ADDENDUM NO. 2

This Addendum No. 2 (3 pages in total) forms an essential part of the contract documents by revising the following:

2A CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

No changes.

2B SPECIFICATIONS

2B-1 Section 6-5 "Use of Improvements During Construction" Delete the last sentence and replace with the following:

The Contractor shall continue to maintain all insurance required pursuant to Section 5-4 "Liability Insurance" on the Project.

This change is to address Builders Risk Insurance for the contract and to clarify that it is not required for the contract.

3C DRAWINGS

No changes.

2D RFI RESPONSES

2D-1 Question:

Will the City revise the bid line items to include the cost of cleaning the storm drain structures?

Response:

The cost of cleaning the storm drain structures is to be included in the unit price bid for each inlet structure. See Specification Section 304.9.4.

2D-2 Question: Due to manufacturing lead times, it could take up to 8-10 weeks to receive the CPS devices after measurements have been confirmed. Measurements can take 1-2 weeks depending on deficiencies found with the curb inlet structures. Will the city count this lead time against the total allowable working days stated in the RFP?



Response: Lead time for CPS Devices and measurements were accounted for in the total working days in the contract. Unforeseen delays due to manufacturing outside of the Contractor control may be granted a non-compensable time extension to complete the work.

2D-3 Question: Will the city provide metered water for cleaning the catch basins at no additional cost to the contractor?

Response: No, the City of Santee is not a water and sewer agency. Water is provided by the Padre Dam Municipal Water District. All water is to be provided by the Contractor as stated in Section 2-5.2 of the contract documents.

2D-4 Question: Does the city require site-specific traffic control plans, or can the contractor perform traffic control using standard plans per the MUTCD WATCH manual?

Response: Traffic control plans using standard plans per the San Diego County Regional Standards or MUTCD are permitted when they are included on the City's approved traffic control title block per Section 601-2 of the contract documents. Site specific plans are only required when the required traffic control is not covered by a standard traffic control plan.

2D-5 Question: Does the city have shape files that can be shared with the contractor after the award of the contract?

Response: Yes

Question: Can the contractor receive approval from the city to perform work outside of the workdays 2D-6 and times noted in the RFP if it is deemed safer to do so with no additional fees?

Response: No. Contractor must complete work within the workdays and times noted in the contract documents.

2D-7 Question: Will the City waive the Builders Risk Insurance for this project?

Response: Builders Risk Insurance was not required in the contract documents for the Contractor to provide for the contract. The final sentence of Section 6-5 "Use of improvements During Construction" notes maintaining all in insurance including Builders Rick. Maintaining Builders Risk insurance can be disregarded as it is not required for the work and will be noted via addenda.

2D-8 Question: Will the city extend the bid due date so contractors can have time to adjust their proposals based on the answers provided?

Response: No. The information provided in this RFI response clarifies the requirements already stated in the contract documents.

2D-9 Question: Does the city require solid steel frames on the FTC and/or CPS devices (not perforated) for structural support?

Response: The stainless-steel frames and supports required shall be in accordance with the FTC/CPS manufacturers requirements to support the load of the installed device and captured materials.

2D-10 Question: Are there trash capture devices currently installed that the contractor would be required to remove prior to installing the FTC/CPS devices?

Response: No. The existing structures do not contain FTC/CPS Devices.

2D-11 Question: Can the city please provide the brand of CPS devices that are currently installed, if any?

Response: The specified CPS devices in Section 206-12.1 are currently installed at existing inlets across the City.

2D-12 Question: Does the city have any requirements for quick-release CPS devices (removable without tools)

Response. Yes and is stated in Section 206-12.1.

2D-13 Question: Does the city have any requirements for vector control lids (fully hinged lid or hinged viewing portal), when applicable?

Response: Fully hinged lids are required only for the devices specified in Section 201-6.

2D-14 Question: Can the City confirm when the last time the inlets were cleaned?

Response: City inlets are inspected and cleaned as required annually prior to the rainy season. Please note that accumulated material may vary each year.

2D-15 Question: Can the City provide the total weight of debris removed the last time the inlets were cleaned?

Response: The City does not have specific data on weight of debris removed from the inlets in the contract.

2D-16 Question: Will the city accept stainless steel troughs instead of fiberglass troughs for the FTC devices?

Response: Yes.

2D-17 Question: Will the city accept an equal or better brand of FTC/CPS device other than what is specified in the RFP if it is on the water board's approved list of full trash capture devices?

Response: Yes as long as the devices meet the material types, performance specifications and technical specifications of the specified devices in the contract documents.

Receipt of this addendum shall be acknowledged by attaching and/or indicating as such on the Information Required of Bidder to the submitted bid documents.
