This Consolidated Annual Performance & Evaluation Report (CAPER) is the second of five annual reports on progress made in relation to the City of Santee's 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan and covers Program Year 2021 (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022). This report addresses the city's use of Community Development Block Grant funds.

The City of Santee participates in the HOME Investment Partnerships Program through membership in the San Diego County HOME Consortium which includes six smaller cities and the County of San Diego. The County of San Diego administers the Consortium and reports annual HOME Program goals and accomplishments in the CAPER it prepares. The City of Santee does not receive ESG funds. Goals and accomplishments related to ESG-funded programs for the homeless or those at risk of homelessness are reported by the County of San Diego.

All entitlement funded Public Service activities in the Program Year were completed and expenditures drawn, with one exception. The Meals on Wheels activity only spent \$4,920 of their \$4,990 allocation which was due to the revised CDBG allocation announced by HUD in May 2021. Fair Housing activities were successfully completed and their related expenditures drawn for PY 2021.

Included as attachments to this CAPER are the Financial Summary Report (PR26), CDBG-CV Financial Summary Report (PR 26), Summary of Activities (PR03), Summary of Consolidated Plan Projects for Report (PR06), and Summary of Accomplishments (PR23).

The Program Year 2021 goals and accomplishments have been manually entered in CR05 Table 1 & 2 to correct for errors in the association of current year IDIS projects and activities with projects described in the Program Year 2021 Action Plan. The CR10 (Families Assisted) Table has also been manually entered to correct IDIS errors in the reporting of racial and ethnic status.

Assess how the jurisdiction's use of funds, particularly CDBG, addresses the priorities and specific objectives identified in the plan, giving special attention to the highest priority activities identified.

Pursuant to the PY 2021 Annual Action Plan, the City gives funding priority for those activities which address long-term solutions to identified community needs. Such solutions are focused at the root causes of inadequate basic life necessities, such as shelter, safety, or nutrition. Moreover, activities to be funded are selected based on their ability to address long-term solutions to needs in one or more of the following areas: supporting seniors, neighborhood revitalization, economic development, quality living environment, daily living essentials or improvements needed to meet ADA requirements. One of the City's CDBG projects, Street and Sidewalk Improvements on Buena Vista and Railroad Avenues, which was funded by a Section 108 Loan was paid off in Program Year 2021. This project revitalized the neighborhood it impacted, spurned economic development and improved ADA accessibility.

During Program Year 2021 the City provided funding to assist a number of special-needs populations including homeless families and individuals, the elderly, at-risk youth, and the disabled. Specifically,

CDBG funding provided support for activities addressing basic needs such as food for homeless and atrisk populations; programs for LMI youth, and fair housing assistance.

Securing adequate funding resources to sustain the City's housing and community development initiatives continued to be a priority objective for program administration. Given the reduction of funding sources that were anticipated at the start of the 2020-24 Consolidated Plan period, the City sought opportunities to leverage funding sources towards the completion of these projects.

Narrative

The City of Santee identifies priority needs and offers services and programs to eligible households regardless of race or ethnicity. Accordingly, the racial and ethnic makeup of persons assisted closely resembles the make-up of the city of Santee. According to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau Data, the city of Santee is 67.4% White (Non-Hispanic), 19.7% Hispanic, 4.9% Asian\Pacific Islander, 2.1% Black and 5.9% Other\Two or More Races. The City is proactive in encouraging participation in each project and activity. Advertisements occur in local circulations, public presentations, the City's website and social media, and through housing providers.

Narrative

Program Year 2021 funding, including new entitlement grant, program income and unspent prior-year funds, totaled \$307,989. The amount expended through June 30, 2022 was \$254,831. CDBG-CV funds allocated to the City of Santee totaling \$543,106, from the Coronavirus Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act have been provided to rapidly prepare, prevent and respond to the Coronavirus Pandemic. The total amount of CDBG-CV expenditures in Program Year 2021 was \$150,751. The total amount of CDBG-CV funds spent to date is 369,274.

Narrative

The City of Santee's Program Year 2021 projects funded by CDBG and CDBG-CV are offered on a city-wide basis and are not exclusive to any specific target areas.

Leveraging

Explain how federal funds leveraged additional resources (private, state and local funds), including a description of how matching requirements were satisfied, as well as how any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction that were used to address the needs identified in the plan.

The City of Santee seeks to leverage its CDBG funds with a variety of resources in order to maximize the effectiveness of available funds.

With regard to housing activities, the primary funding source for leveraging CDBG and HOME funds was historically Redevelopment Housing Set-Aside funds. Prior to the dissolution of redevelopment by the State of California in 2012, Redevelopment Housing Set-Aside funds were allocated to a variety of housing programs, including:

- Mobilehome Rental Assistance Program
- Mobilehome Rent Stabilization
- Mortgage Credit Certificate Program Administration
- Housing Preservation Loan Program

The loss of Redevelopment resources has required the termination of these housing-related activities. Currently, the city uses general fund resources to administer remaining loan portfolios and activities.

The subrecipient agencies also leverage CDBG funds against other sources including; government and other grants, program fees, donations and in-kind services. The leveraging of CDBG funds enables these agencies to accomplish much more than they otherwise could without the assistance.

Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The City of Santee's affordable housing objective historically has been to provide homeownership opportunities using HOME funds available through the County of San Diego HOME Consortium. Several years ago, the City received an annual allocation of HOME funds for affordable housing activities as a participant in the County's HOME Consortium. Under revised, more restrictive HUD regulations governing the use of HOME funds, the County of San Diego (County) now retains the entire HOME allocation awarded to the Consortium and awards funds on a first-come first served basis. In Calendar Year 2021, the County of San Diego assisted three homeowners with HOME funded First Time Homebuyer loans.

Regarding the rehabilitation of existing units, this goal has until recently been accomplished through the efforts of former subrecipient Lutheran Social Services - Caring Neighbors (Caring Neighbors) which provided minor home repairs for low-income senior and\or disabled homeowners through volunteer groups providing assistance. In Program Year 2020, Lutheran Social Service Caring Neighbors' Program Manager resignation combined with the inability to organize volunteer projects based on Coronavirus safety concerns, resulted in the suspension of this program. Additionally, Lutheran Social Services was not been able to re-establish the Caring Neighbors program in Program Year 2021.

The households supported through rental assistance were provided this assistance through CDBG-CV funded rental assistance. The reason this program exceeds the goal targets because it was expected that the program would run out of funds in Program Year 2020 but was extended due to competition with the County of San Diego's American Recovery Act Emergency Rental and Utility Assistance Program (ERAP) program for which Santee residents were eligible. The ERAP program which began on March 2, 2021 and ended on March 31, 2022 was well marketed, well-staffed, provided 100 percent of unpaid and future rent to landlords and tenants and provided more than six million dollars (\$6,339,716) of rental and utility assistance to 629 households in Santee. For this reason, the City of Santee's Rental Assistance programs have not had as much demand as anticipated before the programs started.

Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

The CAPER provides an opportunity for the city to evaluate the performance of its programs and services and to determine whether adjustments to future Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan goals are needed. The City looks to performance in a given year, and trends over time, to inform and calibrate future targets. The City of Santee has observed a trend toward smaller annual awards of CPD funding. Annual goals and outcomes will continue to be adjusted in recognition of reductions in available resources.

Specifically regarding the Caring Neighbors program, if this program is not able to start up again in the near future, we will need to seek out other providers in the area that are able to provide minor home repairs.

The City of Santee participates in the HOME Program through membership in the San Diego County HOME Consortium. The County of San Diego, as administrator of the consortium, reports on HOME Program accomplishments.

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The City of Santee participates in a regional approach to ending homelessness. The San Diego Regional Task Force on the Homeless (RTFH) coordinates program planning and implementation, including the allocation of funding for housing and services for homeless families and individuals. The RTFH and ESG entitlement communities are responsible for reporting and evaluating the performance of ESG program recipients and subrecipients.

The City of Santee maintains cooperative relationships with public agencies and nonprofit organizations, such as the San Diego County Sheriff's Department, East County Homeless Task Force, Crisis House and Santee Food Bank to promote outreach and assistance to homeless persons and individuals at risk of homelessness.

Additionally, during the Program Year the City of Santee funded Crisis House a homeless services provider headquartered in the City of Santee. The \$6,660 in CDBG funding assisted families, abused youth, seniors and veterans experiencing homelessness and persons escaping domestic violence with housing and wrap-around services. Additionally, Crisis House's East County Housing Connections (ECHC) program directly addresses the needs of those experiencing chronic homelessness. The ECHC employs a housing navigator and mobile outreach team to connect with and meet the immediate needs of unsheltered homeless people on the street in need of service. During the Program Year, Crisis House provided services to 388 homeless persons.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The City of Santee supports and participates in regional efforts related to the coordination of public funding allocated to emergency shelters and services for the homeless. The City of Santee also allocated CDBG funding to Crisis House, which provides and/or refers homeless persons to services, emergency shelter and transitional housing opportunities.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

As previously stated, the City of Santee provides funding to Crisis House, which operates a homeless prevention and intervention program. Crisis House also provides employment counseling, health screenings, and addresses emergency needs of homeless residents. The City's contract with the CSA San Diego County for fair housing services assists those at risk of becoming homeless by improving tenant/landlord relationships, reducing evictions, and assisting households in finding adequate housing. The City provides funding to the Santee Food Bank which provides nutritional assistance to at-risk individuals as well as referrals.

During the Program Year, CDBG-CV funding was provided for rental assistance programs to help families at-risk of becoming homeless due to the coronavirus pandemic. This funding assisted 39 persons during the Program Year including 37 extremely low income and 2 low income households.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again.

The City of Santee actively supports a regional approach to ending homelessness. The San Diego Regional Task Force on the Homeless coordinates efforts to assist chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth in their transition to permanent housing and independent living.

In addition, the City of Santee provided Program Year 2021 funding to Crisis House, which provides employment counseling, health screenings, and addresses emergency needs of homeless residents. The City provides funding to the Santee Food Bank which provides nutritional assistance to at-risk individuals as well as referrals.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The City of Santee is not a provider of public housing. The City of Santee does not administer Housing Choice Voucher (Section 8) funds or properties.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

There are no public housing communities located within the jurisdiction of the city of Santee.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

There are no public housing communities located within the jurisdiction of the city of Santee.

CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

The major obstacle to meeting underserved housing and community development needs in the City of Santee is a lack of sufficient resources to address all of the needs that exist. To supplement federal CDBG and HOME funds, the city has used City of Santee General Funds and other eligible funds to support a variety of public services and facilities benefitting low and moderate-income households.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The primary obstacle to meeting all of the identified needs, including those identified as priorities, is the general deficiency of funding resources available to the public and private agencies that serve the needs of low- and moderate-income residents. The elimination of redevelopment agencies significantly impacted the city's efforts to maintain infrastructure, expand housing and promote economic development. There has been a great deal of federal funding available during the first two years of the Coronavirus Pandemic which has helped to address the community's Pandemic related needs. For example, during the program year 623 Santee households were awarded \$5,269,262 in Coronavirus response rental assistance through the County of San Diego's Federally funded Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP). However, entitlement grants have leveled off over recent years, further stretching funds available to provide increasing needs for services and meet the City's needs. Santee will seek to remedy obstacles by exploring alternative funding vehicles, leveraging resource investments to the maximum feasible degree and exploring new sources of municipal revenue generation.

One action the City of Santee has taken recently to increase the availability of affordable housing is, effective September 2019, to waive Development Impact Fees for the construction of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) for a five-year period ending September 2024. ADUs can provide needed affordable housing for residents of Santee and can also meet the need for multi-generational housing. The City has already experienced that by waiving the Development Impact Fees, which are currently about \$22,000 per unit, the construction of additional ADUs in Santee has accelerated. Approximately 38 ADUs have been permitted in Santee since the waiving of Development Impact Fees.

Supported by CDBG funding allocated by the City of Santee, Crisis House provides supportive housing for victims of domestic violence and others at risk of homelessness. These special needs non-homeless persons/families receive case management services, outreach and financial assistance in order to maintain live in the community in a safe environment.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City of Santee requires that all federally-funded projects be tested for lead-based paint and abate

hazards as needed. Lead-based paint warnings are distributed with applications for property related assistance. All applicants are required to sign and return the lead-based paint warning to verify that they have read its contents and are aware of the dangers lead-based paint presents. Factors such as housing age and condition and the age of household members are taken into consideration when determining lead-based paint danger. Additionally, as part of the City's CDBG-CV funded emergency rental assistance programs, lead based paint inspections occurred at three properties that were constructed prior to 1972.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

According to United States Census Bureau data the percentage of persons in Santee in poverty is 7.3 percent which is less than the national average of 10.5 percent. To help ameliorate this, the City works with local economic development organizations to reduce unemployment and expand business opportunities. The City assists local businesses to retain and expand their workforce and works to attract and nurture startup firms and entrepreneurs with a high potential for expansion and job creation. The City also seeks to attract major employers to the community such as the Sharp Rees-Stealy Medical Center that opened during the Fall of 2020 and employs hundreds of persons in the medical profession.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Due to financial constraints, the City of Santee is limited in its ability to meet all of the housing and community development needs of lower and moderate-income households. However, the city continues to work to combine city resources with private industry and non-profit agency resources to meet as much of the need as financially feasible. The City will strengthen, coordinate, and integrate the governmental institutions, non-profit and private delivery systems outlined in this Consolidated Plan through on-going interaction between city staff, private developers, non-profit organizations, financial institutions, and various service providers as a means to develop better institutional structure to serve the community's needs. Additionally, through subrecipient monitoring and ongoing communications with subrecipients, City staff is able to identify and assist with the development of subrecipient institutional structure.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

In Program Year 2021, the City maintained dialog with non-profit social service organizations and government agencies that serve low and moderate-income persons. The City worked to enhance and improve the organizational capacity and foster a collective planning process of social services agencies. Through its support and collaboration with Crisis House, the city continued to participate in and support both the East County Homeless Task Force and the San Diego Regional Task Force on the Homeless (Continuum of Care) in order to enhance and implement strategies for addressing homelessness in the region. Although there are coordinated programs and services to address the needs of lower income households and the homeless, it is recognized that many unmet needs remain.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdiction's analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

The City of Santee is committed to furthering the fair housing goals described in the 2020 San Diego County Regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI). The AI identifies various land use policies, zoning provisions, and development regulations may affect the range of housing choice available which are considered to be impediments. The list below includes the "impediments" identified in the 2020-24 AI which are applicable to multiple jurisdictions, including Santee and the City's actions to address these impediments.

Density Bonus Law: Due to frequent modifications to State Density Bonus Law, in June 2019 the Santee City Council revised the Density Bonus Chapter of the City's Zoning Ordinance (Chapter 13.26) with language that the City would apply the latest provisions of the State Density Bonus law as set forth in Sections 65915 through 65918 of the California Government Code. Additionally, the City of Santee has recently created a density bonus application to facilitate density bonus housing projects.

Accessory Dwelling Units: To comply with recent changes of State law regarding Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU), the City of Santee's Zoning Ordinance was amended in January 2020 and again in December 2021 to update the ADU provisions to be consistent with State law. Additionally, in 2021 the City's ADU Ordinance was amended to increase the maximum size of an ADU to 1,200 square feet and to remove the two-bedroom limit. These revisions to the ADU Ordinance are expected to accelerate the development of additional ADUs.

Transitional and Supportive Housing: The City of Santee's Zoning Ordinance was amended in January 2013 to add Section 13.10.030.F.10 to allow Transitional and Supportive Housing in all residential zones, including multi-family zones, as a by-right use pursuant to California Government Code Section 65583(a)(5). The City has currently not established a mixed-use zone and therefore, has not needed to update the Zoning Ordinance pursuant to California Assembly Bill 139.

Farmworker Housing/Employee Housing: Section 13.10.03.F of Santee's Zoning Ordinance was updated as part of a comprehensive update of the Zoning Ordinance in 2017 to allow farm worker (agricultural employee) housing in residential zones. A definition was also added to the Santee Municipal Code for "Agricultural Employee Housing."

Finally, the City actively participates in an alliance of jurisdictions (San Diego Regional Alliance for Fair Housing) working to advance fair housing and eliminate regional impediments to fair housing as identified in the 2020-2024 Al.

CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements

In Program Year 2021, Department of Development Services staff monitored CDBG Subrecipient contracts and programs to ensure compliance with all federal regulatory requirements for projects and activities accomplished or undertaken during the program year.

The City's CDBG program monitoring has three components: project implementation, contract management, and monitoring compliance. All reporting documents were discussed and distributed. Each contract is individually monitored by a staff person that ensures funds are expended in accordance with the approved activity. Staff provides technical assistance and guides and follows up to ensure program performance is completed as contracted.

During the Program Year, program monitoring occurred for all CDBG and CDBG-CV subrecipients. Inperson monitoring visits restarted in March 2022 and were completed by June 2022. Additional communications and technical assistance were provided in light of the provision of CDBG-CV funds to several subrecipients. The CDBG-CV funds have different requirements and associated waivers that required additional explanation and communication with the City of Santee's CDBG subrecipients.

Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.

Historically, the City has utilized various methods for engaging and encouraging the public to participate in the planning processes for its Consolidated Plan, Analysis of Impediments, and CDBG funding allocation process. Citizen participation in the consolidated planning process was facilitated through workshops, public meetings, and electronic surveys. The City endeavored to reach a broad scope of community members and service providers. Electronic survey participation, in particular, yielded the most citizen participation of these methods.

During Program Year 2021, the City of Santee's offices have been open for walk-in business and the City Council and Commission meetings have been in-person unlike last year when visits to City Hall were more likely to be by appointment only and City Council meetings were held virtually. The Draft Program Year 2021 CAPER was made available for public review and comments both on the City's website and in the Department of Development Services lobby.

Pursuant to 24 CFR Part 91, the City solicited public review and comment on the draft Program Year 2021 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER). The public review period was from September 23, 2022 through October 8, 2022. The Program Year 2021 CAPER was available for

public review on the City's website and in the Department of Development Services lobby during this time.

No public comments were received during the 15-day public review and comment period.

Specify the nature of, and reasons for, any changes in the jurisdiction's program objectives and indications of how the jurisdiction would change its programs as a result of its experiences.

The City of Santee has made progress towards achieving the goals outlined in the City's Program Year 2021 Annual Action Plan, and 2020-24 Consolidated Plan (ConPlan). The primary obstacle the City, and indeed the whole world, continues to face during this and the prior program year has been the coronavirus pandemic and its impact on our communities. While the provision of CDBG-CV funding and redirected entitlement funds has helped communities like Santee address the impacts of COVID-19, the additional funding has increased the workload of staff managing these programs as in most cases to additional staff capacity has been added to assist with the additional workload.

During Program Year 2021, Santee's CDBG-CV funded rental assistance program assisted thirty-nine (39) low income persons with rental assistance in response to the Coronavirus Pandemic. The City's rental assistance program opened in February 2021. It is likely that our rental assistance program would have been completed much earlier but shortly after the program started, the County of San Diego's Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) started. The County's ARPA-funded ERAP program was well funded, widely marketed, well-staffed and provided greater rental assistance and utility assistance, which impacted the City's program. The County's ERAP program assisted 629 Santee households and awarded \$6.3 million of assistance prior to closing in March 2022. Clearly, the two rental assistance programs provided a great deal of assistance to those persons whose incomes were impacted by the pandemic. However, if the City had known about the ERAP program early, we may have allocated the funding to another purpose. Additionally, due to the two programs operating simultaneously, the City and County of San Diego entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in order review rental assistance applicant data of the City's applicants to ensure there was no duplication of benefits.

The priorities and accomplishments outlined in the 2020-24 ConPlan are based on assumptions about future CDBG funding. Given that these programs are subject to annual congressional appropriations, as well as potential changes in funding distribution formulas, the accomplishment projections and planned activities are subject to change with the availability of funding.

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

CDBG is a federal program that provides communities with resources to address a wide range of unique community development needs. The funds are used to develop viable communities by promoting decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities, principally for low- and moderate- income persons. Eligibility is determined by household income compared to the median household income in the region, adjusted for household size. The City of Santee submits an application for CDBG funds annually.

Five-Year Consolidated Plan

The Five-Year Consolidated Plan is a comprehensive planning document that identifies the City's overall priority needs for housing and community development and outlines a five-year strategy to address those needs. The plan also provides a framework for annual decisions on the use of CDBG funds and serves as a guide for local agencies seeking federal, state and local financial assistance under alternative funding sources.
