, Sections 32630-32659.9).
- 3. The San Diego River Conservancy hereby authorizes the disbursement of up to \$210,000.00 (Two Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents) to implement the Project.
- 4. Appoints the Executive Officer, or her designee, as an agent to execute all agreements, grants, sub-contracts, and other documents needed for the completion of the Project.
- 5. Prior to the disbursement of funds, the grantee shall submit for the review and written approval of the Executive Officer of the Conservancy a scope of work, budget, and schedule.

SUMMARY

On April 28, 2017 the Governor signed Senate Bill 1 (SB1) known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017. SB1 increases per gallon fuel excise taxes; increases diesel fuel sales taxes and vehicle registration fees; and provides for inflationary adjustments to tax rates in future years, to address basic road maintenance, rehabilitation and critical safety needs on the state highway and local streets and road system.

Beginning November 1, 2017, the State Controller (Controller) began depositing SB1 revenues into the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). A percentage of RMRA funding is apportioned by formula to eligible cities and counties pursuant to Streets and Highways Code (SHC) Section 2032(h).

In order to receive RMRA funds local agencies must submit to the California Transportation Commission (CTC) a list of projects proposed to be funded by RMRA in the form of a City Council Resolution. SB1 includes accountability and governmental transparency provisions to inform the public of projects proposed for funding, and to report on status of projects each year.

This item requests City Council approval of the proposed project list within the Resolution to meet CTC reporting requirements. The proposed list includes the following five Capital Improvement Program projects: Bridge Restorations Citywide, Concrete Repair/Replacement Program, Pavement Repair and Rehabilitation Citywide, Crack Sealing Citywide, and Pavement Roadway Maintenance Citywide.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) would be required prior to construction authorization.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Funding for the Fiscal Year 2024-25 SB1 RMRA (Gas Tax) projects is included in the Proposed 2024-2028 Capital Improvement Program.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTEE, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 FUNDED BY SENATE BILL 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City, will receive an estimated \$1,518,650 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2024-25 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the 8th year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

WHEREAS, the City used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the community's priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate 70 streets/roads, 1 bridge, add active transportation infrastructure throughout the City this year and several similar projects into the future; and

WHEREAS, the 2021 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City streets and roads are in an at-risk condition and this

revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a good condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the City Council of the City of Santee, State of California, as follows:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2: The following list of newly proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with Fiscal Year 2024-25 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

A. Project Title: Pavement Repair and Rehabilitation 2024

Project Description: This project will fund the administration and construction to repair roads with asphalt overlays and reconstruction of the pavement section. It will also conduct adjacent repairs to curbs, gutters, sidewalks, pedestrian ramps, and associated drainage improvements.

Project Location: As identified in the City's Pavement Management Report dated April 2022 and Street List 'A' - Pavement Repair and Rehabilitation 2024, available for review on the City's website at www.cityofsanteeca.gov/government/engineering/helpful-resources.

Estimated Project Schedule: Start 01/2024 - Completion 02/2025 based on the components being funded with RMRA funds.

Estimated Project Useful Life: 15 to 20 Years.

B. Project Title: Pavement Roadway Maintenance 2024

Project Description: This project will fund the administration and construction to repair roads with slurry seals, cape seals and chip seals for City streets. It will also conduct adjacent repairs to curbs, gutters, sidewalks, pedestrian ramps, and associated drainage improvements.

Project Location: As identified in the City's Pavement Management Report dated April 2022 and Street List 'B' - Pavement Roadway Maintenance 2024, available for review on the City's website at www.cityofsanteeca.gov/government/engineering/helpful-resources.

Estimated Project Schedule: Start 01/2024 - Completion 02/2025 based on the components being funded with RMRA funds.

Estimated Project Useful Life: 10 to 15 Years.

C. Project Title: Citywide Crack Sealing Program 2024

Project Description: This project will fund the administration and construction to repair roads with crack sealing prior to asphalt overlays, reconstruction, slurry seals, and cape seals that will be performed by the Pavement Roadway Maintenance Citywide 2024 and Pavement Repair and Rehabilitation Citywide 2024 program projects.

Project Location: Various streets as identified on Street List 'A' - Pavement Repair and Rehabilitation 2024 and Street List 'B' - Pavement Roadway Maintenance 2024, available for review on the City's website at www.cityofsanteeca.gov/government/engineering/helpful-resources.

Estimated Project Schedule: Start 01/2024 - Completion 12/2024 based on the components being funded with RMRA funds.

Estimated Project Useful Life: 10 to 15 Years.
